REPORT OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

PROVISIONAL ACCREDITATION

- 1. Gulf Area campus, SLCC, Abbeville, LA Gulf Area campus has corrected the previous infarctions; however, will remain on provisional accreditation. They will be allowed to start a new class for the Fall 2020, and board staff will continue to monitor their campus for compliance. Once compliance with board rules and regulations is shown, they will be reinstated back to full accreditation.
- 2. Shreveport campus, NLTCC, Shreveport, LA Shreveport campus had four consecutive failing classes; however, due to interruptions at all schools caused by COVID-19, the board has allowed Shreveport campus additional time to correct deficiencies. Board staff had a meeting with Shreveport campus concerning deficiencies requiring immediate attention. Once results of the May 2020 and August 2020 graduates can be calculated, board staff will revisit their accreditation status.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

COVID-19 RESPONSE

Lynn Ansardi reported that the LSBPNE is committed to the health and safety of our citizens of Louisiana. The LSBPNE office has remained fully functioning since the Governor issued a mandatory shutdown in March due to COVID-19. LSBPNE is closely following all guidelines and regulations as mandated by state and local governments.

Some changes implemented during COVID-19 were fast tracking LPNs in good standing from other states, resulting in licensing those applicants within hours of their application being received in the board office. Temporary permits were issued to all graduates at no charge; however, as of May 14th, temporary permits were rescinded due to Pearson Vue reopening many of their testing sites across the state. Should a specific need arise for temporary permits, a facility should contact the board office to discuss further.

According to our renewal statistics, we have roughly 900 LPNs who are actively licensed and looking for work. Should any retired LPN wish to come out of retirement, LSBPNE has removed barriers for them to return to work and assist during the pandemic.

LSBPNE has been in close contact with all practical nursing schools to ensure that students remain on track and graduate on time; allowing an increase in virtual learning and simulation.

Lastly, Ms. Ansardi, John Becknell, and board staff have been in constant communication with the Governor, Louisiana Department of Health, and the US Surgeon General's office providing any information requested and executing any requirements concerning rules, regulations and proclamations.

WENDI PALERMO, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF NURSING AND HEALTHCARE INITIATIVES

1. Up to 50% of clinical hours to be simulated experiences

Dr. Palermo, gave public comment concerning her request to increase simulation up to 50% of clinical hours. Dr. Palermo submitted a proposal to board staff concerning this request beyond the pandemic.

Mignonne Ater, with Louisiana Central Technical College System (LCTCS), and Christi Marceaux, Associate Provost of the health sciences and nursing at Northshore Technical Community College (NTCC), both gave public comment in support of Dr. Palermo's request.

Board members deferred this topic back to the Education department to further investigation these requests and report back to the board at the next scheduled board meeting.

2. Combination of all LCTCS schools into one college

Dr. Palermo, gave public comment concerning her request to combine all LCTCS school into one college based on regions instead of individual campuses. Dr. Palermo asked that each individual school be allowed the opportunity to fall under their respective region, instead of their campus site.

Mignonne Ater, with LCTCS, and Christi Marceaux, Associate Provost of the health sciences and nursing at NTCC, both gave public comment in support of Dr. Palermo's request.

The Education department asked to hold a follow up meeting with all schools, so that all needs can be discussed more in depth. The board agreed that this would be in the best interest for all parties to discuss this matter in a separate meeting with the Education department and board staff.

3. Transition to the utilization of the LCTCS Official College Transcript

Dr. Palermo, gave public comment concerning her request to transition to the utilization of the LCTCS official college transcript. Dr. Palermo requested that the board consider using an official college transcript issued by the registrar instead of a separate practical nursing transcript issued by the practical nursing department.

Mignonne Ater, with LCTCS, and Christi Marceaux, Associate Provost of the health sciences and nursing at NTCC, both gave public comment in support of Dr. Palermo's request.

The Education department asked that each school requesting to use a different transcript than the previous approved PN transcript, submit that new transcript to the board office for approval. Once approved by the Education department, that transcript would then be adopted permanently moving forward.
