PROCEEDINGS

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MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. We'll go ahead and get started. I'd like to call to order the meeting of the Board of Certification and Training for Solid Waste Management Operators. Can we have roll call?

MS. BORDELON:

William Mollere?

MR. MOLLERE:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Denny Mize?

MR. MIZE:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Terrence Stewart?

MR. STEWART:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Krystal Perkins?

MS. PERKINS:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Troy Barber?

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MR. BARBER:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Fred Williams?

Jonathan Fourrier?

MR. FOURRIER:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Sam Phillips?

James Berthelot?

Henry Legrange?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Present.

MS. BORDELON:

Sorry.

MR. MIZE:

She forgot you, Mr. President.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. We're reviewing the minutes of the March 22nd meeting. Anybody have any comments, changes? If we have none --

MR. MOLLERE:

Move to accept.

MR. LAGRANGE:

We have a motion to accept the

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minutes.

MR. MIZE:

Second.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Second by Mr. Mize, motion by
MR. Mollere. Any other discussion? Any
objection?

Motion carries.

Okay. We'll move on to consideration
of operator certifications. First on the
list is review of applications for
certification. And I will call the names
and the level of certification being
applied for. And if anyone has any
questions or comments, just speak up as we
go through the names.

First is Tora Fontenot, Jevcon for a
construction demolition Level B.

MR. BARBER:

I don't see that this experience
set -- any of these from Jevcon has --
meets the requires for a --

MR. LAGRANGE:

A regular?

MR. BARBER:

1 -- a regular license, yeah. I mean,
2 that -- they're apparently doing some dirt
3 work at the letter that they sent
4 indicates that they've been working on
5 construction on landfill, which does not
6 meet the requirements of operating a
7 landfill.

8 MS. BORDELON:

9 Mr. Natali with Jevcon is present, if
10 anybody has any questions for him about
11 what the status of his facility is at this
12 time.

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Is your facility permitted -- do you
15 currently have a permit --

16 MR. NATALI:

17 Yes, sir I'm waiting on --

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 -- operating permit?

20 MR. NATALI:

21 I'm waiting on the -- them to give me
22 the commencement to start.

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 Okay. And we may want to consider
25 conditional certifications. Did -- was

1 that discussed with you? Or did you --

2 MR. NATALI:

3 They did. I just had chose to come
4 and take the test --

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 Right.

7 MR. NATALI:

8 -- with the people that would work
9 there.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 That's great.

12 MR. NATALI:

13 And that way we would have the test
14 taken and hope that y'all would give me a
15 conditional one to get up and running and
16 get the experience.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Okay. And we'll go ahead and take
19 these -- the Jevcon -- let's go ahead and
20 take the Jevcon applications, and look at
21 all three of them. I think we have three;
22 is that correct?

23 MR. BARBER:

24 Uh-huh (yes).

25 MS. BORDELON:

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Yes.

MR. LAGRANGE:

We have Mr. Natali, and we also have Mr. Harry Gaspard.

MS. BORDELON:

And Tora Fontenot.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And Mr. Gaspard -- Tora Fontenot and Harry Gaspard are both for level -- construction and demolition, Level B. Mr. Natali is a level -- construction demolition Level A request. Have y'all -- anyone else reviewed those applications had any comments or questions about the experience requirements?

MR. MOLLERE:

I thought it was a general question Troy brought up about exactly what they were doing, but we have an explanation from the operator. I would move that it would be appropriate that we give them conditional, and by the time we meet again and everything ought to be fine.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. The experience requirements,

1 again, for the Level A is three years
2 experience. Level B is two years
3 experience. Conditionals are issued for
4 six months at a time, so every six months
5 you'd be -- you know, you'd need to get
6 with Ms. Bordelon to apply for extension,
7 a renewal of it for another six months
8 until such time you met your experience
9 requirements for the various levels that
10 you have. In addition to requirements
11 relative to continuing education and
12 testing is?

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 Is within the six months of the
15 issuance of that conditional that you take
16 and pass the test and attend a ten hour
17 workshop, which he's doing today.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Okay. So you have met that criteria.

20 MR. MOLLERE:

21 They should be ready in October with
22 the experiences.

23 MR. BARBER:

24 Well, they won't have met their three
25 years.

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MS. BORDELON:

Well, they won't have met --

MR. BARBER:

In order to get an A Level, you need three years of experience. And I'm going to go ahead and say this, might as well open a can of worms while I'm at it, I have a problem with any facility operating with conditionals only. I think they need at least one man that has some real landfill experience to guide them. And I don't think anybody here can take the regulations and disagree with that.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Other than the regulations don't require that. The regulations do --

MR. BARBER:

The regulations require --

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- not require that. They allow for issuance of conditional certifications. They do not require that a facility has experience. It's up to us to determine if the person we're issuing a conditional to has enough over-all experience.

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MR. BARBER:

Well, I don't --

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- or guidance to operate it in a conditional way until such time they meet the experience requirements.

MR. BARBER:

But --

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- and obtain a regular certification.

MR. BARBER:

But now, Bo, we as a Board, it's our responsibility to make sure that these facilities are being operated by people that have the experience to operate them in the right manner. And you know, yourself, when -- if you didn't have -- if you had zero experience and they threw you out there to operate a landfill, you wouldn't have known how to do that.

MR. LAGRANGE:

That's correct. And --

MR. BARBER:

So, who's giving them their guidance?

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MR. LAGRANGE:

And again -- that -- well, the guidance is they are taking the exams, so, number one, they are going through and reviewing the rules and regulations in preparation of taking the exam. That's the first part. The second part is, they're required to attend the workshop, so hopefully, they're picking up some other information. The third part that I see is the fact that, you know, DEQ is the regulatory oversight of their operations --

MR. BARBER:

Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- so when they come on site, if they are not operating in accordance with their permit then they are going to be -- have to answer to DEQ and DEQ will give them whatever corrective action they need to take to come in compliance with their -- you know, make their facility in compliance with their permit and with the rules and regs.

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MR. BARBER:

Well --

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, it's kind of a Catch-22, and, as I said, our rules do not require that a facility have it. And where we get caught in the middle --

MR. BARBER:

Well, actually it does require that facility have a Level A with three years of experience, Bo. We have that Level -- we have that conditional that, I think, has been abused for many, many years, to help these new facilities to get in compliance.

MR. LAGRANGE:

That's right.

MR. BARBER:

And that's not the purpose of this Board. This -- the purpose of this Board is to make sure that they have experienced operators on-site operating these facilities.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. And you said it yourself when

1 you have a new facility coming online,
2 especially -- and I would -- the majority
3 of them are C & D, wood waste, separation
4 type facilities --

5 MR. BARBER:

6 Uh-huh (yes).

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Where you have companies that are in
9 some type of construction business or
10 demolition business or whatever and all of
11 a sudden they decide, hey, I've got an
12 empty hole where I had a dirt pit, I'm
13 going to go ahead and start putting debris
14 in it and fill it up, and I can charge and
15 I can bring my own stuff that I generate
16 from my other work. So then they realize
17 they've got to get a permit from DEQ. So
18 that starts the process. You know, do we
19 take the position as a Board to put that
20 burden in -- amongst ourselves and say,
21 although the regs don't -- the regs allow
22 that you can -- that a conditional
23 certified operator can operate these
24 facilities, and we take the position,
25 well, even though it allows for that, are

1 we're going to say, no, we require -- we
2 are not going to grant anything but at
3 least make sure they have one regular
4 certified operator at a facility? That's
5 a position the Board has to take.

6 MR. BARBER:

7 And that's what I'm saying, let's
8 have at least one that has the experience
9 to operate that facility. I don't have a
10 problem with giving some conditionals for
11 some of the B Levels, and actually these
12 guys would probably qualify after one year
13 of -- these B Levels will qualify after
14 one year because on a B you can have one
15 year of solid waste experience and two
16 years --

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Construction.

19 MR. BARBER:

20 -- in the construction field --

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 That's correct.

23 MR. BARBER:

24 -- operating equipment, drainage, and
25 so on. So, I'm just concerned about that

1 guy that's the lead guy who apparently is
2 the guy that's sitting here with us today.
3 And I mean no harm to you or your company
4 when I'm saying this, I just feel that we
5 have a responsibility to make sure that
6 there is someone on site day to day
7 holding everybody's hand and guiding them
8 in the right direction.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 And just to clarify, so everyone is,
11 again, up to speed on what our regs say
12 relative to conditional certification, it
13 says that a conditional certificate shall
14 allow an operator to operate only the
15 facility at which he is employed at the
16 time of certification. The requirements
17 are as follows: the applicant must request
18 a conditional certification. The Board
19 must determine that the applicant is
20 qualified to perform duties at a
21 particular facility. That's a key
22 statement, that it's also incumbent on us
23 to review their applications and see if
24 they are qualified for that specific
25 facility. Now, in this case, you know,

1 they only -- for that facility they're
2 familiar with what they have to do to
3 operate that facility. They went through
4 the permit process with DEQ so they know
5 what permitting issues and what the rules
6 and regs say relative to that. It also
7 says they must pass the operator
8 examination and attend one Board-approved
9 training class --

10 MR. BARBER:

11 Within six months.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 -- within six months. Yeah. So, you
14 know, again, as I said, you know, we --
15 what we've been doing in the past, I think
16 the Board has taken the position that when
17 they reviewed the application for the
18 conditionals that they felt those people's
19 qualifications were -- had enough
20 experience to be a conditional operator at
21 that specific facility, the one in which
22 they are employed at and which they are
23 most familiar with, you know, the
24 operations of. But that's something that
25 the Board will have to decide if they want

1 to develop a policy different than what
2 we've been using in the past, you know.
3 So, it's going to, you know, require, I
4 think, some more research and some more
5 discussion amongst everyone to get a feel
6 for that.

7 MR. FOURRIER:

8 Did they all -- all three of the pass
9 the test?

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 Yes, they did.

12 MR. FOURRIER:

13 And who built this facility? Did
14 y'all build it yourselves?

15 MR. NATALI:

16 Yes, sir.

17 MR. FOURRIER:

18 And what are you regularly? You run
19 a construction company?

20 MR. NATALI:

21 I do. I've been hauling the same
22 time waste to all the facilities around
23 us, so I'm familiar -- I've been in
24 construction for a long time -- so I'm
25 familiar with what they take, what they

1 don't take, what they're allowed. And
2 then starting when we did the permit, I've
3 been on-going a permit for about ten years
4 with DEQ. Then, after that point when I
5 consulted with DEQ they told me -- they
6 educated me a lot on what to take and then
7 I went to their small business part to
8 learn more, because I was real concerned
9 about coming take the test. And even
10 though it says I have six months, it was
11 my goal to get everybody enough knowledge
12 here with the test to where I thought we
13 could better run the facility, you know?

14 MR. FOURRIER:

15 Uh-huh (yes).

16 MR. NATALI:

17 But all of them have a lot of
18 experience in the field as far as what
19 we're allowed to send to those facilities
20 and what were not. And then we do -- I
21 do, also, a lot of civil work and as far
22 as, you know, drainage, and most of those
23 guys are in equipment a lot.

24 MR. WILLIAMS:

25 Mr. Chairman?

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MR. LAGRANGE:

Yes.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Excuse me, in a nutshell can you bring me up to speed on what we're -- are we about to take a vote on something or are we discussing?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, we started reviewing the applications for regular certification --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- and first one that came up was Ms. Tora Fontenot --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- which is with the Jevcon facility. And that's when a discussion ensued that, for regular certification it was determined that we didn't feel that there was a sufficient solid waste experience for regular certification under the application. However, because it's a new

1 facility Jevcon informed us that they are
2 waiting for the order to commence
3 operations from DEQ.

4 MR. WILLIAMS:

5 Uh-huh (yes).

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 That the three applicants, there's
8 three applicants here for review, that
9 potentially we would consider conditional
10 certifications for them in anticipation of
11 them getting their orders to commence
12 their permit to operate their facility.
13 And a discussion ensued on the fact that
14 whether or not we have always issued, kind
15 of, carte blanche conditionals for new
16 facilities and not really looking at the
17 qualifications of the people we're doing,
18 to make sure they are qualified to operate
19 a solid waste facility and that, possibly,
20 the Board may want to take the position
21 that we want at least one regular
22 certified operator in these types of
23 facilities. And that's -- brings you up
24 in a nutshell where the discussion has
25 been.

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MR. WILLIAMS:

But the rules don't say that.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, the rules say that a facility shall have a certified operator.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. LAGRANGE:

It says you have the regular certification and then it also allows for the issuance of conditional certifications. And that's what the discussion has been on, yes, we can allow conditional certifications, and the question is allowing conditionals at a facility, are those conditional -- the folks we are looking at, are they truly qualified to operate a solid waste facility? Part of the discussion I had was that, you know, DEQ is the regulatory agency, so, you know, if they're not following their permit then they're going to have to deal with DEQ and correct -- take corrective action to address those issues. The other part was that if

1 they're, you know, working on a permit, at
2 some point they're being exposed to the
3 rules and regulations and the testing, in
4 addition, if they haven't they're required
5 to take the test and attend the workshop
6 within six months of getting a
7 conditional. And so that exposes them
8 again to the rules and regulations and
9 operations at that type of stuff. So, in
10 a nutshell, that's where it's at. Again,
11 as I said, I think it's going to be up to
12 the Board if we feel that we want to take
13 the position or policy that, regardless,
14 we will issue conditionals but that we
15 will make sure that there is one regular
16 certified operator at a facility. And, as
17 I said, I think that's going to take some
18 research and some discussion amongst
19 yourselves and reviewing the regs and
20 getting some -- making sure some
21 interpretation in the regs that we can
22 take that position if the Board chooses to
23 do so. Makes sense?

24 MR. WILLIAMS:

25 Yeah. I understand what you're

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saying.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, getting back to these three applications, we have discussed possibly issuing a conditional -- in lieu of issuing a regular certification, issuing a conditional certification to Jevon Natali for Jevcon, for construction and demolition debris, Level A; to Harry Gaspard for construction and demolition Level B; and to Tora Fontenot for construction and demolition, Level B. So, any other discussion on these applications?

Any motions, any comments relative to issuance?

MR. MOLLERE:

I think I made a motion we issue conditionals.

MR. LAGRANGE:

You move on all three?

Moved by Mr. Mollere. Do I have a second?

MR. WILLIAMS:

I second.

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MR. LAGRANGE:

Second by Mr. Williams. Any other discussion?

Any objections?

MR. BARBER:

I want to object.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. Object -- we do have one --

MR. BARBER:

But, I mean, I know it's no use, but let me say this to the Board, and -- because this is going to come up throughout these applications, there are a lot of these conditionals. Y'all know, when I was on the Board before, I had the same position. I haven't changed that. I believe when we -- when a new facility starts, it is our responsibility -- DEQ is depending on us, this Board, to make sure that they have qualified people out there. And, if they don't have experience actually doing the work at a landfill, whatever-type facility and whether it's transfer station or whatever, and if they don't have hands-on experience doing that

1 then we're falling down on our job. And
2 it's always been my intent to raise the
3 bar on qualifications and how this
4 industry is perceived to the public. And
5 if we continue to allow new facilities to
6 come in and operate with people that does
7 not have any solid waste experience, then
8 we are not raising the bar. We're -- and
9 in my opinion we as a Board are not
10 fulfilling our position to the fullest.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 Okay.

13 MR. MOLLERE:

14 Well I --

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 Again -- wait -- I've got a motion on
17 the floor. I had an objection. Is that
18 an objection or?

19 MR. BARBER:

20 No, I'm not --

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 No objection. Okay.

23 MR. BARBER:

24 There's no point in objecting.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

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All right. Motion carries. Okay.

MR. MOLLERE:

Mr. Chairman, I just need to make one comment on that. And what Mr. Barber is saying is true to a great extent, but what we found over the years and, of course, I go back to the beginning. There was a young fellow by the name of Buddy Velleman who appeared here one time, and he had been given the task of running the Sabine landfill. He didn't know what a landfill was. He appeared before the Board and said, you know, I've been given this by the police jury and I've got to do this, and I need guidance and help. And we issued him a conditional. And within a year, that was probably one of the finest landfills we had in the state. And, of course, he went on to glory and his done a few other things in that area. So, it's not to say that this young man sitting over in the corner is not aware that we have great concerns. But I think it's also a challenge to him to make sure that he does not let down this Board and our

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consideration of issuing conditionals and that he runs, probably the finest facility that he can possibly run, and make us all proud of that.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Mr. Chairman, I'd also like to add to it. I agree with a lot of what Troy is saying, and over the years we have been a little bit lax in doing some of the things that we have done. However, I don't think that we should do -- change it in the middle of a stream during a meeting. We should have the rules in play before we have a meeting.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, and that's why I said several times that I think that's a policy issue that the Board needs to discuss among themselves --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yes.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- in and out of a formal meeting --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yes.

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MR. LAGRANGE:

-- get input on interpretations of the rules and regs, you know --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- talk to the DEQ folks, I mean, you need to do all of that and then if it -- you feel it's important that you set some additional policy or guidance relative to how we apply these rules and regs then we do so.

MR. WILLIAMS:

And then applicants would know coming in what's required.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And it probably would be a great idea -- to keep this to the forefront would be to ask Ms. Suzanne to put that as an agenda item every meeting. And maybe, you know, some folks would volunteer to do some homework and come back and report, you know, at each meeting --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Uh-huh (yes).

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MR. LAGRANGE:

-- until such time you may or may not decide to adopt some guidance or policy relative to that.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right. Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BARBER:

Mr. President, I -- and I appreciate both of your comments, and it is truly a concern to me but in -- from what I can understand throughout this title 46 there's numerous places that it mentions that the Board can make changes to the regulations. But, like, Fred said, we can't do it in the middle of a meeting.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right.

MR. BARBER:

And I didn't know any other way to bring it up.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah.

MR. BARBER:

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But, on these circumstance -- because of have a lot of them throughout these documents that we're looking at today. So, I'll let us move on with the meeting and -- but I would like to encourage us to -- even if we have --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, maybe before October. Before October's meeting we can come up with a draft policy. If they can work, then we would implement it at that point. Of course, if we implement it at that point then it would be the January or March meeting before we could actually --

MR. BARBER:

It would be the next one. Right. Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. And that's, you know, that was just my point.

MR. BARBER:

Think you, Mr. President.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. Next one is Terrilyn S. Griffin, a C & D, Level B, Lincoln Parish

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Landfill. I see in her application she had previously been awarded conditional Level B certifications and now she's applying for regular certification, which her employment data shows she will have two years experience on August 18th of this year. So, if we were to approve her for regular certification, she would be eligible -- would be subject to being eligible by August 18th; is that correct?

MS. BORDELON:

Correct.

MR. MOLLERE:

One month away.

MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion that we approve her application for regular certification upon her completing her experience.

MR. LAGRANGE:

We have a motion.

Second by Mr. Stewart. Any other discussion?

Any objection? Motion carries.

Okay. Thank you. Next, we have Mr. Bruce W. Johnson, incinerator, Level

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A, Stericycle, in Reserve, Louisiana.

Now, on his application it says Level B.

So is it B or A?

MS. BORDELON:

Johnson is a B.

MR. MOLLERE:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

It says A right there.

MS. BORDELON:

Oh, okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. So Level B. Bruce Johnson, it looks like he's also had a conditional -- no, he had something from '98. He was previously certified.

MR. BARBER:

Yeah. What -- Mr. President, what is -- on page two of his application, the B1, class B1 that he's talking about.

MS. BORDELON:

It -- we used to call the type IIAs, B1. They used to be classified as B1. A1 were landfills, B1s were the type IIAs and C --

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MR. BARBER:

So, has he kept that certification current?

MS. BORDELON:

No, he has not.

MR. LAGRANGE:

No.

MR. BARBER:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

He was previously certified, so now he is requesting certification again, regular certification. And it looks like he has mucho experience.

MR. BARBER:

Now, I think it was probably just a mistake on page five he checked the box -- spot for conditional, I don't -- that wasn't intended to be conditional, right?

MS. BORDELON:

Say again.

MR. LAGRANGE:

He checked the conditional.

MS. BORDELON:

No. Sometimes they don't understand

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quite what that means.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Are there any other discussions
questions on Mr. Johnson?

MR. BARBER:

Did he take the test today?

MS. BORDELON:

He did take the test and passed.

MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion to grant it.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Second.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Barber, second by
Mr. Williams. Any discussion? Any
objection?

Motion carried.

All right. Next we have Ms. --

MS. BORDELON:

Are we going to make a motion on each
one?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah.

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MS. BORDELON:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Ms. Marion R. Jones -- Mr., I guess,
Marion R. Jones, Jr. Progressive Waste,
Transfer Station, Level B. Any
discussion? Any questions?

MR. BARBER:

Is he asking for a conditional also?

MS. BORDELON:

No.

MR. LAGRANGE:

No, he's asking for a regular
certification.

MR. BARBER:

Okay. Because on the conditional
back there he put new facility in that
spot, indicating to me that he was
possibly asking for --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Oh, I see, yeah.

MR. BARBER:

-- conditional.

MR. LAGRANGE:

This is a transfer station.

1 Progressive was IESI then switched to
2 Progressive. Up in Lafayette or Duson,
3 they opened up recently, I don't know, I
4 thought maybe it was a year or so ago.
5 Because they had some zoning issues with
6 the city, but they -- lawsuits and stuff,
7 I guess they got it fixed up.

8 MR. BARBER:

9 Let me just ask a question, here, I
10 notice that he had worked for, looks like,
11 maybe seven years as a haul -- waste
12 hauler, apparently, in Cedartown, Georgia.
13 And, of course, we don't know what their
14 solid waste regulations are like, but
15 is -- am I wrong to think that he was in
16 the hauling business and a Transfer
17 Station is basically that? I mean,
18 there's more to it than just hauling, but
19 it's involved in the same thing with that.
20 What I'm asking, would that qualify as
21 experience?

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Expense. Well, he says I also
24 managed -- in B of his experience, his
25 last sentence is describe your work in

1 detail. It says, I also managed the
2 Transfer Station at the Dallas, Georgia
3 location. And, you know, with that and
4 his -- I think he meets the experience
5 requirements for a Level B. I would
6 interpret it to be that. Anyone else have
7 any comments on it? Terrence, you got
8 anything?

9 MR. STEWART:

10 No.

11 MR. BARBER:

12 If y'all think that meets the
13 requirements for a Transfer Station, I'm
14 good with it. I'll offer a motion to
15 grant it.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Do I have a motion?

18 MR. BARBER:

19 I offer a motion.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 Moved by Mr. Stewart. Second by
22 Mr. Barber. Any other discussion? Any
23 objection?

24 Motion carries.

25 All right. Next we have Damian L.

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Patterson, Tangipahoa Parish Government,
Landfill, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion to grant it.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Barber, seconded by
Mr. Mize. Any other discussion? Any
objection?

Motion carried.

All right. Next we have Jason D.
Seals, Tangipahoa Parish Government,
Landfill, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion to grant it.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Barber, second by
Mr. Mize. Any other discussion? Any
objection?

Motion carried.

Next we have Shelby Shane Stokes for
a Landfill, Level B, Tangipahoa Parish
Government.

MR. MIZE:

So moved.

MR. LAGRANGE:

1 Moved by Mr. Mize. Seconded by
2 Mr. Barber. Any discussion? Any
3 objection?

4 Motion carries.

5 All right. Next we have Mr. Ronald
6 Roche or Roché for an Incinerator, Level
7 B, Stericycle in Reserve.

8 MR. MIZE:

9 Is he just asking for a conditional
10 in case he didn't pass the test? Because,
11 I mean, he's been there since 2008. I was
12 just --

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 No, he's not asking for a
15 conditional.

16 MR. FOURRIER:

17 I think they just go --

18 MR. MIZE:

19 They just check everything?

20 MR. FOURRIER:

21 Yeah.

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 Yeah.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Yeah.

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MR. STEWART:

Suzanne, was that one of our guys
this morning at testing?

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. MIZE:

Did he pass the test?

MS. BORDELON:

Yes, he did.

MR. FOURRIER:

Has he got experience?

MR. LAGRANGE:

His attachment shows he's definitely
got the experience.

MR. FOURRIER:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Mize, seconded by
Mr. Stewart. Any other discussion? Any
objection?

Motion carried.

Next, Curtis L. Walker, Stericycle,
for Incinerator, Waste Handling facility,
Level B.

MR. BARBER:

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I'll offer a motion to grant it.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Barber. Seconded by
Mr. Mize. Any discussion? Any objection?
Motion carried.

Mr. John Walker, Tangipahoa Parish,
Landfill, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

I'll offer a motion to grant it.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Barber. Seconded by
Mr. Mollere. Any discussion? Any
objection?

Motion carried.

We have Mr. Willie Walker, Jr. for
Incinerator, Waste Handling, Level B,
Stericycle.

MR. BARBER:

Looks like he'll have his experience
in on 8/22; is that correct?

MS. BORDELON:

Correct.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right.

MR. BARBER:

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I offer a motion to grant it, and that would be upon completing his experience.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Seconded by -- motion by Mr. Barber seconded by Mr. Stewart. Any discussion? Any objection?

Motion carries.

Next we have Mr. Timothy Ware, Veolia Water North America, for Incinerator Waste Handling Facility, Level A.

MR. BARBER:

He doesn't meet the requirements. And he -- I talked to this guy by e-mail, and Suzanne you can help me out when this, he says that they have two other certified operators on-site. He named them as being Stephen Shulin and Ann Wilson.

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BARBER:

So they do have solid waste operators license?

MS. BORDELON:

Yes, they do.

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MR. BARBER:

And is it -- it's not required for a wastewater treatment facility to have a solid waste operator on site is it?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, I think they're doing some --

MR. FOURRIER:

They incinerate their sludge.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah. That's what it looks like. They're incinerating their sludge or doing something with it.

MR. BARBER:

Yeah. It -- and in talking to him he says that it was a -- and I don't know these terms, because I'm not familiar with incinerators, but they have a fluidized bed incinerator. Some of you guys may know what that is.

MR. LAGRANGE:

What is that, Jon?

MR. FOURRIER:

I don't want to bore y'all.

MR. BARBER:

Okay.

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MR. WILLIAMS:

In layman's terms.

MR. BARBER:

Is it -- is the requirement the same to have a certified operator for that type of incinerator as a regular incinerator?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, evidently DEQ is requiring them to have a permit. And so they are licensed operators they have a permit from DEQ under this permit category. So it requires them to have licensed operators.

MR. BARBER:

When -- and I asked that question when I talked to him, and, apparently, he represents a contractor that operates the facility. He's only been at this facility three and half months, and his comment to me when I questioned him about experience with an incinerator, his comment to me was my experience with incinerators is limited to this site, so three and half months is the experience he has with an incinerator.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Any other comments or questions?

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MR. BARBER:

And let me just make one -- let me just read one other thing that he commented here. He said there is another operator on-site with a license but it was suggested that I get one as well. So, it wasn't required and he doesn't meet the experience requirements.

MR. FOURRIER:

Well, he's got an engineering degree, so he needs two years of experience.

MR. BARBER:

But he still needs two years of experience, correct?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. Yeah, with an engineering degree you still need two years solid waste experience.

MR. FOURRIER:

I mean, he managed a wastewater treatment facility for four years, but was your concern that it didn't have an incinerator at the old plant?

MR. BARBER:

Right. There was not an incinerator

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at that facility.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. It had biosolids, it says.

MR. FOURRIER:

And a heat drying process.

MR. LAGRANGE:

It was converted to a Class A. I don't know what that was.

MR. BARBER:

And he's specifically asking for a Level A Incinerator.

MR. STEWART:

Maybe we can table it until the next meeting and let Suzanne maybe get a little more information about his background? About the old facility, maybe.

MR. BARBER:

Did he test today, Suzanne?

MS. BORDELON:

He did.

MR. STEWART:

Yeah, he passed.

MR. BARBER:

And passed?

MS. BORDELON:

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Uh-huh (yes).

MS. PERKINS:

Could he be conditional?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Let's not take any action, get some more information on his experience at his previous facility, and then determine -- bring it up at the next meeting, and also inquire if the Board determines he does not meet the experience requirements at this times, would he want to be issued a conditional until such time as he got the experience.

MR. BARBER:

Do you need a motion to table it?

MR. LAGRANGE:

No, we just won't take any action on it.

MR. BARBER:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Thank you.

MR. MOLLERE:

That's the old Florida Avenue Incinerator site.

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MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. MOLLERE:

Yeah, by the closed landfill, the one that gave us trouble for so many years.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. And we have a last application for regular certification is Aaron Keith Clark, Waste Connections of Louisiana, White Oaks Landfill for a Landfill, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

Well, once again, it looks like he has some experience outside of the state of Louisiana.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah, Alabama.

MR. BARBER:

From '09 to 2012. And it looks like about eight months at this facility, but if we want to --

MR. LAGRANGE:

He needs the two years experience for a Level B.

MR. FOURRIER:

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The regs don't require it to be Louisiana.

MR. BARBER:

Not really, but normally if they're coming from another state we'd do it by reciprocity rather than -- he didn't ask for reciprocity.

MR. LAGRANGE:

He didn't -- he wasn't licensed in the other state. He wasn't certified.

MR. BARBER:

He wasn't licensed there, but he did get his experience there. I feel okay with it. I'm going to offer a motion to grant it.

MR. MOLLERE:

Mr. Chairman, I know that --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Moved by Mr. Barber, seconded by Mr. Mize. Any discussion?

MR. MOLLERE:

I know that a couple of our sister states have some good regulations. Arkansas, I think particularly, and recently Mississippi. Suzanne just sent

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them a packet of information because they are looking at restructuring some of their levels of certification. And when I talked to the director over there, he was concerned that our qualifications seem to be a whole lot more complicated and involved than theirs, so I think maybe we're bringing them up. I know Alabama has a certification program, but I don't know exactly what the extent is, so.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. We have a motion and a second. Any other discussion? Any objection?

Motion carries.

All right. That completes our review of applications for regular certification. Now we'll review our --

MR. MIZE:

Excuse me, I thought we have Mr. Becker.

MS. BORDELON:

That's an extension to the conditional.

MR. LAGRANGE:

That's next, Mr. Mize.

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MR. MIZE:

Sorry, sir.

MR. LAGRANGE:

We have review of requests for conditional certificate extensions. We have five of those to go over. I'll read the names, and we have Robert Becker Louisiana State Penitentiary for Incinerator, Level A; we have Linda Jones for a conditional C & D, Level B, Natchitoches Parish Police Jury; we have Ken Mudd for a construction and demolition debris, Level A; Brandt Pedersen, Construction BP Disposal, LLC; we have Erik Pederson, Brandt Pedersen Construction BP Disposal for a construction and demolition, Level A; we have Daria Ransome, Gator Environmental Waste Solutions for a Separation Facility, Level A.

Do I have a motion to extend those conditionals?

MR. BARBER:

So moved.

MR. LAGRANGE:

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Moved by Mr. Barber. Seconded by
Mr. Stewart. Any other discussion? Any
objection?

Motion carries.

All right. Next, review of requests
for --

MS. BORDELON:

I don't know why that's on there.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. So we're skipping that.
Review of applications for
recertification. And these are the
individuals who have met all of the
recertification requirements, including
their continuing education requirements.
Alan D. Auger, Landfill, Level A, West
Carroll Parish Landfill; Douglas Bagwell,
C & D, Level A, Lincoln Parish Landfill;
Paul L. Bouchereau, Landfill, Level A,
Woodside Landfill; Jody Chenier, Landfill,
Level A, St. James Parish Landfill; Muriel
M. Chrisley, Landfill, Level A, Woolworth
Road Southwest Landfill; Johnna N. Cortes,
Landfill, Level A, Reliable Landfill;
Isaiah S. Dufrene, C & D, Level B, KV

1 Landfill; Paul B. Marks, Landfill, Level A
2 and C & D, Level A, Little Dixie Landfill;
3 Kerry B. Outley, C & D, Level A, Lincoln
4 Parish Landfill; Stephen J. Shulin,
5 Incinerator, Level A, Veolia Water
6 Wastewater Treatment Plant; and Joseph S.
7 Williams, Jr., C & D, Level A, Iberia
8 Parish Landfill.

9 Do we have a motion to issue
10 recertification?

11 Moved Mr. Mollere, seconded by
12 Mr. Williams. Any other discussion? Any
13 objection?

14 Motion carried.

15 MR. MOLLERE:

16 Mr. Chairman, and I don't know that I
17 caught all of them, but when we were going
18 through all of the applications, we
19 started approving some and then we were
20 skipping some, so we may want to go back
21 and make a motion to cover all of them
22 just in case.

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 On the regular certifications --

25 MR. MOLLERE:

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Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- you're referring to?

MR. MOLLERE:

Right. I think we were -- we skipped around a little, we started -- normally we read them all and then approve them.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, we took them one by one. The only ones we took out of order was the three that we --

MR. FOURRIER:

Jevcon.

MS. BORDELON:

Jevcon.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Jevcon.

MR. MOLLERE:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

But everything else, I think we covered everyone, because I was --

MR. MOLLERE:

Okay. I was trying to check them as we went.

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MR. LAGRANGE:

Yes, sir. I did.

MR. MOLLERE:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Suzanne was watching my -- over me,
so, right?

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. Next we --

MS. BORDELON:

And the two that we're waiting until
August to issue.

MR. MOLLERE:

All right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Next we also have two incomplete
applications for recertification. Patrick
A. Roth, C & D, Level A, Gentilly Landfill
and Edquado Howard, C & D, Level A,
Jackson Parish Landfill. They currently
each have only 30 hours continuing
education. It is my understanding
they're -- do we know if they're at this

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workshop?

MS. BORDELON:

They're either attending this one or the next one.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

So we don't know.

MR. BARBER:

Are their applications --

MS. BORDELON:

No, but, I mean, they can apply for recertification within six months.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So we can approve it subject to confirmation --

MR. BARBER:

So, they're not in danger of expiring?

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MS. BORDELON:

No, no.

MR. BARBER:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, I'll entertain a motion to approve them conditional on them attending and obtaining their 40 -- their final ten hours.

MR. MOLLERE:

So moved.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Second by -- motion by Mr. Mollere, second by Mr. Barber. Any other discussion? Any objections?

Motion carried.

Okay. Thank you.

All right. Now, Ms. Bordelon will read the list of names for issuance of operator certificates.

MS. BORDELON:

Okay, we have --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Regular certificates.

MS. BORDELON:

1 We have Ronald J. Edwards whose
2 application was approved at a previous
3 meeting. He retested today and passed.
4 Landfill, Level B. We have Terrilyn S.
5 Griffin who we will issue on August 18,
6 C & D, Level B. Bruce Johnson,
7 Incinerator, Level B. Marion R. Jones,
8 Jr., Transfer Station, Level B. Damian L.
9 Patterson, Landfill, Level B. Jason D.
10 Seals, Landfill, Level B. Shelby Stokes,
11 Landfill, Level B. Ronald Roché,
12 Incinerator, Level B. Curtis Walker,
13 Incinerator, Level B. John D. Walker,
14 Landfill, Level B. Willie D. Walker,
15 Incinerator, Level B, we'll issue
16 August 22nd. And Aaron Clark, Landfill,
17 Level B.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Okay. Do I have a motion to issue
20 certification?

21 Moved by Mr. Barber. Seconded by
22 Ms. Perkins. Any objection? Any other
23 discussion?

24 Motion carries.

25 Okay. Thank you. Next, we'll move

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to the committee reports.

Awards committee, Mr. Mize?

MR. MIZE:

Nothing to report.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Mize, I noticed in the minutes we had discussed maybe announcing -- asking the LSWA to announce at their workshops to remind the operators to participate in nominating folks for the Level B and Level A awards. And so maybe we can remember to do that at this workshop. And we also talked about, maybe, sending something out right now, either a reminder to folks or send out the first phase of notifications that we will be receiving nominations. So, if you wouldn't mind, maybe could you coordinate with Ms. Suzanne, maybe y'all look at having something done --

MR. MIZE:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- between now and maybe next meeting? All right. Thank you.

Testing, Mr. Mollere?

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MR. MOLLERE:

We had 12 test and 12 passed.

MR. WILLIAMS:

We must be doing something right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

There you go.

MR. MOLLERE:

Either that or we need to rewrite the test.

MS. BORDELON:

No.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. Continuing education, I'll ask Mr. Mollere, you want to -- in Mr. Berthelot's absence, would you like to comment on continuing education?

MR. MOLLERE:

No report.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. Mr. Williams, would you have anything to comment on continuing education?

MR. WILLIAMS:

On continuing education?

MR. LAGRANGE:

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Yeah.

MR. WILLIAMS:

No, sir.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. Next, nominating committee,
Mr. Williams?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Okay. We have two Board members
coming off, this is their last meeting.
They have served and completed -- well,
they will complete their second term in
October prior to the next meeting. That
is our illustrious chairman, Mr. Lagrange,
and also Mr. Mollere --

MR. MOLLERE:

Vice Chair.

MR. WILLIAMS:

-- vice Chairman. So, we're losing
some valuable experience on the board.
It's my understanding that a replacement
is in the works for Mr. Mollere. A letter
has been sent and they're waiting for
signatures, so until that happens I won't
divulging any names. Mr. Dartez is being
contacted in reference to a replacement

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for --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Police Jury Association.

MR. WILLIAMS:

-- the Police Jury Association.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. You -- a letter was sent to him, you said?

MS. BORDELON:

It sent it yesterday, yes.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah. The letters were sent --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Oh, the letter was sent yesterday?

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. WILLIAMS:

Okay. All right. So, we will wait for that. And, also, next year in October we'll have two people completing their second term, James Berthelot, who is not here today and also Denny Mize. So, that's what we'll have.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Berthelot's Police Jury

1 Association and Mr. Mize is private
2 industry.

3 MR. WILLIAMS:

4 Solid waste disposal industry, yeah.

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 Yeah. All right. So, I trust you
7 will stay on top of that?

8 MR. WILLIAMS:

9 Yes, sir. As a matter of fact, I was
10 going to amend the agenda to try to do an
11 election, but I think I'll just wait until
12 October --

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Okay.

15 MR. WILLIAMS:

16 -- and do it at the -- when we have
17 our new -- hopefully we will have two new
18 Board members at that time.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 All right.

21 MR. WILLIAMS:

22 If anyone wants to know what their
23 expiration dates are, just contact me and
24 I'll let you know. We also want to
25 welcome an old-timer back to the Board,

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Mr. Troy Barber. Troy, welcome back.

MR. BARBER:

Thank you. Glad to be back.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Troy, your term expires in October.

MR. LAGRANGE:

This October?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Of 2016.

MR. MOLLERE:

That was good, Fred. You missed the look.

MS. BORDELON:

I guess I should have looked, but are all of your certificates current?

MR. BARBER:

'14, I believe, is when they expire.

MS. BORDELON:

Okay. Okay.

MR. BARBER:

October.

MS. BORDELON:

So we don't need to do anything with you. Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

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All right. That concludes your report?

MR. WILLIAMS:

That concludes my report.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay. Thank you.

MR. BARBER:

Can I ask a question right here? And, Bo, we hate to see you go, and you've been a great president and chairman of this Board.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Who told you that?

MR. BARBER:

Well, I was here before. And we really appreciate you. And, being he's going to be going off before the next meeting, I assume we do have a co-chair or -- that would take that position, and that is the month for officer election, isn't it?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Uh-huh (yes). Yes.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And actually my term expires

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October 7th.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, I'll still be on the Board until that time.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And -- but I won't -- it'll expire before the next scheduled board meeting.

MR. BARBER:

Right.

MS. BORDELON:

So who will Chair the meeting? Who will start off Chairing the meeting since both Chair and Vice Chair --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, normally in those situations, just amongst yourselves you will get someone to open the meeting and then have the election of officers and then whoever's elected Chairman will take over from there.

MR. BARBER:

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Who is the co-chair?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Vice Chair.

MR. WILLIAMS:

He's going off, too.

MR. BARBER:

Oh, you're going out -- we're losing both of them.

MR. LAGRANGE:

But normally -- and in our Parish Council, we have those situations where we may have that kind of thing and they just get together and say, okay, well, you -- whoever -- open the meeting, call the meeting to order, open it up, conduct the order of business to have elections, once you elect a chairman then they'll take over from there.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Now, Mr. Chairman, if I need to, I can make a motion to amend the agenda and have an election. I have some names that I've been offered for nominations. So, if y'all would like to do that now. Otherwise, we can just wait until October.

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MR. MOLLERE:

I move we amend the agenda and let you offer the names.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. So, I have a motion to expand the agenda to conduct an election of officers pending the expiration of the Chairman and Vice Chairman's terms. Do I have a second to that expansion?

Seconded by Mr. Stewart. Do I have any objections to expansion of the agenda?

Hearing none, the motion carries.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Okay. Mr. Chairman, with that in mind, I have the names of Terrence Stewart.

MR. LAGRANGE:

You make a motion to nominate?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yes.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Terrence Stewart --

MR. LAGRANGE:

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Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

-- Chairman. And I'll just do both of them at the same time -- Jonathan Fourrier as Vice Chairman.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right.

MR. MOLLERE:

Two newbies.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Is there any other nominations? Any objections to elect Mr. Terrence Stewart Chairman and Mr. John Fourrier, Vice Chairman by acclamation?

MR. MOLLERE:

So moved.

MR. LAGRANGE:

No, any objections.

Hearing none, motion carries.

Congratulations, Terrence, congratulations Jon.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Congratulations.

MR. MOLLERE:

Now, as our previous Chairman has

1 done, you're going to have that big
2 Christmas luncheon, right?

3 MR. WILLIAMS:

4 Does that mean we have to go to
5 Tangipahoa Parish for the December
6 meeting?

7 MR. BARBER:

8 That would be great for me.

9 MR. MOLLERE:

10 His look was almost the same as
11 Troy's look.

12 MR. STEWART:

13 Maybe one of our neighboring parishes
14 would host our lunch.

15 MS. PERKINS:

16 I work for a municipality.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Okay. Any other business to come
19 before the Board?

20 Hearing none, any public comments?

21 I do have two comments. First, I
22 want to reiterate what Fred said, and
23 welcome Troy back on the Board. We
24 appreciate your desire to serve and your
25 enthusiasm in making sure that this Board

1 maintains its integrity relative to
2 carrying out the principles of the rules
3 and regulations. So, welcome back to
4 Troy.

5 MR. BARBER:

6 Think you.

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 And, lastly, I'd like to also thank
9 Mr. Mollere for his service. It has been
10 a pleasure serving with you. And,
11 personally, it's been a pleasure for me to
12 serve on this Board with you the last six
13 years. And as your Chairman I appreciate
14 the confidence and your support that
15 you've given me over the years. So,
16 thanks again and it's been a pleasure.

17 Do I have a motion to adjourn?

18 MR. WILLIAMS:

19 So moved.

20 MR. BARBER:

21 So moved.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Moved by Mr. Williams, seconded by
24 Mr. Barber.

25 Meeting is adjourned.

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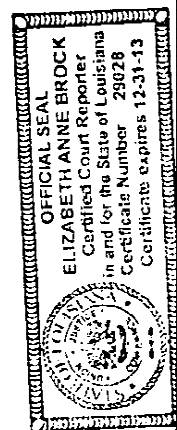
