8	MS. DELAFOSSE:
9	Hey everyone. I'm going to be fairly
10	brief today. I I can't believe this is
11	our third Zoom meeting. It's been a long
12	and wild year. And I have Fran here with me
13	as well, if anyone has any questions for
14	either of us.
15	This is a typical presentation that we
16	provide ya'll. The first column is the
17	fiscal year 2020 final cash basis financial
18	statement. And then the center column, we
19	have a comparison to last year at this point
20	in time, which is at the end of the first
21	quarter. And then the right-hand column, we
22	have current information, which is the end
23	of the first quarter for fiscal year 2021.
24	My staff prepares this information every

quarter.

1	The you can see that the bulk
2	distribution fee receipts are down a little
3	bit. Jeff did pull some numbers for me and
4	I've had my receivables account manager look
5	at them as well. We may have a slight
6	downward trend this year with all the, you
7	know, business being slower, maybe people
8	not buying as much gas, not going out of
9	town, et cetera. But I don't think it's
10	going to be shockingly low or cause any
11	issues or be alarming in that regard. But I
12	do expect we may be on the lower side, you
13	know, not 23 plus like we have previously.
14	I'd like to point out to the interest
15	earnings. I don't have the exact
16	information because it's been a little bit
L7	since they informed us of this, but the
18	State Treasurers Office did realize that
_9	they were calculating the interest
20	incorrectly. So that change coupled with
21	the reduction in interest rates that we have
22	all seen means a significant downturn in the
23	interest collections that we have that are

available to the abandon tank program. So

last year at this time, we had collected

24

2 not even 18,000. So it's less than, you 3 know, five percent. It's It's barely 4 it's not much. So, you know, we're going to 5 we're going to be pretty tapped out. You 6 know, we have a good amount set aside for 7 that abandoned tank work, so that's a 8 positive thing. About 13, 14 million. So 9 they should be able to cleanup quite a few 10 sites with that and do quite a few tank 11 pulls for those abandoned abandoned 12 sites. But it's not going to at this 13 point in time, it's not going to continue to 14 generate large sums of cash each year. Like
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point in time, it's not going to continue to generate large sums of cash each year. Like
generate large sums of cash each year. Like
15 you see in 2020, the final collections were
1.6 million, we won't come close to touching
17 that this year. So that that source of
18 revenue is not going to continue to grow at
19 the rate it has.
Our claim to reimbursement this year,
21 you see in the second set of numbers, is up
from this time last year. It's 3.4 million.
This time last year, it was just over 3.1
24 million. Jeff Jeff keeps me pretty well
25 informed on their applications and

information that they receive in the mail and -- and RAC reimbursements that they're paying. And everything is coming in pretty -- pretty much business as usual. So that's good. The trust fund, you know, is up and running and hasn't really seen -- hasn't really seen many changes as a result of Covid. So that's a positive thing. We're continuing to make progress on the sites in our universe.

Environmental Trust Fund this year. Again, this is a cash basis statement, so that transfer amount of 5.29 million that you see, that amount was -- represents the calculation from last year, and then we did that transfer at the beginning of this fiscal year, so it shows up on this fiscal year's financial information.

So we have a net out -- net negative outflow at this point in time of just under three million dollars, as you can see. And that just takes the receipts minus the expenditures to tell us what our -- what the status is at this point in time.

1	Hold on one second. So you see our
2	cash basis fund balance well, one second.
3	I'm sorry. Cash basis fund balance at the
4	beginning of the year was 114 million.
5	Right now, it's 111 million. And when we
6	net out the current site the most recent
7	site liability calculation we have by the
8	actuary, we have a negative equity balance
9	of approximately 38 million.

So if we go to the next -- the next page. Okay. So here is the calculation and projection of what the transfer will be from the Motor Fuel Trust Fund to the Environmental Trust Fund for fiscal year 2022. It will be the transfer for '21, but we will transfer it in '22. The timing of it all gets so confusing. So you see, our transfer was six point -- or, we project 6.3 and then we project 5.9 next year. So it has been fairly steady. We've discussed pretty thoroughly the changes in the federal revenues and the department expenditures and -- and how those fluctuate from any one year to the next. So we're -- we're pretty much on track. Things are trending -- trending

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4	like they typically do.
2	So I don't know if ya'll have any
3	questions at this point in time, but that's
4	all the information that I have to present.
5	Oh, I see Natalie typed a question
6	here, touching on interest again. I can get
7	some more information from the treasury.
8	They told us oh, Gosh, I couldn't I
9	couldn't tell you when they told us. I
10	think Karyn brought back the information
11	from an Undersecretary's meeting that they
12	would be recalculating the interest.
13	Basically, the state treasurer discovered
14	that the way they were calculating it
15	previously had not been correct. I think it
16	was either compounded incorrectly or
17	something. They're not going to go back and
18	retroactively recalculate any interest
19	earnings that were credited to the agencies
20	or to the funds, but they are going to
21	they did make adjustments to the calculation
22	going forward.
23	So if that's of interest to anyone, I
24	can certainly get more detail from the state
25	treasurers office on what that change was.

1	We've seen this change affect our interest
2	earnings in all our funds. But none none
3	harder hit than the motor fuel trust fund
4	just because of it's cash balance, large
5	cash balance. So it's it's unfortunate
6	because that was a really a really great
7	source of revenue for the abandoned tank
8	fund. And I I couldn't tell you how to -
9	- how much to attribute to the change in the
10	calculation or how much to attribute to the
11	downtime in rate. Obviously, we had much
12	better interest rates even a year ago, but
13	definitely two years ago. You know, just on
14	a personal note, I have a savings account
15	that was over well over two percent and
16	now it's not even half a percent of interest
17	earnings. So it's it's definitely a
18	combination of those things that have
19	impacted that, but we you know, I don't -
20	- I don't expect it will crack 100,000 this
21	year, based on the first three months. So
22	I'll get some more information on that and I
23	can send that have Jeff sent that out via
24	email to everyone.

2	Yes. Good afternoon, everybody. So
3	the first page of this report lists 21 open
4	motor fuel delivery fee audit cases not in
5	legal at this time, as of November 24th,
6	2020.
7	We have one case which is still
8	awaiting corrective action. There's several
9	delinquent reports and one amended report
10	that needs to be sent in. All the gallons
11	are exempt. There's no monetary assessment.
12	There was just some confusion on their part
13	on need to report it, even though they were
14	all exempt. So we've spoken to them again
15	and we expect to get those soon.
16	One case is currently under review.
17	We have a pending assessment of
18	approximately \$1,000. We should be getting
19	that out soon.
20	Eleven cases are awaiting review.
21	Pending the final review, they represent two
22	potential assessments, totaling
23	approximately \$1,200. We've received
24	approximately \$907 of that \$978 of that

already. So we have approximately \$290

1	remaining outstanding on that.
2	We have one potential credit of
3	approximately \$200. And eight potential
4	clean audits with no assessment.
5	We have seven cases seven cases
6	that are still in progress. We we still
7	need to determine the results and finalize
8	those.
9	Preliminary activity is currently in
10	progress for one new case that's been added
11	to this list. That's 321004. And we've
12	also, since the last meeting, removed one
13	case, which was clean with no assessment.
14	It's been removed from this list.
15	Are there any questions on this page?
16	(No response.)
17	MR. MORIN:
18	If not, we can go to page 51, the next
19	page. So you'll notice there are now just
20	three cases listed here instead of four.
21	The status remains the same for these three
22	legal cases. All three remain with the
23	Office of Debt Recovery for collection. And
24	as of November 18th, we've received no
25	payments from ODR.

1	The fourth case has been paid in full
2	and removed from the list. The defendant
3	remitted the final payment on November 9th
4	of \$755.43. Legal is currently in the
5	process of filing a motion to dismiss the
6	judgment against him with the court. And
7	the paperwork was mailed on November 18th.
8	With legal's assistance, we've collect we
9	collected a total a \$15,165.43 for this
10	case.
11	As of today, these three remaining
12	legal cases represent a total outstanding
13	amount of \$99,549.77 in delinquent motor
14	fuel delivery fees and late payment
15	penalties, plus the kind of fees you see
16	noted below there.
17	And that is all I have today. Any
18	questions?
19	MR. HOPPES:
20	Real quick, Cy. Some of these cases
21	on the previous page are back from like
22	2015, 2016, awaiting review. Just curious
23	how long it you know, what's that
24	process?
25	MR. MORIN:

1	Yes. Yes. I I've actually had to
2	put something in place this for this
3	fiscal year to get that cleaned up before
4	the end of the fiscal year. Progress has
5	been slow so far, but we we'll make sure
6	to clean that up by the end of the fiscal
7	year.
8	But like I said, most of those are
9	clean audits that are going to have no
10	assessments. So it's a matter of just, you
11	know, wrapping up final details and and
12	getting them closed up.

1	The first worksheet in this section,
2	page one of eleven, provides the board with
3	a summary of the pertinent information
4	related to the fund as of the end of the
5	first quarter of fiscal year 2021.
6	At the top of the page, under the
7	active trust fund eligible section, this
8	provides a breakdown of the sites in the
9	investigation and the corrective action
10 -	phases. Note, the sites counts, the average
11	ages and the total current reimbursement
12	costs to the sites within these two
13	categories. You'll see we have 137 sites in
14	corrective action right now. Their average
15	age is 12.7, and we've spent about \$102,000
16	102 million dollars at this point.
17	Next note, total number of site
18	closures as of the report date with total
19	reimbursements. We've cleaned up 1,438
20	sites, spending approximately 297 million
21	dollars.
22	Under the CAP budget summary section,
23	note the sites currently in the corrective
24	action phase have approved CAP budgets
25	totaling approximately 94 million with

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1	reimbursements of approximately 74.6
2	million, leaving 19.5 million unapproved
3	budgets remaining.

In the next -- under the next section, sites that have not requested reimbursement, have been determined over -- eligible over the last three years total 23. So these are sites that have been determined eligible.

We -- we've given them eligibility determination letters, but they haven't submitted a trust fund application yet.

In the next section, at the end of September 2020, the trust fund had 72 pending applications to process, which had requested amounts of 1.1 million dollars.

Now, if you'll draw your attention to the bottom of the -- of this sheet, the fiscal summary section, for the first quarter of fiscal year 2021, the trust fund has received 212 applications, totaling approximately 4.3 million dollars. We returned 17 applications for various reasons. And 61,000 was disallowed for ineligible -- or -- and determined ineligible for reimbursement. A total of

1 151 applications were processed, 2 recommending 3.4 million dollars in 3 reimbursements. 4 Does anybody have any questions on 5 this page? 6 (No response.) 7 MR. BAKER: 8 Okay. Durwood, if you'd go to the 9 next page. Okay. This very busy page is 10 the active trust fund sites with corrective 11 action plans. This report breaks down the 12 active sites in the corrective action phase. This provides site specific information 13 14 related to application counts, time period 15 of trust fund reimbursements, site location 16 and various reimbursement data. The column 17 totals at the top of the first page reflect the values of the summary reports. 18 Now, the numbers are -- are good for 19 20 this time, but the last report, I realized 21 that our last app process dates had an error 22 in the -- in the reporting. And it -- the 23 oldest it would give you is 12/'19 -- or, 24 2019. We fixed that now, so it's -- it's

got the right numbers. But that last --

1 last quarter's report will be kind of skewed
2 for the last app process date.

Now, if you'll skip down to page 57.

Durwood, that's the CAP site summary sheet.

Thank you. Okay. This table gives the members an overview of the CAP sites with reimbursements by costing category and CAP budget totals. Note that the current -- that the total current reimbursements are 102.5 million dollars, which includes values listed above that value as well as the total CAP reimbursements.

The estimated cost to -- cost to closure for the sites in corrective action versus overall average cost to close per site is shown at the bottom of the page.

And you'll notice there's a pretty big discrepancy there. The difference there, as we noted before is that, you know, not all sites make it into corrective action phase.

A lot of them are -- are re-capped out or cleaned up with -- with under I-CAP and so these -- when you look at -- look at those, their average is much lower. So when you put it all together, it -- it comes up with

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1 a lot more value than the sites that make it 2 in the full corrective action. 3 Anybody have any questions on -- on 4 these sites -- these two pages? 5 (No response.) 6 MR. BAKER: 7 Durwood, if you could move on to page 58 or the -- the non-site -- non-CAP sites. 8 9 Okay. This report again lists the breakdown 10 of the individual sites under investigation and provides site specific information 11 12 related to application counts, time period 13 of the trust fund reimbursements, the site 14 location and various other reimbursement 15 data. The column totals at the top of the 16 first page reflect the values on the summary 17 report. 18 Durwood, if you could go to page 62, 19 or the -- the non-CAP summary. Thank you. 20 Okay. This is a summary of the data from 21 previous pages, which gives you an overview 22 of the sites under -- under -- currently 23 under investigation and includes the various 24 costing categories. As you can see, we spent -- on these

          group has actually NFA'd -- I think I

          looked at the numbers -- close to 40 in that
23
          quarter, but only three of them were -- were
24
          trust fund sites. So you'll see we did
          cleanup three -- three trust fund sites and
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they were given no further action for this
quarter -- this quarter.

You may note that some of these are still -- that some of these sites are still on our active list. We often continue to receive reimbursement applications for sites after they've been NFA'd for a couple of quarters, just because of cleanup and various costs that occur after that.

Some points of interest. As -- as Theresa said, you know, due to the impact of Covid, the trust fund has had to make numerous modifications to it's processes. We continue to -- to make improvements to these -- these processes. We want to make sure we're doing things in an accurate and timely basis. And we're continuing to make improvements to our reimbursement process, including the development of a new trust fund reimbursement application, which we have in testing right now and we hope to provide to the RACs in the next couple of months. These new processes have been working well. And we're looking forward to some potential regulation modifications that would allow us to continue some of these improvements as we move forward.

Another point of interest is, we wanted to let the board know that the legislative auditors have been doing their — their — their annual review of the — of the trust fund in the last couple of months. This also includes a review of the actuary report and it's calculations. The auditors have asked that if you haven't submitted your related party letters back to them or to the board, please do so ASAP. They — they can't finish this until they get your related party letters back.

They expect to have their report completed in the next month or so. I -- nothing definite, but neither Theresa or I have heard anything as of yet as to any kind of findings or -- so we don't suspect there to be anything substantial in the report related to the -- anything negative at least.

That pretty much finishes up my report. Does anybody have any questions? (No response.)

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reimbursements of approximately 74.6million, leaving 19.5 million unapproved
