7	the financial services report with Theresa.
8	MS. DELAFOSSE:
9	Hey everyone. This is typically one
10	of the meetings where I do I I know
11	ya'll have the bookmark PDF, so hopefully
12	ya'll are see the bookmark out to the
13	lefthand side and you can click on the
14	financial statement page. It should be page
15	around page 65. That's what it is in the
16	verison that I have, but I'm not sure if
17	there's been any late any late additions
18	to the packet.
19	So typically I do the longer report,
20	including the power point slides at the
21	midway through the year meeting, which is
22	typically in June in February, January or
23	February and then again at the August
21	meeting once we have the final numbers for
25	the fiscal year. However, I did not get a

chance to prepare that. I've been home this week, out sick. So I apologize. I'm, you know, mostly better, but I just didn't get a chance to -- to make those slides and put that together for ya'll. So I won't have as much information to present. But if you have any questions or want me to look into anything further or email out any details, please feel free to let me know and I'd be glad to do that sometime next week, most likelv.

But we do have our financial statements that Lacy prepares. And Lacy is on the line as -- as ya'll heard. She introduced herself.

This one just has -- often you see the three -- three columns on these presentations, but this one just has the two, because it's the end of the fiscal year. Again, these are cash basis statements. And what that means is the -- the dollar amounts that are included on here are everything that happened as of June 30th. In accounting we do have -- in state government accounting, we have the 13th

period, which is where we can classify things that -- that we didn't get a chance to classify by June 30th that are actually applicable to that fiscal year. So those aren't reflected in this, because we do prepare these on a cash basis.

So you'll see the bulk distribution fees were down in fiscal year '20 as compared to fiscal year '19. We collected about a million dollars less. Again, we should -- we do have some in the 13th period so that the year may end up a little closer.

We have done some analysis of the bulk fees. And I'm -- again, I'm sorry I wasn't able to share more of that with ya'll. I think Jeff has one -- one sheet that we can show you. And again, I can email out information.

Early on when the shutdowns happened and the pandemic began, I did start to gather some data on the collections, because we -- we would assume fuel sales are down, which would mean distribution fee revenues are down. That -- we didn't see a whole lot in the beginning, but we do -- I do -- I did

1	nave the monthly data that Jeff sent me,
2	that Lacy sent Jeff. And we did have some
3	low months in there. April in particular
4	were was very low collections of the
5	distribution fee. But like May so April
6	was only 400,000, where last year, it was
7	over a million. But then May and June were,
8	you know, within within the realm of
9	reasonableness. You know, people are going
10	back to work, people are going to school,
11	you know, I've I'm I at least had
12	plenty people that are going to the beach
13	and putting gas in their cars and so I think
14	things are back to a little more normal.
15	But it it's hard to tell what kind of
16	long-term effects we may see from the
17	pandemic and the economic downturn.
18	You know, I I've even looked at the
19	data that they pulled as well, as far back
20	as 2005, 2006. And really the the the
21	fees have fluctuated pretty steadily. You
22	know, like between '10 and '11, they were up
23	up over two percent, but then between
24	fiscal '11 and '12, they were down two

percent. So there's just -- there's always

a good bit of fluctuation. But since the flood, they have been -- you know, been in the 23 -- 22.5 to 23 million dollar vicinity. And 2020 was closer to 22. But it's hard to -- it's hard to say how long we may see some -- some reduced revenues and it's -- there going to have a -- a -- you know, a sustainable effect on the fund.

We -- we did some projections for the environmental trust fund, for the agency as a whole, and we did forecast that we'll lose about two percent of our revenue, but we -- we could stand to do some additional forecasting for motor fuel. So again, the -- the program continues to have the cash on hand, as needed, from year to year. So that's a good thing.

Some other points of interest on the financial statement, the interest earnings - - I have pointed this out previously. I know and ya'll know from personal experience that interest rates aren't what they were in the past couple years and that's going to be reflected in the interest earnings that the fund earns with the state treasury as well.

1 So for example, in fiscal year 2019, on the 2 cash statement, our interest earnings were 3 over two and a half million. This year, 4 we're at 1.6 million. So again, still --5 we're still earning significant revenue 6 because the size of our principal is 7 significant at 100 and some -- some odd 8 million. So that's a good thing. We're 9 still able to earn some good interest money to work on that abandoned tank list that 11 Gary and his group are working through.

> For the claims for reimbursement, they were a little lower in fiscal year '20 as compared to '19. But again, these don't reflect anything that was processed in the 13th period. We have discussed several times the -- the processing changes that Jeff and his group have made to be able to be more remote and not require more work in the office. But they have seen applications still coming in steady. And I -- you know, our experience -- it appears that site work is still going on for the most part. So I expect that the claims for reimbursement will stay in the ballpark that they've been

You'll see in the professional services charges in fiscal year '20 on the right hand side, we had 73 million that was the -- 73,000, I'm sorry, was the actuary costs. And then the 287,000 is what we spent in fiscal year '20 for the tank pulls and for the site remediation for those abandoned tank sites. So they're doing a lot of great work with those funds.

Under other financing uses, you'll see the transfer to environmental trust fund.

We have last year's number with 5.3 million. For the cash basis statement for this year, it's 6.5 million. That is a big increase.

But I do want to point out that a million dollars of that was moving some cash early for the fiscal year '20 transfer, which actually happened in cash basis fiscal year '21, which is confusing, I know. But basically, we transferred some of the environmental trust fund transfer early because of the cash availability in environmental trust fund. So where you see this is a little bit higher this year, on

1	next year's cash statement, it should be
2	lower, because we transferred money early,
3	essentially. So just kind of borrowing some
4	money from ourselves. The treasury does
5	this very often. It's call inter-fund
6	borrowing. So it's something we've had to
7	do in the past. We haven't had to do it in
8	quite some time, but it was necessary this
9	fiscal year.

So then we have the end-flows and out-flows. We do still have a net positive inflow. But it is lower than last year. With our cash balance -- but our cash balance is six million dollars higher for the fund. It went from 106 million last year to 112 million this year.

So then the -- the box at the bottom, again, shows the cash balance at the year end on June 30th. And then net-out the site liability gives us a negative equity balance of right under 35 million.

The second page, I discussed previously for a bit is the transfer that we do each year from the motor fuel underground storage tank trust fund to the environmental

trust fund to pay for the remainder of the
administrative cost of administering the
program. So you'll see the note at the
bottom where one million dollars was
transferred in 2020. So the -- the transfer
next year will be reduced.

I normally have in the -- in the presentation a -- an outline of the attorney general expenses. Those did end up pretty high this year. We have -- I'm not -- I --I struggle with what -- what I can and can't say when we're not in executive session with regards to those cases. So, Perry, stop me if I say too much. But we have one case remaining. And we did have a lot of discovery and a lot of documents to review. So those -- that did result in some fairly high bills from the contract attorneys to work their way through those documents. So when I do get a chance to put that information together, ya'll let me know if you want to see it at the meeting in a presentation format or I can send out an email in the interim that will outline what our total attorney general expenditures were

1	for the year. But they were you know, we
2	had we had a few years where they were
3	lower. You know, in the beginning of the
4	cases, they were high, over a million. Then
5	we had a few years where they were low, even
6	under half a million. But this year, they
7	were high again, because they're trying to
8	do a to move forward with that last case
9	so we can get these put behind us. So I
10	wanted to mention that. If ya'll are
11	interested in additional information about
12	that, let me know.
13	And I'll do again, I'll I'll do
14	a better analysis of these these
15	expenditures and and fluctuations so I
16	can explain them to ya'll better in our next
L7	meeting. I apologize, again, for not being

Yes. Page 67, first page of the report. As of August 13th, we have 21 open motor fuel delivery fee audit cases not in legal. You can see on there, one case is awaiting corrective action. Really, that's just a business who needs to -- we sent a demand requiring the business to send in several delinquent monthly motor fuel delivery fee reports and one amended report. All gallons to be reported are exempt from this fee; therefore, there's no monetary assessment. Once the reports are received, we'll go ahead and close that file out.

Twelve cases are awaiting review. We have two potential assessments, totaling \$1,411.76. One -- one potential credit, pending review, of \$201.49. And nine potential clean audits, with no assessment. Seven cases are still in progress, with results to be determined and finalized. And we have one case that's currently in the planning phase.

Since the last meeting, three cases that we originally had planned for the end

1	of 2020 were postponed due to Covid-19
2	issues. We've moved those to fiscal year
3	'21. Two of them were performed in July.
4	And they're you know, the work is in
5	progress. And we have one in the planning
6	phase still, like I mentioned, to be
7	scheduled.
8	And we've removed one case, which had
9	resulted in a small credit. That's been
10	used and it's now closed and removed from
11	the list.

17	At the top of the page, under the
1.8	active trust fund eligible site section,
19	this provides a breakdown of the sites in
20	the investigation and corrective action
21	phases. Note the site counts, the average
22	ages and the total current reimbursement of
23	the sites within these two categories. So

you'll look up and you'll see, you got 133

sites in corrective action. The average age

24

of those sites is 13 years and we've spent
just over 99 million dollars on those sites
as of yet.

The next section is the cumulative site closures. We've -- at the time of the report, we had 1,434 that we closed, representing just over -- well, almost 20 -- 297 million dollars that were spent on those sites.

Under the -- the next section is the corrective budget -- the CAP budget summary section. It gives -- tells -- shows you the CAP -- CAP budgets approved. There was 91 million -- just over 91 million dollars with reimbursements of just over 72 million dollars. And that leaves us with almost 19 million dollars in remaining CAP budgets.

Under the next section, you'll see the sites that have not requested reimbursement but have been determined trust fund eligible in the last three years. That's a total of 26 sites.

Next section shows the applications pending at the end of fiscal year '20. We had 28 applications pending, for a total of

\$664,000. This was actually down from previous years. We actually had a fairly slow June. I -- I think due to the Covid virus, a lot of the RACs were kind of having some issues getting -- getting their affidavits signed and we -- and there were a couple of the RACs that were just kind of slow in getting some of the January through March applications in. We -- we -- that's okay because they hit us in July and August, so -- so the July and August numbers are --are quite high, but June was a little bit low.

If you go to the next section, if you draw your attention to the fiscal year summary section at the bottom of the report, the fourth quarter of fiscal year '20, the trust fund received 194 applications, totaling just over 3.1 million dollars. And we returned 22 applications for various reasons. And we had \$138,000 was disallowed as ineligible for reimbursement. A total of 210 applications were processed, recommending 2.7 million dollars in reimbursements. And this is kind of in the

Current cost is just under 19 million. Average age is 13.3. And — and the sites in investigation phase is 39 with almost four million dollars in expenditures

7	to move these into our EDMS system in a more
8	expeditious manner. We've made major
9	modifications to our protocols and our tools
10	to allow the trust fund staff to document
11	our adjustments and comments electronically
12	for rounding and documentation purposes.

We're also continuing to make improvements to the reimbursement process. That -- that includes the development of the new trust fund reimbursement application, which we hope to provide to the RACs in the next couple of months. We've written it and the reviewers are currently testing that application. We hope in the next couple of weeks to get it out to the RACs to let them test it and then we'll move it out to all the RACs.

The new processes have been working well and we're looking at any potential

- regulation modifications that would allow us
 to continue these improvements as we move
 forward.
