MOLLERE: 11 Here. 12 MS. BORDELON: 13 Denny Mize? 14 MR. MIZE: 15 Present. 16 MS. BORDELON: 17 Terrence Stewart? 18 MR. STEWART: 19 Present. 20 MS. BORDELON: 21 Krystal Perkins? 22 MS. PERKINS: 23 Present. 24 MS. BORDELON: 25 Troy Barber?

19	Okay. We're reviewing the minutes of
20	the March 22nd meeting. Anybody have any
21	comments, changes? If we have none
22	MR. MOLLERE:
23	Move to accept.
24	MR. LAGRANGE:
25	We have a motion to accept the

1 minutes. 2 MR. MIZE: 3 Second. 4 MR. LAGRANGE: 5 Second by Mr. Mize, motion by 6 MR. Mollere. Any other discussion? Any 7 objection? 8 Motion carries. 9 Okay. We'll move on to consideration 10 of operator certifications. First on the 11 list is review of applications for 12 certification. And I will call the names 13 and the level of certification being 14 applied for. And if anyone has any 15 questions or comments, just speak up as we 16 go through the names. 17 First is Tora Fontenot, Jevcon for a 18 construction demolition Level B. 19 MR. BARBER: 20 I don't see that this experience 21 set -- any of these from Jevcon has --22 meets the requires for a --23 MR. LAGRANGE: 24 A regular? 25 MR. BARBER:

-- a regular license, yeah. 1 I mean, 2 that -- they're apparently doing some dirt 3 work at the letter that they sent indicates that they've been working on 4 5 construction on landfill, which does not 6 meet the requirements of operating a 7 landfill. 8 MS. BORDELON: 9 Mr. Natali with Jevcon is present, if 10 anybody has any questions for him about 11 what the status of his facility is at this 12 time. 13 MR. LAGRANGE: 14 Is your facility permitted -- do you 15 currently have a permit --16 MR. NATALI: 17 Yes, sir I'm waiting on --18 MR. LAGRANGE: 19 -- operating permit? 20 MR. NATALI: 21 I'm waiting on the -- them to give me 22 the commencement to start. 23 MR. LAGRANGE: 24 Okay. And we may want to consider 25 conditional certifications. Did -- was

that discussed with you? Or did you --1 2 MR. NATALI: 3 They did. I just had chose to come and take the test --4 5 MR. LAGRANGE: 6 Right. 7 MR. NATALI: 8 -- with the people that would work 9 there. 10 MR. LAGRANGE: 11 That's great. 12 MR. NATALI: 13 And that way we would have the test 14 taken and hope that y'all would give me a 15 conditional one to get up and running and 16 get the experience. 17 MR. LAGRANGE: 18 Okay. And we'll go ahead and take 19 these -- the Jevcon -- let's go ahead and 20 take the Jevcon applications, and look at 21 all three of them. I think we have three; 22 is that correct? 23 MR. BARBER: 24 Uh-huh (yes). 25 MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

MR. LAGRANGE:

We have Mr. Natali, and we also have Mr. Harry Gaspard.

MS. BORDELON:

And Tora Fontenot.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And Mr. Gaspard -- Tora Fontenot and Harry Gaspard are both for level -- construction and demolition, Level B. Mr. Natali is a level -- construction demolition Level A request. Have y'all -- anyone else reviewed those applications had any comments or questions about the experience requirements?

MR. MOLLERE:

I thought it was a general question

Troy brought up about exactly what they

were doing, but we have an explanation

from the operator. I would move that it

would be appropriate that we give them

conditional, and by the time we meet again

and everything ought to be fine.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. The experience requirements,

again, for the Level A is three years experience. Level B is two years experience. Conditionals are issued for six months at a time, so every six months you'd be -- you know, you'd need to get with Ms. Bordelon to apply for extension, a renewal of it for another six months until such time you met your experience requirements for the various levels that you have. In addition to requirements relative to continuing education and testing is?

MS. BORDELON:

Is within the six months of the issuance of that conditional that you take and pass the test and attend a ten hour workshop, which he's doing today.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. So you have met that criteria.

MR. MOLLERE:

They should be ready in October with the experiences.

MR. BARBER:

Well, they won't have met their three years.

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MS. BORDELON:

Well, they won't have met --

MR. BARBER:

In order to get an A Level, you need three years of experience. And I'm going to go ahead and say this, might as well open a can of worms while I'm at it, I have a problem with any facility operating with conditionals only. I think they need at least one man that has some real landfill experience to guide them. And I don't think anybody here can take the regulations and disagree with that.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Other than the regulations don't require that. The regulations do --

MR. BARBER:

The regulations require --

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- not require that. They allow for issuance of conditional certifications.

They do not require that a facility has experience. It's up to us to determine if the person we're issuing a conditional to has enough over-all experience.

1 MR. BARBER: 2 Well, I don't --3 MR. LAGRANGE: 4 -- or guidance to operate it in a 5 conditional way until such time they meet 6 the experience requirements. 7 MR. BARBER: 8 But --9 MR. LAGRANGE: 10 -- and obtain a regular 11 certification. 12 MR. BARBER: 13 But now, Bo, we as a Board, it's our 14 responsibility to make sure that these 15 facilities are being operated by people 16 that have the experience to operate them 17 in the right manner. And you know, 18 yourself, when -- if you didn't have -- if 19 you had zero experience and they threw you 20 out there to operate a landfill, you 21 wouldn't have known how to do that. 22 MR. LAGRANGE: 23 That's correct. And --24 MR. BARBER: 25 So, who's giving them their guidance?

MR. LAGRANGE:

And again -- that -- well, the guidance is they are taking the exams, so, number one, they are going through and reviewing the rules and regulations in preparation of taking the exam. That's the first part. The second part is, they're required to attend the workshop, so hopefully, they're picking up some other information. The third part that I see is the fact that, you know, DEQ is the regulatory oversight of their operations --

MR. BARBER:

Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- so when they come on site, if they are not operating in accordance with their permit then they are going to be -- have to answer to DEQ and DEQ will give them whatever corrective action they need to take to come in compliance with their -- you know, make their facility in compliance with their permit and with the rules and regs.

MR. BARBER:

Well --

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, it's kind of a Catch-22, and, as I said, our rules do not require that a facility have it. And where we get caught in the middle --

MR. BARBER:

Well, actually it does require that facility have a Level A with three years of experience, Bo. We have that Level -- we have that conditional that, I think, has been abused for many, many years, to help these new facilities to get in compliance.

MR. LAGRANGE:

That's right.

MR. BARBER:

And that's not the purpose of this Board. This -- the purpose of this Board is to make sure that they have experienced operators on-site operating these facilities.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. And you said it yourself when

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you have a new facility coming online, especially -- and I would -- the majority of them are C & D, wood waste, separation type facilities --

MR. BARBER:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. LAGRANGE:

Where you have companies that are in some type of construction business or demolition business or whatever and all of a sudden they decide, hey, I've got an empty hole where I had a dirt pit, I'm going to go ahead and start putting debris in it and fill it up, and I can charge and I can bring my own stuff that I generate from my other work. So then they realize they've got to get a permit from DEQ. that starts the process. You know, do we take the position as a Board to put that burden in -- amongst ourselves and say, although the regs don't -- the regs allow that you can -- that a conditional certified operator can operate these facilities, and we take the position, well, even though it allows for that, are

we're going to say, no, we require -- we are not going to grant anything but at least make sure they have one regular certified operator at a facility? That's a position the Board has to take.

MR. BARBER:

And that's what I'm saying, let's have at least one that has the experience to operate that facility. I don't have a problem with giving some conditionals for some of the B Levels, and actually these guys would probably qualify after one year of -- these B Levels will qualify after one year one year because on a B you can have one year of solid waste experience and two years --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Construction.

MR. BARBER:

-- in the construction field --

MR. LAGRANGE:

That's correct.

MR. BARBER:

-- operating equipment, drainage, and so on. So, I'm just concerned about that

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guy that's the lead guy who apparently is the guy that's sitting here with us today. And I mean no harm to you or your company when I'm saying this, I just feel that we have a responsibility to make sure that there is someone on site day to day holding everybody's hand and guiding them in the right direction.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And just to clarify, so everyone is, again, up to speed on what our regs say relative to conditional certification, it says that a conditional certificate shall allow an operator to operate only the facility at which he is employed at the time of certification. The requirements are as follows: the applicant must request a conditional certification. The Board must determine that the applicant is qualified to perform duties at a particular facility. That's a key statement, that it's also incumbent on us to review their applications and see if they are qualified for that specific facility. Now, in this case, you know,

they only -- for that facility they're familiar with what they have to do to operate that facility. They went through the permit process with DEQ so they know what permitting issues and what the rules and regs say relative to that. It also says they must pass the operator examination and attend one Board-approved training class --

MR. BARBER:

Within six months.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- within six months. Yeah. So, you know, again, as I said, you know, we -- what we've been doing in the past, I think the Board has taken the position that when they reviewed the application for the conditionals that they felt those people's qualifications were -- had enough experience to be a conditional operator at that specific facility, the one in which they are employed at and which they are most familiar with, you know, the operations of. But that's something that the Board will have to decide if they want

to develop a policy different than what 1 2 we've been using in the past, you know. 3 So, it's going to, you know, require, I think, some more research and some more 4 5 discussion amongst everyone to get a feel 6 for that. 7 MR. FOURRIER: Did they all -- all three of the pass 8 9 the test? 10 MS. BORDELON: 11 Yes, they did. 12 MR. FOURRIER: 13 And who built this facility? Did 14 y'all build it yourselves? 15 MR. NATALI: 16 Yes, sir. 17 MR. FOURRIER: 18 And what are you regularly? You run 19 a construction company? 20 MR. NATALI: 21 I do. I've been hauling the same 22 time waste to all the facilities around 23 us, so I'm familiar -- I've been in 24 construction for a long time -- so I'm 25 familiar with what they take, what they

don't take, what they're allowed. And then starting when we did the permit, I've been on-going a permit for about ten years with DEQ. Then, after that point when I consulted with DEQ they told me -- they educated me a lot on what to take and then I went to their small business part to learn more, because I was real concerned about coming take the test. And even though it says I have six months, it was my goal to get everybody enough knowledge here with the test to where I thought we could better run the facility, you know?

MR. FOURRIER:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. NATALI:

But all of them have a lot of experience in the field as far as what we're allowed to send to those facilities and what were not. And then we do -- I do, also, a lot of civil work and as far as, you know, drainage, and most of those guys are in equipment a lot.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Mr. Chairman?

1 MR. LAGRANGE: 2 Yes. 3 MR. WILLIAMS: 4 Excuse me, in a nutshell can you 5 bring me up to speed on what we're -- are 6 we about to take a vote on something or 7 are we discussing? 8 MR. LAGRANGE: 9 Well, we started reviewing the 10 applications for regular certification --11 MR. WILLIAMS: 12 Uh-huh (yes). 13 MR. LAGRANGE: 14 -- and first one that came up was 15 Ms. Tora Fontenot --16 MR. WILLIAMS: 17 Right. 18 MR. LAGRANGE: 19 -- which is with the Jevcon facility. 20 And that's when a discussion ensued that, 21 for regular certification it was 22 determined that we didn't feel that there 23 was a sufficient solid waste experience 24 for regular certification under the 25 application. However, because it's a new

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facility Jevcon informed us that they are waiting for the order to commence operations from DEQ.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. LAGRANGE:

That the three applicants, there's three applicants here for review, that potentially we would consider conditional certifications for them in anticipation of them getting their orders to commence their permit to operate their facility. And a discussion ensued on the fact that whether or not we have always issued, kind of, carte blanche conditionals for new facilities and not really looking at the qualifications of the people we're doing, to make sure they are qualified to operate a solid waste facility and that, possibly, the Board may want to take the position that we want at least one regular certified operator in these types of facilities. And that's -- brings you up in a nutshell where the discussion has been.

MR. WILLIAMS:

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But the rules don't say that.

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MR. LAGRANGE:

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Well, the rules say that a facility shall have a certified operator.

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MR. WILLIAMS:

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Uh-huh (yes).

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MR. LAGRANGE:

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issues. The other part was that if

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they're, you know, working on a permit, at some point they're being exposed to the rules and regulations and the testing, in addition, if they haven't they're required to take the test and attend the workshop within six months of getting a conditional. And so that exposes them again to the rules and regulations and operations at that type of stuff. So, in a nutshell, that's where it's at. Again, as I said, I think it's going to be up to the Board if we feel that we want to take the position or policy that, regardless, we will issue conditionals but that we will make sure that there is one regular certified operator at a facility. And, as I said, I think that's going to take some research and some discussion amongst yourselves and reviewing the regs and getting some -- making sure some interpretation in the regs that we can take that position if the Board chooses to do so. Makes sense?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah. I understand what you're

saying.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, getting back to these three applications, we have discussed possibly issuing a conditional -- in lieu of issuing a regular certification, issuing a conditional certification to Jevon Natali for Jevon, for construction and demolition debris, Level A; to Harry Gaspard for construction and demolition Level B; and to Tora Fontenot for construction and demolition, Level B. So, any other discussion on these applications?

Any motions, any comments relative to issuance?

MR. MOLLERE:

I think I made a motion we issue conditionals. $\dot{}$

MR. LAGRANGE:

You move on all three?

Moved by Mr. Mollere. Do I have a second?

MR. WILLIAMS:

I second.

MR. LAGRANGE:

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Second by Mr. Williams. Any other discussion?

Any objections?

MR. BARBER:

I want to object.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. Object -- we do have one --

MR. BARBER:

But, I mean, I know it's no use, but let me say this to the Board, and -because this is going to come up throughout these applications, there are a lot of these conditionals. Y'all know, when I was on the Board before, I had the same position. I haven't changed that. I believe when we -- when a new facility starts, it is our responsibility -- DEQ is depending on us, this Board, to make sure that they have qualified people out there. And, if they don't have experience actually doing the work at a landfill, whatever-type facility and whether it's transfer station or whatever, and if they don't have hands-on experience doing that

then we're falling down on our job. 1 2 it's always been my intent to raise the 3 bar on qualifications and how this industry is perceived to the public. And 4 5 if we continue to allow new facilities to 6 come in and operate with people that does 7 not have any solid waste experience, then 8 we are not raising the bar. We're -- and 9 in my opinion we as a Board are not 10 fulfilling or position to the fullest. 11 MR. LAGRANGE: 12 Okay. 13 MR. MOLLERE: 14 Well I ---15 MR. LAGRANGE: 16 Again -- wait -- I've got a motion on 17 the floor. I had an objection. Is that 18 an objection or? 19 MR. BARBER: 20 No, I'm not --21 MR. LAGRANGE: 22 No objection. Okay. 23 MR. BARBER: 24 There's no point in objecting. 25 MR. LAGRANGE:

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All right. Motion carries. Okay. MR. MOLLERE:

Mr. Chairman, I just need to make one comment on that. And what Mr. Barber is saying is true to a great extent, but what we found over the years and, of course, I go back to the beginning. There was a young fellow by the name of Buddy Velleman who appeared here one time, and he had been given the task of running the Sabine landfill. He didn't know what a landfill was. He appeared before the Board and said, you know, I've been given this by the police jury and I've got to do this, and I need quidance and help. And we issued him a conditional. And within a year, that was probably one of the finest landfills we had in the state. And, of course, he went on to glory and his done a few other things in that area. So, it's not to say that this young man sitting over in the corner is not aware that we have great concerns. But I think it's also a challenge to him to make sure that he does not let down this Board and our

consideration of issuing conditionals and that he runs, probably the finest facility that he can possibly run, and make us all proud of that.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Mr. Chairman, I'd also like to add to it. I agree with a lot of what Troy is saying, and over the years we have been a little bit lax in doing some of the things that we have done. However, I don't think that we should do -- change it in the middle of a stream during a meeting. We should have the rules in play before we have a meeting.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, and that's why I said several times that I think that's a policy issue that the Board needs to discuss among themselves --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yes.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- in and out of a formal meeting --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yes.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- get input on interpretations of the rules and regs, you know --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- talk to the DEQ folks, I mean, you need to do all of that and then if it -- you feel it's important that you set some additional policy or guidance relative to how we apply these rules and regs then we do so.

MR. WILLIAMS:

And then applicants would know coming in what's required.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And it probably would be a great idea -- to keep this to the forefront would be to ask Ms. Suzanne to put that as an agenda item every meeting. And maybe, you know, some folks would volunteer to do some homework and come back and report, you know, at each meeting --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Uh-huh (yes).

1 MR. LAGRANGE: . 2 -- until such time you may or may not 3 decide to adopt some guidance or policy 4 relative to that. 5 MR. WILLIAMS: 6 Right. Uh-huh (yes). 7 MR. BARBER: 8 Mr. President, I -- and I appreciate 9 both of your comments, and it is truly a 10 concern to me but in -- from what I can 11 understand throughout this title 46 12 there's numerous places that it mentions 13 that the Board can make changes to the 14 regulations. But, like, Fred said, we 15 can't do it in the middle of a meeting. 16 MR. WILLIAMS: 17 Right. 18 MR. LAGRANGE: 19 Right. 20 MR. BARBER: 21 And I didn't know any other way to 22 bring it up. 23 MR. LAGRANGE: 24 Yeah. 25 MR. BARBER:

2 of have a lot of them throughout these 3 documents that we're looking at today. 4 So, I'll let us move on with the meeting 5 and -- but I would like to encourage us 6 to -- even if we have --7 MR. LAGRANGE: 8 Well, maybe before October. 9 October's meeting we can come up with a 10 draft policy. If they can work, then we 11 would implement it at that point. 12 course, if we implement it at that point 1.3 then it would be the January or March 14 meeting before we could actually --15 MR. BARBER: 16 It would be the next one. Right. 17 Right. 18 MR. LAGRANGE: 19 Right. And that's, you know, that 20 was just my point. 21 MR. BARBER: 22 Think you, Mr. President. 23 MR. LAGRANGE: 24 All right. Next one is Terrilyn S. 25 Griffin, a C & D, Level B, Lincoln Parish

I see in her application she had previously been awarded conditional Level B certifications and now she's applying for regular certification, which her employment data shows she will have two years experience on August 18th of this year. So, if we were to approve her for regular certification, she would be eligible — would be subject to being eligible by August 18th; is that correct? MS. BORDELON:

Correct.

MR. MOLLERE:

One month away.

MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion that we approve her application for regular certification upon her completing her experience.

MR. LAGRANGE:

We have a motion.

Second by Mr. Stewart. Any other discussion?

Any objection? Motion carries.

Okay. Thank you. Next, we have Mr. Bruce W. Johnson, incinerator, Level

A, Stericycle, in Reserve, Louisiana. 1 2 Now, on his application it says Level B. 3 So is it B or A? 4 MS. BORDELON: 5 Johnson is a B. 6 MR. MOLLERE: 7 Yeah. 8 MR. LAGRANGE: 9 It says A right there. 10 MS. BORDELON: 11 Oh, okay. 12 MR. LAGRANGE: 13 All right. So Level B. Bruce 14 Johnson, it looks like he's also had a 15 conditional -- no, he had something from 16 '98. He was previously certified. 17 MR. BARBER: 18 Yeah. What -- Mr. President, what is -- on page two of his application, the 19 20 Bl, class Bl that he's talking about. 21 MS. BORDELON: 22 It -- we used to call the type IIAs, 23 They used to be classified as B1. A1 24 were landfills, Bls were the type IIAs and 25 C --

1 MR. BARBER: 2 So, has he kept that certification 3 current? 4 MS. BORDELON: 5 No, he has not. 6 MR. LAGRANGE: 7 No. 8 MR. BARBER: 9 Okay. 10 MR. LAGRANGE: He was previously certified, so now 11 12 he is requesting certification again, 13 regular certification. And it looks like 14 he has mucho experience. 15 MR. BARBER: 16 Now, I think it was probably just a 17 mistake on page five he checked the box --18 spot for conditional, I don't -- that 19 wasn't intended to be conditional, right? 20 MS. BORDELON: 21 Say again. 22 MR. LAGRANGE: 23 He checked the conditional. 24 MS. BORDELON: 25 No. Sometimes they don't understand

1 MS. BORDELON: 2 Okay. 3 MR. LAGRANGE: Ms. Marion R. Jones -- Mr., I guess, 4 5 Marion R. Jones, Jr. Progressive Waste, 6 Transfer Station, Level B. Any 7 discussion? Any questions? 8 MR. BARBER: 9 Is he asking for a conditional also? 10 MS. BORDELON: 11 No. 12 MR. LAGRANGE: 13 No, he's asking for a regular 14 certification. 15 MR. BARBER: Okay. Because on the conditional 16 17 back there he put new facility in that 18 spot, indicating to me that he was 19 possibly asking for --20 MR. LAGRANGE: 21 Oh, I see, yeah. 22 MR. BARBER: 23 -- conditional. 24 MR. LAGRANGE: 25 This is a transfer station.

Progressive was IESI then switched to
Progressive. Up in Lafayette or Duson,
they opened up recently, I don't know, I
thought maybe it was a year or so ago.
Because they had some zoning issues with
the city, but they -- lawsuits and stuff,
I guess they got it fixed up.

MR. BARBER:

Let me just ask a question, here, I notice that he had worked for, looks like, maybe seven years as a haul -- waste hauler, apparently, in Cedartown, Georgia. And, of course, we don't know what their solid waste regulations are like, but is -- am I wrong to think that he was in the hauling business and a Transfer Station is basically that? I mean, there's more to it that just hauling, but it's involved in the same thing with that. What I'm asking, would that qualify as experience?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Expense. Well, he says I also managed -- in B of his experience, his last sentence is describe your work in

detail. It says, I also managed the 1 2 Transfer Station at the Dallas, Georgia 3 location. And, you know, with that and 4 his -- I think he meets the experience 5 requirements for a Level B. I would 6 interpret it to be that. Anyone else have 7 any comments on it? Terrence, you got 8 anything? 9 MR. STEWART: 10 No. 11 MR. BARBER: 12 If y'all think that meets the 13 requirements for a Transfer Station, I'm 14 good with it. I'll offer a motion to 15 grant it. 16 MR. LAGRANGE: 17 Do I have a motion? 18 MR. BARBER: 19 I offer a motion. 20 MR. LAGRANGE: 21 Moved by Mr. Stewart. Second by Mr. Barber. Any other discussion? Any 22 23 objection? 24 Motion carries. 25 All right. Next we have Damian L.

Patterson, Tangipahoa Parish Government, 1 2 Landfill, Level B. 3 MR. BARBER: I offer a motion to grant it. 4 5 MR. LAGRANGE: Moved by Mr. Barber, seconded by 6 7 Mr. Mize. Any other discussion? Any 8 objection? Motion carried. 9 10 All right. Next we have Jason D. 11 Seals, Tangipahoa Parish Government, Landfill, Level B. 12 13 MR. BARBER: 14 I offer a motion to grant it. 15 MR. LAGRANGE: 16 Moved by Mr. Barber, second by 17 Mr. Mize. Any other discussion? Any 18 objection? 19 Motion carried. 20 Next we have Shelby Shane Stokes for 21 a Landfill, Level B, Tangipahoa Parish 22 Government. 23 MR. MIZE: 24 So moved. 25 MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Mize. Seconded by 1 2 Mr. Barber. Any discussion? Any 3 objection? Motion carries. 4 5 All right. Next we have Mr. Ronald 6 Roche or Roché for an Incinerator, Level B, Stericycle in Reserve. 7 8 MR. MIZE: 9 Is he just asking for a conditional 10 in case he didn't pass the test? Because, 11 I mean, he's been there since 2008. I was 12 just --MS. BORDELON: 13 14 No, he's not asking for a 15 conditional. 16 MR. FOURRIER: 17 I think they just go --18 MR. MIZE: 19 They just check everything? 20 MR. FOURRIER: 21 Yeah. 22 MS. BORDELON: 23 Yeah. 24 MR. LAGRANGE: 25 Yeah.

2	Suzanne, was that one of our guys
3	this morning at testing?
4	MS. BORDELON:
5	Uh-huh (yes).
6	MR. MIZE:
7	Did he pass the test?
8	MS. BORDELON:
9	Yes, he did.

11	Has he got experience?
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	His attachment shows he's definitely
14	got the experience.
15	MR. FOURRIER:
16	Yeah.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	Moved by Mr. Mize, seconded by
19	Mr. Stewart. Any other discussion? Any
20	objection?
21	Motion carried.
22	Next, Curtis L. Walker, Stericycle,
23	for Incinerator, Waste Handling facility,
24	Level B.
25	MR. BARBER:

1	I'll offer a motion to grant it.
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	Moved by Mr. Barber. Seconded by
4	Mr. Mize. Any discussion? Any objection?
5	Motion carried.
6	Mr. John Walker, Tangipahoa Parish,
7	Landfill, Level B.
8	MR. BARBER:
9	I'll offer a motion to grant it.
10	MR. LAGRANGE:
11	Moved by Mr. Barber. Seconded by
12	Mr. Mollere. Any discussion? Any
13	objection?
14	Motion carried.
15	We have Mr. Willie Walker, Jr. for
16	Incinerator, Waste Handling, Level B,
17	Stericycle.
18	MR. BARBER:
19	Looks like he'll have his experience
20	in on 8/22; is that correct?
21	MS. BORDELON:
22	Correct.
23	MR. LAGRANGE:
24	Right.
25	MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion to grant it, and 1 2 that would be upon completing his experience. 3 4 MR. LAGRANGE: 5 Seconded by -- motion by Mr. Barber 6 seconded by Mr. Stewart. Any discussion? 7 Any objection? 8 Motion carries. 9 Next we have Mr. Timothy Ware, Veolia 10 Water North America, for Incinerator Waste 11 Handling Facility, Level A. 12 MR. BARBER: 13 He doesn't meet the requirements. 14 And he -- I talked to this guy by e-mail, 15 and Suzanne you can help me out when this, 16 he says that they have two other certified 17 operators on-site. He named them as being 18 Stephen Shulin and Ann Wilson. 19 MS. BORDELON: 20 Uh-huh (yes). 21 MR. BARBER: 22 So they do have solid waste operators 23 license? 24 MS. BORDELON:

Yes, they do.

1 MR. BARBER: 2 And is it -- it's not required for a 3 wastewater treatment facility to have a 4 solid waste operator on site is it? 5 MR. LAGRANGE: 6 Well, I think they're doing some --7 MR. FOURRIER: 8 They incinerate their sludge. 9 MR. LAGRANGE: 10 Yeah. That's what it looks like. 11 They're incinerating their sludge or doing 12 something with it. 13 MR. BARBER: 14 Yeah. It -- and in talking to him he 15 says that it was a -- and I don't know 16 these terms, because I'm not familiar with 17 incinerators, but they have a fluidized 18 bed incinerator. Some of you guys may 19 know what that is. 20 MR. LAGRANGE: 21 What is that, Jon? 22 MR. FOURRIER: 23 I don't want to bore y'all. 24 MR. BARBER: 25 Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

In layman's terms.

MR. BARBER:

Is it -- is the requirement the same to have a certified operator for that type of incinerator as a regular incinerator?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, evidently DEQ is requiring them to have a permit. And so they are licensed operators they have a permit from DEQ under this permit category. So it requires them to have licensed operators.

MR. BARBER:

When -- and I asked that question when I talked to him, and, apparently, he represents a contractor that operates the facility. He's only been at this facility three and half months, and his comment to me when I questioned him about experience with an incinerator, his comment to me was my experience with incinerators is limited to this site, so three and half months is the experience he has with an incinerator.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Any other comments or questions?

1.

MR. BARBER:

And let me just make one -- let me just read one other thing that he commented here. He said there is another operator on-site with a license but it was suggested that I get one as well. So, it wasn't required and he doesn't meet the experience requirements.

MR. FOURRIER:

Well, he's got an engineering degree, so he needs two years of experience.

MR. BARBER:

But he still needs two years of experience, correct?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. Yeah, with an engineering degree you still need two years solid waste experience.

MR. FOURRIER:

I mean, he managed a wastewater treatment facility for four years, but was your concern that it didn't have an incinerator at the old plant?

MR. BARBER:

Right. There was not an incinerator

1	at that facility.
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	Right. It had biosolids, it says.
4	MR. FOURRIER:
5	And a heat drying process.
6	MR. LAGRANGE:
7	It was converted to a Class A. I
8	don't know what that was.
9	MR. BARBER:
10	And he's specifically asking for a
11	Level A Incinerator.
12	MR. STEWART:
13	Maybe we can table it until the next
14	meeting and let Suzanne maybe get a little
15	more information about his background?
16	About the old facility, maybe.
17	MR. BARBER:
18	Did he test today, Suzanne?
19	MS. BORDELON:
20	He did.
21	MR. STEWART:
22	Yeah, he passed.
23	MR. BARBER:
24	And passed?
25	MS. BORDELON:

1 Uh-huh (yes). 2 MS. PERKINS: 3 Could he be conditional? 4 MR. LAGRANGE: 5 Let's not take any action, get some 6 more information on his experience at his 7 previous facility, and then determine --8 bring it up at the next meeting, and also 9 inquire if the Board determines he does 10 not meet the experience requirements at 11 this times, would he want to be issued a 12 conditional until such time as he got the 13 experience. 14 MR. BARBER: 15 Do you need a motion to table it? 16 MR. LAGRANGE: 17 No, we just won't take any action on 18 it. 19 MR. BARBER: 20 Okay. 21 MR. LAGRANGE: 22 Thank you. 23 MR. MOLLERE: 24 That's the old Florida Avenue 25 Incinerator site.

1 MS. BORDELON: 2 Uh-huh (yes). 3 MR. MOLLERE: 4 Yeah, by the closed landfill, the one 5 that gave us trouble for so many years. MR. LAGRANGE: 6 7 All right. And we have a last 8 application for regular certification is 9 Aaron Keith Clark, Waste Connections of 10 Louisiana, White Oaks Landfill for a 11 Landfill, Level B. 12 MR. BARBER: 13 Well, once again, it looks like he 14 has some experience outside of the state 15 of Louisiana. 16 MR. LAGRANGE: 17 Yeah, Alabama. 18 MR. BARBER: From '09 to 2012. And it looks like 19 20 about eight months at this facility, but 21 if we want to --22 MR. LAGRANGE: 23 He needs the two years experience for 24 a Level B. 25 MR. FOURRIER:

1 The regs don't require it to be 2 Louisiana. 3 MR BARBER: Not really, but normally if they're 4 5 coming from another state we'd do it by 6 reciprocity rather than -- he didn't ask 7 for reciprocity. 8 MR. LAGRANGE: 9 He didn't -- he wasn't licensed in 10 the other state. He wasn't certified. 11 MR. BARBER: 12 He wasn't licensed there, but he did 13 get his experience there. I feel okay 14 with it. I'm going to offer a motion to 15 grant it. 16 MR. MOLLERE: 17 Mr. Chairman, I know that --18 MR. LAGRANGE: 19 Moved by Mr. Barber, seconded by 20 Mr. Mize. Any discussion? 21 MR. MOLLERE: 22 I know that a couple of our sister 23 states have some good regulations. 24 Arkansas, I think particularly, and

recently Mississippi. Suzanne just sent

them a packet of information because they 1 2 are looking at restructuring some of their 3 levels of certification. And when I talked to the director over there, he was 4 5 concerned that our qualifications seem to 6 be a whole lot more complicated and 7 involved than theirs, so I think maybe 8 we're bringing them up. I know Alabama 9 has a certification program, but I don't 10 know exactly what the extent is, so. 11 MR. LAGRANGE: 12 Okay. We have a motion and a second. 13 Any other discussion? Any objection? 14 Motion carries. 15 All right. That completes our review 16 of applications for regular certification. 17 Now we'll review our --18 MR. MIZE: 19 Excuse me, I thought we have 20 Mr. Becker. 21 MS. BORDELON: 22 That's an extension to the 23 conditional. 24 MR. LAGRANGE: 25 That's next, Mr. Mize.

We have review of requests for conditional certificate extensions. We have five of those to go over. I'll read the names, and we have Robert Becker Louisiana State Penitentiary for Incinerator, Level A; we have Linda Jones for a conditional C & D, Level B, Natchitoches Parish Police Jury; we have Ken Mudd for a construction and demolition debris, Level A; Brandt Pedersen, Construction BP Disposal, LLC; we have Erik Pederson, Brandt Pedersen Construction BP Disposal for a construction and demolition, Level A; we have Daria Ransome, Gator Environmental Waste Solutions for a Separation Facility, Level A.

Do I have a motion to extend those conditionals?

MR. BARBER:

So moved.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Barber. Seconded by Mr. Stewart. Any other discussion? Any objection?

Motion carries.

All right. Next, review of requests for --

MS. BORDELON:

I don't know why that's on there.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. So we're skipping that. Review of applications for recertification. And these are the individuals who have met all of the recertification requirements, including their continuing education requirements. Alan D. Auger, Landfill, Level A, West Carroll Parish Landfill; Douglas Bagwell, C & D, Level A, Lincoln Parish Landfill; Paul L. Bouchereau, Landfill, Level A, Woodside Landfill; Jody Chenier, Landfill, Level A, St. James Parish Landfill; Muriel M. Chrisley, Landfill, Level A, Woolworth Road Southwest Landfill; Johnna N. Cortes, Landfill, Level A, Reliable Landfill; Isaiah S. Dufrene, C & D, Level B, KV

Landfill; Paul B. Marks, Landfill, Level A and C & D, Level A, Little Dixie Landfill; Kerry B. Outley, C & D, Level A, Lincoln Parish Landfill; Stephen J. Shulin, Incinerator, Level A, Veolia Water Wastewater Treatment Plant; and Joseph S. Williams, Jr., C & D, Level A, Iberia Parish Landfill.

Do we have a motion to issue recertification?

MR. MOLLERE:

LAGRANGE: 6 So, I'll entertain a motion to 7 approve them conditional on them attending and obtaining their 40 -- their final ten 8 9 hours. 1.0 MR. MOLLERE: 11 So moved. 12 MR. LAGRANGE: 13 Second by -- motion by Mr. Mollere, second by Mr. Barber. Any other 1.4 15 discussion? Any objections? Motion carried. 16 17 Okay. Thank you. 18 All right. Walker, 14 Landfill, Level B. Willie D. Walker, 15 Incinerator, Level B, we'll issue 16 August 22nd. And Aaron Clark, Landfill, 17 Level B. 18 MR. LAGRANGE: 19 Okay. Do I have a motion to issue 20 certification? 21 Moved by Mr. Barber. Seconded by 22 Ms. Perkins. Any objection? Any other 23 discussion? 24 Motion carries. 25 Okay. Thank you. Next, we'll move

1 to the committee reports. 2 Awards committee, Mr. Mize? 3 MR. MIZE: Nothing to report. 4 5 MR. LAGRANGE: Mr. Mize, I noticed in the minutes we 6 7 had discussed maybe announcing -- asking 8 the LSWA to announce at their workshops to 9 remind the operators to participate in 10 nominating folks for the Level B and Level 11 A awards. 17	MR. MOLLERE:
18	No report.
19	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	Okay. Mr. Williams, would you have
21	anything to comment on continuing
22	education?
23	MR. WILLIAMS:
24	On continuing education?
25	MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah.

MR. WILLIAMS:

No, sir.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. Next, nominating committee, Mr. Williams?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Okay. We have two Board members coming off, this is their last meeting. They have served and completed -- well, they will complete their second term in October prior to the next meeting. That is our illustrious chairman, Mr. Lagrange, and also Mr. Mollere --

MR. MOLLERE:

Vice Chair.

MR. WILLIAMS:

-- vice Chairman. So, we're losing some valuable experience on the board.

It's my understanding that a replacement is in the works for Mr. Mollere. A letter has been sent and they're waiting for signatures, so until that happens I won't divulging any names. Mr. Dartez is being contacted in reference to a replacement

for --1 2 MR. LAGRANGE: 3 Police Jury Association. 4 MR. WILLIAMS: 5 -- the Police Jury Association. 6 MR. LAGRANGE: 7 Right. You -- a letter was sent to 8 him, you said? 9 MS. BORDELON: It sent it yesterday, yes. 10 11 MR. LAGRANGE: 12 Yeah. The letters were sent --13 MR. WILLIAMS: Oh, the letter was sent yesterday? 14 15 MS. BORDELON: 16 Uh-huh (yes). 17 MR. WILLIAMS: Okay. All right. So, we will wait 18 19 for that. And, also, next year in October 20 we'll have two people completing their 21 second term, James Berthelot, who is not 22 here today and also Denny Mize. So, 23 that's what we'll have. 24 MR. LAGRANGE: 25 Mr. Berthelot's Police Jury

Association and Mr. Mize is private 1 2 industry. 3 MR. WILLIAMS: 4 Solid waste disposal industry, yeah. 5 MR. LAGRANGE: 6 Yeah. All right. So, I trust you 7 will stay on top of that? 8 MR. WILLIAMS: 9 Yes, sir. As a matter of fact, I was going to amend the agenda to try to do an 10 election, but I think I'll just wait until 11 12 October --13 MR. LAGRANGE: 14 Okay. 15 MR. WILLIAMS: 16 -- and do it at the -- when we have 17 our new -- hopefully we will have two new 18 Board members at that time. 19 MR. LAGRANGE: 20 All right. 21 MR. 16	MR. BARBER:
17	'14, I believe, is when they expire.
18	MS. BORDELON:
19	Okay. Okay.
20	MR. BARBER:
21	October.
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	So we don't need to do anything with
24	you. Okay.
25	MR LAGRANGE:

1 All right. That concludes your 2 report? 3 MR. WILLIAMS: That concludes my report. 4 5 MR. LAGRANGE: 6 Okay. Thank you. 7 MR. BARBER: Can I ask a question right here? 8 9 And, Bo, we hate to see you go, and you've 10 been a great president and chairman of 11 this Board. 12 MR. WILLIAMS: 13 Who told you that? 14 MR. BARBER: 15 Well, I was here before. And we 16 really appreciate you. And, being he's 17 going to be going off before the next 18 meeting, I assume we do have a co-chair 19 or -- that would take that position, and 20 that is the month for officer election, 21 isn't it? 22 MR. Oh, you're going out -- we're losing both of them.

But normally -- and in our Parish

Council, we have those situations where we
may have that kind of thing and they just
get together and say, okay, well, you -whoever -- open the meeting, call the
meeting to order, open it up, conduct the
order of business to have elections, once
you elect a chairman then they'll take
over from there.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Now, Mr. Chairman, if I need to, I can make a motion to amend the agenda and have an election. I have some names that I've been offered for nominations. So, if y'all would like to do that now.

Otherwise, we can just wait until October.

1 MR. MOLLERE: 2 I move we amend the agenda and let 3 you offer the names. 4 MR. LAGRANGE: 5 All right. So, I have a motion to 6 expand the agenda to conduct an election 7 of officers pending the expiration of the Chairman and Vice Chairman's terms. Do I 8 9 have a second to that expansion? 10 Seconded by Mr. Stewart. Do I have 11 any objections to expansion of the agenda? 12 Hearing none, the motion carries. 13 MR. WILLIAMS: 14 Okay. Mr. Chairman, with that in mind, I have the names of Terrence 15 16 Stewart. 17 MR. LAGRANGE: 18 You make a motion to nominate? 19 MR. WILLIAMS: 20 Yes. 21 MR. LAGRANGE: 22 Okay. 23 MR. WILLIAMS: Terrence Stewart --24 25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1 Okay. 2 MR. WILLIAMS: 3 -- Chairman. And I'll just do both of them at the same time -- Jonathan 4 Fourrier as Vice Chairman. 5 6 MR. LAGRANGE: 7 All right. 8 MR. MOLLERE: Two newbies. 9 10 MR. LAGRANGE: 11 Is there any other nominations? Any 12 objections to elect Mr. Terrence Stewart 13 Chairman and Mr. John Fourrier, Vice Chairman by acclamation? 14 15 MR. MOLLERE: 16 So moved. 17 MR. LAGRANGE: 18 No, any objections. 19 Hearing none, motion carries. 20 Congratulations, Terrence, congratulations 21 Jon. 22 MR. WILLIAMS: 23 Congratulations. 24 MR. MOLLERE: 25 Now, as our previous Chairman has

1 done, you're going to have that big 2 Christmas luncheon, right? 3 MR. WILLIAMS: 4 Does that mean we have to go to 5 Tangipahoa Parish for the December 6 meeting? 7 MR. BARBER: That would be great for me. 8 9 MR. MOLLERE: 10 His look was almost the same as 11 Troy's look. 12 MR. STEWART: 13 Maybe one of our neighboring parishes would host our lunch. 14 15 MS. PERKINS: 16 I work for a municipality. 17 MR. LAGRANGE: 18 Okay. Any other business to come 19 before the Board? 20 Hearing none, any public comments? 21 I do have two comments. First, I 22 want to reiterate what Fred said, and 23 welcome Troy back on the Board. We 24 appreciate your desire to serve and your 25 enthusiasm in making sure that this Board

1 maintains its integrity relative to 2 carrying out the principles of the rules 3 and regulations. So, welcome back to 4 Troy. 5 MR. BARBER: 6 Think you. 7 MR. LAGRANGE: 8 And, lastly, I'd like to also thank Mr. Mollere for his service. It has been 9 10 a pleasure serving with you. And, 11 personally, it's been a pleasure for me to 12 serve on this Board with you the last six 13 years. And as your Chairman I appreciate 14 the confidence and your support that 15 you've given me over the years. So, 16 thanks again and it's been a pleasure. 17 Do I have a motion to adjourn? 18 MR. WILLIAMS: 19 So moved. 20 MR. BARBER: 21 So moved. 22 MR. LAGRANGE: 23 Moved by Mr. Williams, seconded by 24 Mr. Barber. 25
