First of all, it's got a position being 6 7 held at Tommasi Brothers, Inc. from '97 to '17, and that don't give me any indication 8 9 that that was the facility that was 10 applying for the -- for it. And then you 11 go back to the signature page and we've 12 got Vikki Tommasi signing as the applicant 13 and as a supervisor, and Peggy is nowhere 14 in sight. 15 MR. BONVILLAIN: 16 Right. Yeah. 17	good with that experience meeting the
18	qualification, I'm good with it.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Clinton Williams. I'm not sure what
21	the facility is.
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	North Landfill.
24	MS. HENRY:
25	North Landfill.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Okay. North Landfill, Level B
3	landfill, Level B.
4	Okay. We've got two new ones that
5	Ms. Bordelon handed out this morning:
6	William Sexton, Pickett Industries
7	International Paper in Mansfield. What
8	are they applying for? It's not checked
9	off.
10	MS. BORDELON:
11	Landfill, Level A.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Okay. Applying for a Landfill, Level
14	A. Is everybody okay with that?
15	Next, Clinton Farmer, American
16	Advanced Technology, Houma Oil Recovery
17	Facility, Incinerator/Waste Handling,
18	Level A.
19	MS. BORDELON:
20	Mr. Farmer was previously certified
21	before. His certification expired in, I
22	believe, it was last year.

16	MS. BORDELON:
17	Oh, I'm sorry.
18	MR. BONVILLAIN:
19	Yeah, we're just approving
20	applications right now.
21	MS. BORDELON:
22	Okay.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	You said we approved him previously,
25	right?

1	MS. BORDELON:
2	Yeah.
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Yeah. Okay.
5	MS. BORDELON:
6	Henry James, Landfill, level B;
7	Clinton Johnson, Separation, Level A;

9	applying for a Level B Landfill, but he
10	actually works at a C & D facility. So,
11	the question is
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	He also took the landfill test,
14	right?
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	And he also took the landfill test,
17	because that's what he had checked off.
18	But he's actually working at a C & D
19	facility, so we're assuming that what he
20	really wants is a C & D certificate, but
21	we're not positive.
22	So, how do y'all wish to proceed on
23	this?
24	MR. BARBER:
25	Well, just based on my experience in

1	a landfill, if he knows how to run a
2	and can pass a test to operate a
3	landfill solid waste landfill, he
4	certainly should meet the qualifications
5	to run a C & D site.
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	Okay. The qualifications, I don't
8	think, is an issue, the test is. He took
9	the landfill test; he did not take the C $\&$
LO	D test. And because of the difference in
11	regulations, it does make a difference.
L2	MR. HYLTON:
L3	There's lots of limitations on a C &
L <b>4</b>	D that
L5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
L6	Yeah.
17	MR. BARBER:
L8	Yeah.
L9	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	And also, don't you need a specific C
21	& D operator's license to work at a C & D
22	facility and a landfill license doesn't
23	qualify
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:

Correct. A landfill license is not

good at a C & D facility. 1 2 MR. BARBER: 3 So, basically, he just needs to retest? 4 5 MR. BONVILLAIN: If --6 7 MS. BORDELON: 8 He needs to retest. Can I add, also? 9 He -- when they submitted the application, 10 they had submitted a letter requesting a 11 conditional. I didn't include it in your 12 packet, because I felt like his 13 qualifications were sufficient for a 14 regular certification. I just didn't 15 catch that he was applying for a landfill 16 and not a C & D. 17 MR. LAGRANGE: 18 Well, I think one option would be to 19 grant him a conditional C & D type three 20 and request, I guess, more clarification from him. 21 22 MR. BONVILLAIN: 23 Right. Request clarification as to 24 exactly which one he's asking for.

The people's names that were nominated, they could get a letter with the application and said,

You know, and it would be another way to maybe generate some interest. Is that what you were thinking, Troy? I'm not sure --

Yes. Similar to that. But, you know, I'm blaming the supervisors at these facilities, because these Level -- B's, especially, they're depending on their supervisors to nominate them.

#### MS. HENRY:

Uh-huh (yes).

## MR. BARBER:

And we've got some sorry supervisors just not getting the job done. You know, I've nominated two of mine, and, actually, we've had two As and two Bs. I feel a little awkward nominating them again, and I just, you know, I think we need to take a different course here. And I don't think we need to do away with it. I think that's important. I think people need

that recognition, but they're not getting the opportunity to get the recognition because somebody else is dropping the ball. the guy said, I want one of those awards so badly. And I said, Well, I'm sure your day is coming. He said, My supervisor just won't nominate me. And I said, He doesn't have to. And he said, What? And I said, Your supervisor does not have to nominate you.

I don't think that they truly understand that your peers can do it. And so I think that, you know, we're going to have to reemphasize, you know, it doesn't have -- the only award that has to come from somewhere is the Bentley Mackey.

## MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right.

#### MS. HENRY:

But all the others can come from your fellow workers. We -- I mean, we're -- I don't want to see them die down, because I remember when I got it how special I felt. And when you watch them up there, and you're taking those pictures, you just -- I don't know, you get overwhelmed with emotion, because it's a big deal to them. And I don't want to lose that. So, if we

1	have to beat the bushes ourselves to get
2	the nominees out there, I think we should
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:

·Okay. So, I think then, we can get with the LSWA officials and ask them at the seminars to explore different methods.

MS. HENRY:

And we have a small crowd out there waiting for the drawings, and we could talk to them then, because they're going to be -- just to put the word out there.

And let them know. But, you know, I mean, unfortunately -- and our facility is just as guilty -- many of our employees don't have emails, so the only way they know about it is if we tell them. And I'll be honest with you, there's -- that's probably one of the things that I don't think about.
