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1 WHEREUPON,

2 CHAIRMAN STEWART: With that being said, we'll  
3 go ahead and get started with the meeting.

4 We'll call to order the Board of  
5 Certification and Training for Solid Waste Management  
6 Operators on this day of October 22, 2013.

7 Can we get a roll call, please.

8 MS. BORDELON: James Berthelot?

9 MR. BERTHELOT: Present.

10 MS. BORDELON: Troy Barber?

11 MR. BARBER: Yes.

12 MR. BONVILLAIN: Jonathan Fourrier?

13 MR. FOURRIER: Present.

14 MS. BORDELON: Fred Williams?

15 MR. WILLIAMS: Here.

16 MS. BORDELON: Gary Bonvillain?

17 MR. BONVILLAIN: Here.

18 MS. BORDELON: Denny Mize?

19 MR. MIZE: Present.

20 MS. BORDELON: Krystal Perkins?

21 MS. PERKINS: Present.

22 MS. BORDELON: Bubba Wynn?

23 MR. WYNN: Here.

24 MS. BORDELON: Terrace Stewart?

25 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Present.

1 MS. BORDELON: Sam Phillips?

2 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. The next item on the  
3 agenda is the reviewing of the July 16, 2013, minutes.

4 Any comments or changes?

5 If we have none, can I get a motion?

6 MR. BARBER: Mr. Chairman, I don't have any  
7 comments on the context of the minutes, but was I the only  
8 one that had a problem reading those things?

9 And I think it's -- the problem is not the  
10 court reporter's fault. I think it's probably our fault  
11 for talking over one another. Lots of sentences that were  
12 not finished, and you are trying to figure out what did  
13 this guy -- what was he really going to say when it picked  
14 up somewhere else and someone else started.

15 So I would just like to say at this time if  
16 we could all -- and I'm probably as guilty as anybody  
17 sitting at this table of doing this, but if we could  
18 all -- if we could all let the Chairman recognize each of  
19 us before we talk, I think it will be a lot more -- a lot  
20 easier to decipher these minutes because if an outsider  
21 was reading that thing, they wouldn't have been able to  
22 tell anything about it. It was just -- it was jumbled up.

23 CHAIRMAN STEWART: I agree. It was a catalog.  
24 Just like to read. But with that being said, can I get a  
25 motion to accept the minutes of July --

1 MR. WILLIAMS: (Inaudible.)

2 MR. BARBER: Second.

3 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. We have a motion by  
4 Mr. Williams, second by Mr. Barber.

5 Any objections?

6 Any discussions?

7 Motion carries.

8 I probably did that backwards, but work  
9 with me.

10 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You are learning.

11 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. The next item before  
12 we go into the Consideration of Operator Certifications.  
13 I would like to recognize a couple of old new faces that  
14 have come back to the board.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Old new faces?

16 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Mr. Gary Bonvillain, who is  
17 probably considered to be one of the godfathers of the  
18 regs and John "Bubba" Wynn. I want to welcome you guys  
19 back and I look forward to working with you.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Us too. Good to be here.

21 CHAIRMAN STEWART: And also, this is my first  
22 day as the Chair, and I look forward to gaining a lot of  
23 wisdom from you guys. And, like Troy stated, hopefully,  
24 we can work through this and you guys try to be patient  
25 with me as I learn my way through this.

1                   That being said, the next item is the  
2 Consideration of Operator Certifications.

3                   I will call the names and the levels of  
4 certification being applied for. If there's any question  
5 or comments, speak up as we go through.

6                   Okay. The first name is Tyrone B. Burns,  
7 Landfill, Level B, White Oaks Landfill.

8                   MR. BARBER: I'll offer a motion to approve.

9                   CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Motion by Mr. Barber.

10                  MR. WYNN: I'll second that on all of them after  
11 we do all of them.

12                  MS. BORDELON: Yes. Let's go through all of  
13 them first and then offer them at the end --

14                  CHAIRMAN STEWART: Yes. Let's just get them --

15                  UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: But some of them I'm not  
16 going to be in favor of approving, though.

17                  UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Well, that's fine. We'll  
18 note that as it goes through.

19                  CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay.

20                  UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: We can deny as we go  
21 through.

22                  CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. All right. Well,  
23 that's what we'll do. We'll entertain, and if there's an  
24 issue, we can make our motion and our votes right there.

25                  All right. Gordon J. Doerle, C & D, Level

1 A, Gordon's Landfill.

2 MR. WYNN: Can I ask, is he applying for a B  
3 Level?

4 MS. BORDELON: Actually, no. He asked for a B  
5 but then it was changed to an A. He is the owner.

6 MR. WYNN: Right.

7 MS. BORDELON: So I suggested that he change his  
8 level to an A.

9 MR. WYNN: Okay. And he did --

10 MS. BORDELON: He took the A test today --

11 MR. FOURRIER: He was previously certified as an  
12 A?

13 MS. BORDELON: He was previously certified as an  
14 A.

15 MR. FOURRIER: But he has two years of  
16 experience?

17 MR. BONVILLAIN: I think that's where he's at  
18 now. I know he had a C & D site for a lot longer than --

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah. He -- look at the  
20 next --

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Got a transfer --

22 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Yes. I looked at his  
23 experience, and he goes way back.

24 MR. BONVILLAIN: He's -- he's operated Gordon's  
25 Landfill, a C & D Landfill in New Iberia, for years as the



1 owner/operator. And then that particular site was shut  
2 down, but he took over another site where he is at  
3 presently.

4 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Anymore discussion on  
5 that one?

6 Steven Gay, Landfill, Level B, Woodside  
7 Landfill.

8 Michael R. Head, Landfill, Level B,  
9 Woolworth Road Landfill.

10 Callan T. Jacob, Incinerator, Level A,  
11 Stericycle, Inc.

12 Ricky Lambert, C & D --

13 MR. BONVILLAIN: Let's go back to Callan.

14 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay.

15 MR. BONVILLAIN: Or Jacob, Callan.

16 Again, we're getting on this incinerator  
17 thing. Okay. In order for (inaudible) in the same  
18 category as the incinerator.

19 MR. FOURRIER: (Inaudible) sterilization --

20 MR. BONVILLAIN: Right.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: But it's a type 2A  
22 facility.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yes. Type 2A facility.

24 And we have the classified as Incinerator, waste handling,  
25 so now I think he's okay for what they do.

1                   CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. So you're fine with  
2 it? Okay.

3                   Ricky Lambert, C & D, Level B,  
4 B.P. Disposal, LLC.

5                   Linda (sic) Segura, C & D, Level B,  
6 Gordon's Landfill.

7                   MS. BORDELON: Correction. That's Lindsay.

8                   CHAIRMAN STEWART: Lindsay. I'm sorry. Lindsay  
9 Segura, C & D, Level B, Gordon's Landfill.

10                  And Timothy Ware, Incinerator, Level A,  
11 Veolia Water.

12                  MR. WYNN: That is one I've got a question about  
13 because, actually, as far as the Incinerator, he has no  
14 experience. He is just now starting with the Incinerator  
15 program they have. He's got a lot of -- lot of water  
16 background, but he has no Incinerator experience.

17                  CHAIRMAN STEWART: I think one of the other  
18 questions too was what all -- what exactly does this  
19 facility -- what all -- I think I heard Troy asking that  
20 question, what all does this facility do?

21                  MR. BARBER: Well, in this -- predominantly a  
22 waste water treatment facility, and they do have an  
23 incinerator there, and for Bubba and Gary, this guy was  
24 brought up at the last meeting, and it was tabled. And  
25 this is his explanation that you see on the -- on the

1 front here.

2 MR. WYNN: I did -- I did see all -- I mean, as  
3 far as his education, it's fine, but still, yeah, there's  
4 no experience.

5 MR. BARBER: Right, and I agree with Bubba 100  
6 percent. I don't think he meets the requirements, so I'm  
7 going to offer a motion to deny.

8 MR. WYNN: Well, there is one thing, and I don't  
9 know if they have to have an A level to operate this  
10 incinerator right now. And this would be one of the  
11 situations where a conditional would be applicable by  
12 giving him a year's experience, give him a conditional A,  
13 and at the end of a year's experience, then let him --

14 MR. BARBER: They actually have an A and a B at  
15 the facility already.

16 MR. WYNN: Well, if they have that, I wouldn't  
17 give it.

18 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. So can I --

19 MR. WYNN: I would say you just give him -- tell  
20 him he needs at least another year's experience operating  
21 or working in a facility.

22 MR. BARBER: Well, with his engineering degree,  
23 and correct me if I'm wrong, I might have to look back at  
24 the regs, but one year with the engineering degree; is  
25 that right?

1 MR. WYNN: Two for an A.

2 MR. FOURRIER: Two for an A --

3 MR. BARBER: So he's been -- he's been there  
4 since April.

5 MR. WYNN: Right. So he needs one more year  
6 after April.

7 MR. BARBER: Yeah.

8 MR. WYNN: So a year and whatever.

9 CHAIRMAN STEWART: So do I hear a motion at this  
10 time to deny his application?

11 MR. BARBER: I so move.

12 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Motion by Mr. Barber.

13 Do I get a second?

14 MR. WYNN: I second.

15 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Second by Mr. Wynn.

16 All in favor?

17 ALL: Aye.

18 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

19 Motion carries.

20 Next on the agenda.

21 MS. BORDELON: Wait. Now, let's go back and  
22 approve all --

23 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. You are right. I'm  
24 jumping the gun.

25 Okay. All the applications that we did

1 review, and no one had any objections --

2 MR. BONVILLAIN: Well, just point of order on  
3 Lindsay Segura.

4 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Uh-huh.

5 MR. BONVILLAIN: She doesn't have the two years  
6 yet, but she will have two years in November.

7 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. So do we want to make  
8 a --

9 MR. BONVILLAIN: I'd offer that we make a motion  
10 to accept hers pending completion of her two years.

11 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Motion by  
12 Mr. Bonvillain, second by Mr. Barber.

13 All in favor?

14 ALL: Aye.

15 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

16 And there again, guys, I kind of think that  
17 the aye and the nay works a lot better. That way, there's  
18 a clear understanding on where everybody stands.

19 MR. BARBER: And you need a motion to accept the  
20 rest of them?

21 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Yes.

22 MS. BORDELON: Yes.

23 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Yeah. I need a motion to  
24 accept the rest of the applications that we reviewed.

25 MR. BARBER: So moved.

1 MR. BONVILLAIN: Second.

2 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Moved by Mr. -- motion by  
3 Mr. Barber, second by Mr. Bonvillain.

4 All in favor?

5 ALL: Aye.

6 CHAIRMAN STEWART: And opposed?

7 Okay. Next on the agenda is Request for  
8 Conditional Certifications.

9 Kenneth C. Sanchez, C & D, Level B, Gator  
10 Environmental.

11 MR. BARBER: Hold on. Started in August.

12 CHAIRMAN STEWART: I guess the question here  
13 would be do they have anymore operators at that site?

14 MR. BONVILLAIN: Well, he -- now, he's got some  
15 supervisor and construction experience here.

16 MR. BARBER: He still needs one year's of B and  
17 two years of construction.

18 MS. BORDELON: Well, this is a  
19 conditional -- this is a conditional, so he actually  
20 doesn't need any experience.

21 MR. BONVILLAIN: Well, and my question is, I  
22 think he's got the right experience, but the construction  
23 experience, that's all --

24 MR. WYNN: You talking about the civil  
25 construction, Gary?

1 MR. BONVILLAIN: Yeah.

2 MR. WYNN: Well, also, the chemical plant --

3 MR. BONVILLAIN: I was thinking he had a year  
4 of -- at the facility, that he doesn't.

5 CHAIRMAN STEWART: But he definitely has the  
6 construction --

7 MR. BARBER: Well, and not only the construction  
8 but a supervisor in construction, apparently, according  
9 to --

10 MR. BONVILLAIN: But he does not have his two  
11 years or one year in the industry.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Correct.

13 MR. BONVILLAIN: So that's why he's asking for a  
14 conditional.

15 MR. WYNN: Yeah. I think that's a good one.

16 MR. BONVILLAIN: Susanne, do you know what the  
17 facility's situation is with regard to certified  
18 operators?

19 MS. BORDELON: No. They have -- that's the one  
20 with Rodney -- isn't it Rodney --

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah.

22 MS. BORDELON: Why can't I think of his last  
23 name?

24 MR. WYNN: If I looked at my phone, I could tell  
25 you.

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Daigle.

2 MS. BORDELON: Daigle.

3 Rodney Daigle and Daria. Rodney is an A  
4 and Daria is -- Daria has a B and is probably close to  
5 getting her A, so they have a couple of operators there.

6 MR. WYNN: The one thing that I do know about  
7 the facility, Daria, she's the B level, and she works in  
8 the scale house and there's not -- unless Rodney is out  
9 on-site and which he's not there a whole lot, there's not  
10 a B level in the field area, in the working (inaudible)  
11 and that's -- I could see why they would want a B level.

12 MR. BONVILLAIN: Based on his experience that he  
13 has in construction and everything else, I will make a  
14 motion to approve a conditional.

15 MR. MIZE: Second.

16 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Motion by Mr. Bonvillain,  
17 second by Mr. Mize.

18 All in favor.

19 ALL: Aye.

20 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

21 Motion carries.

22 Edward Braxton, C & D, Level B,  
23 Natchidoches (sic) Parish Solid Waste.

24 MS. BORDELON: What?

25 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Natchitoches. Natchitoches.



1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You're over in Texas.

2 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Well, I have been calling it  
3 "Natchidoches" -- well, I have been calling it  
4 "Natchidoches."

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You in Texas, man, we in  
6 Louisiana.

7 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. The information we  
8 have on it is conditional issued in December of 2012,  
9 expired in June of 2013. He's requesting another  
10 conditional. Will test and attend workshop on 10/22/13.  
11 Actually, this workshop.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Did he do that?

13 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Is he here?

14 MS. BORDELON: He did test today, but he did not  
15 pass.

16 MR. WYNN: So he would still have to have  
17 another conditional in order to --

18 MS. BORDELON: Well, the stipulations for an  
19 extension for a conditional were that he attend a workshop  
20 and pass the test.

21 MR. WYNN: Within six months.

22 MS. BORDELON: Within six months.

23 Now, he didn't even do that within those  
24 six months. It's past that six months. So he is  
25 actually -- he was just actually asking for another

1 conditional.

2 MR. WYNN: I don't think so.

3 MR. BONVILLAIN: Since he did not take the exam  
4 and pass it as required on a regular conditional, I'll  
5 move that we deny it.

6 MR. WILLIAMS: Second.

7 CHAIRMAN STEWART: I don't know where to find  
8 the second. I know who the motion is.

9 Mr. Bonvillain. Second by Mr. Williams.

10 All in favor?

11 ALL: Aye.

12 MR. WILLIAMS: Any opposed?

13 The motion carries.

14 Sandy Callahan, C & D, Level B, Greenpoint,  
15 Inc. Information is they will test in March of 2014.

16 MR. BARBER: This one is very similar to  
17 the -- one of the other ones we looked at.

18 Based on the experience in the construction  
19 field, I think I would be a -- I would be in favor of  
20 granting a conditional, but in March when this one  
21 expires, I would suggest that he apply for a B based on  
22 915 B-1, little B, with the experience in the construction  
23 field. Well, rather than us just keep giving him  
24 conditionals.

25 MR. BONVILLAIN: Does he have a conditional

1 right now?

2 MS. BORDELON: No.

3 MR. BARBER: No.

4 MR. BONVILLAIN: Okay. Again, as far as the  
5 facility is concerned, what is the situation? Because  
6 reading the letter, all it says is that they are getting a  
7 lot more work and they want to have somebody else  
8 certified. Then indicate that they have a desperate need  
9 for having another certified operator.

10 And, again, I think this is one of these  
11 situations where -- why we're going to grant it.

12 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Maybe it's a situation where  
13 we can table it today and, you know, when the time comes  
14 we --

15 MR. WYNN: The thing about it is, in April, he  
16 is going to have a year's experience then. Why can't he  
17 just go ahead and take the test, like they just said, and  
18 at the next meeting and --

19 MR. BARBER: For regular certification.

20 MR. WYNN: Yeah. For regular certification.

21 He will lack -- he will lack one month of  
22 having a full year's experience, but we can give him the  
23 certification contingent on him finishing out a full year.

24 MR. BARBER: Correct.

25 CHAIRMAN STEWART: So in March -- in March.

1 MR. FOURRIER: In one year, the landfill, and  
2 two, with construction.

3 MR. BARBER: Yeah. When you look at his  
4 construction, he was with the mining company, which I will  
5 consider construction, heavy equipment, drainage -- good  
6 drainage practices, from 2001 to 2012, so this is 11 years  
7 of experience.

8 MR. BONVILLAIN: Okay. Except that the reg said  
9 supervisor of construction.

10 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Yeah. And that would be the  
11 question I would ask him, if he was in a supervisory  
12 position, and, if so, then we certainly could grant him a  
13 regular certification, if he passed the test, in March,  
14 pending his experience being --

15 MR. MIZE: He didn't put anything down for being  
16 supervision -- supervisor.

17 MR. BARBER: It doesn't -- no, it doesn't have  
18 it down there but --

19 MR. FOURRIER: Well, now, he started in April,  
20 and we just approved somebody who started in August. I  
21 think we need to be consistent.

22 MS. BORDELON: But I think the question -- I  
23 think the question, Jonathan, was whether or not this  
24 facility actually needed another certified operator where  
25 Bubba was saying the other one actually did need it. But

1 I seem to be saying --

2 MR. WYNN: And that would actually be about the  
3 same situation as what this is, isn't it, Susanne?

4 MS. BORDELON: I'm not sure how many operators  
5 exactly they have at Greenpoint.

6 MR. BONVILLAIN: Just -- just reading the cover  
7 letter, you know, they are saying they have a lot more  
8 work going on. That's the only reason, you know, to hire  
9 more people. There's no indication in the cover letter  
10 that they have a shortage of certified operators.

11 MR. BARBER: I agree.

12 MS. PERKINS: Is that option to table this until  
13 we get more information? Because I have to admit, we  
14 could do that because we'll meet again in the first week  
15 of -- usually, around the first, second week of December  
16 and still meet conditional at that point. It can be  
17 issued in December and then he can test -- he can apply  
18 for a regular in April, in March.

19 MR. WYNN: I can't even get my phone down.

20 MR. WILLIAMS: Mr. Chairman, what is the fine  
21 for phones going off in the meeting?

22 CHAIRMAN STEWART: \$500.

23 Okay. So do I get somebody willing to make  
24 a motion to table this to the next meeting, possibly the  
25 December meeting?

1 MR. MIZE: Motion.

2 MR. BARBER: Second.

3 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Motion by Mr. Mize, second by  
4 Mr. Barber.

5 All in favor?

6 ALL: Aye.

7 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

8 MS. BORDELON: And just so I understand, that's  
9 just to find out if -- how desperate they are for another  
10 certified operator. If not, then ask them to test in  
11 March and ask for a regular?

12 MR. BONVILLAIN: And you might also inquire as  
13 to whether any of the construction experience was in a  
14 supervisory position.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: She may get rid of it.

16 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Oh.

17 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. The next item is  
18 Request to Extend Conditional Certification.

19 Leslie A. Jennings, C & D, Level B,  
20 Harrelson Materials Management.

21 The information we have is that she tested  
22 and attended workshop in October, 2012. This is the  
23 second extension request.

24 MR. BARBER: Looks like this will be her third.

25 MS. BORDELON: Well, no. It's the second

1 extension request. This will be her third -- her third  
2 conditional. Second extension.

3 MR. WYNN: I don't have any background in saying  
4 what her work experience was on my --

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: How long has she been  
6 with Harrelson?

7 MS. BORDELON: Since the date that -- put on the  
8 date that she tested, which was -- was it January 2012?  
9 October? No. She was employed since June 2012.

10 MR. WYNN: Okay. What did she have before then?

11 MS. BORDELON: She's had a conditional since  
12 October of 2012.

13 MR. BONVILLAIN: So I assume that she has taken  
14 the exam and passed it?

15 MS. BORDELON: Yes.

16 MR. BONVILLAIN: And she had attended a training  
17 session?

18 MS. BORDELON: Yes.

19 MR. BONVILLAIN: I will move that we grant the  
20 additional -- the extension of the conditional.

21 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Motion by Mr. Bonvillain.

22 MR. MIZE: Second.

23 MR. WYNN: Are we extending this just because  
24 the board's experience --

25 MR. BONVILLAIN: I think, just as a matter of

1 procedure and policy, whatever, as long as they maintain  
2 their employment at that particular facility, we always  
3 granted the extension if they met all their requirements.

4 MS. BORDELON: We're extending it until she  
5 meets the two-year requirement for regular.

6 MR. WYNN: Okay. And which -- what time period  
7 would that be?

8 MS. BORDELON: It would be not until October  
9 of -- yeah. June of '14.

10 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. We have a motion by  
11 Mr. Bonvillain, second by Mr. Mize.

12 All in favor?

13 ALL: Aye.

14 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

15 Motion carries.

16 Request for Certification by Reciprocity.

17 Peter A. Kirk, Landfill, Level A, Republic  
18 Services.

19 MR. FOURRIER: Now, he has the experience that  
20 the reciprocity -- I don't know what it has done in the  
21 past, but it appears it needs to come from another state,  
22 another organization. I know the SWANA MOLO is very  
23 intense.

24 MR. WYNN: Yeah, but is this SWANA MOLO? That's  
25 just a certified manager landfill operation. That doesn't



1 means that's MOLO, does it?

2 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Yeah, yeah. The one in  
3 Mansfield --

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: The landfill operations.

5 MR. FOURRIER: But can you accept reciprocity  
6 from that? That's a training course, not a --

7 MR. BARBER: No. Yeah. We have in the past.

8 CHAIRMAN STEWART: We have?

9 MS. BORDELON: Yeah, we have.

10 MS. PERKINS: It is a really --

11 MR. BARBER: I can say -- I will say this. If a  
12 person can pass the MOLO exam, they'll breeze through our  
13 Level A.

14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I wouldn't bet on that.

15 CHAIRMAN STEWART: That's correct.

16 MR. MIZE: I took it. Passed it.

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: That's good, huh?

18 MR. WYNN: I will make a motion we accept the  
19 reciprocity.

20 MS. PERKINS: Second.

21 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Motion by Mr. Wynn,  
22 second by Miss Perkins.

23 All in favor?

24 ALL: Aye.

25 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

1 Motion carries.

2 Okay. Request for Approval of CEUs.

3 C. Blake Vincent, Colonial Landfill.

4 MR. MIZE: He does not work for Colonial  
5 Landfill anymore, just to let you know. I mean, I don't  
6 think it's going to make any difference, but he don't work  
7 for Colonial Landfill no more.

8 MR. BARBER: That's really immaterial.

9 MS. BORDELON: Shouldn't make a difference.

10 CHAIRMAN STEWART: He had what, 19? He picked  
11 up 19 training hours? We only require ten.

12 Am I correct?

13 MR. WYNN: I know you required more, he cannot  
14 afford it, four-year period.

15 MR. BARBER: He is actually asking us to match  
16 that. He says I'm requesting that be equivalent contact  
17 training hours be awarded.

18 I'm not in favor of giving him 19 hours for  
19 this, but I will -- I will go along with 10.

20 MR. BONVILLAIN: I would ask to give him 20,  
21 looking at it. The SWANA courses typically will be 15 to  
22 30 hours. I know in the past we have granted, as long as  
23 they provided us the proper documentation, we have granted  
24 credit for these classes, and I wouldn't have any problem  
25 whatsoever in granting him his 19-hour request.

1                   If you actually look at the hours, you  
2 could actually make a case for 20.

3                   MR. BARBER: Well, if I was him, I wouldn't want  
4 19, if I couldn't get 20. You are going to have one hour  
5 missing.

6                   MR. BONVILLAIN: And I went through and I looked  
7 at the hours and everything and, actually, you know, the  
8 way I looked at it, you can make 20 hours out of it.

9                   MR. BARBER: And I agree. I'm good with him.  
10 I'm good with --

11                   MR. BONVILLAIN: And I don't have a problem if  
12 somebody goes to one of these sessions and they have a  
13 20-hour block or a 30-hour block, giving them those hours.  
14 You know, it's a different perspective from what we do in  
15 state, and I think that's a good deal.

16                   CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. So what are the wishes  
17 of the board? He has 19.

18                   MR. BONVILLAIN: I will make the motion to  
19 approve 20 hours for him.

20                   MR. BERTHELOT: Second.

21                   CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Motion by  
22 Mr. Bonvillain, second by Mr. Berthelot.

23                               All in favor?

24                   ALL: Aye.

25                   CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

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Motion carries.

7 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Motion by Mr. Wynn, second by  
8 Mr. Barber.

9 All in favor?

10 ALL: Aye.

11 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

12 Next item is issuance of --

13 MS. BORDELON: Did you do -- did you do a --

14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No.

15 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. The incomplete  
16 certification applications, attending Marksville or  
17 Shreveport workshop to complete 40 hours.

18 Edquado Howard, C & D, Level A, Jackson  
19 Parish, C & D. He has 30 hours. Last ten hours will be  
20 received here in Shreveport.

21 MR. BONVILLAIN: I move that we approve it  
22 pending certification that he has attended the Shreveport  
23 session.

24 MR. WILLIAMS: Second.

25 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Motion made by

1 Mr. Bonvillain, second by Mr. Williams.

2 All in favor?

3 ALL: Aye.

4 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

5 We'll move on to the Issuance of Operators  
6 Certification.

7 Bordelon.

8 MS. BORDELON: We have Tyrone Burns, Landfill,  
9 Level B; Gordon Doerle, C & D, Level A; Steven Gay,  
10 Landfill, Level B; Michael Head, Landfill, Level B; Callan  
11 Jacob, Incinerator, Level A; Ricky Lambert, C & D, Level  
12 B; Lindsay Seguro, we are doing in November.

13 We already made a motion for Lindsay --  
14 correct? -- for November?

15 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Correct. Yes.

16 MS. BORDELON: Henry Turner, C & D, Level B;  
17 Chris Humphries, Landfill, Level B. He was the one whose  
18 application was approved months back. He just tested  
19 today.

20 That's all I have.

21 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. The next item is  
22 Committee Reports.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Did we make a motion to  
24 approve it?

25 MR. BERTHELOT: Motion.

1 MR. MIZE: Second.

2 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Slow down.

3 Motion by Mr. Berthelot, second by  
4 Mr. Mize.

5 All in favor?

6 ALL: Aye.

7 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

8 MR. BONVILLAIN: We'll keep you straight.

9 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Y'all can tell how fast I'm  
10 trying to get through this agenda, huh?

11 Okay. Now we move on to Committee Reports.  
12 Awards, Denny Mize.

13 MR. MIZE: Yes. Susanne is going to mail them  
14 out in December. E-mailing them out to everybody in  
15 December, and we will probably do it again in the middle  
16 of January.

17 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay.

18 MR. MIZE: Hopefully, we'll mail them out twice  
19 and hopefully y'all, somebody will bring it up in the  
20 meeting, a meeting y'all were having up here this week to  
21 remind everybody, please.

22 MS. BORDELON: Yeah. That's what we should have  
23 done, actually, for -- for this workshop today. I know we  
24 had talked about it before and I completely forgot about  
25 it. I was trying to get some nomination forms out at the

1 workshops, trying to get more participation in the awards  
2 program.

3 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Testing, Mr. Molair  
4 (phonetic) is off the board, so Mr. Bonvillain will  
5 replace Mr. Molair on the board.

6 Do we have any information on the testing,  
7 Mr. Bonvillain?

8 MR. BONVILLAIN: I think everybody -- everybody  
9 but one passed today.

10 MS. BORDELON: We had ten test and only one  
11 failed.

12 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Continuing education,  
13 Mr. Berthelot.

14 MR. BERTHELOT: We have our March meeting in  
15 Lafayette, March 19th, 20th, and 21st.

16 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Nominating,  
17 Mr. Williams.

18 MR. WILLIAMS: Yes, sir. My report was made for  
19 me by you earlier today. But we'd just like to welcome  
20 our two new board members, Gary Bonvillain and Bubba Wynn.

21 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Two old new faces.

22 MR. WILLIAMS: Two old old faces.

23 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Other business, before  
24 we go into setting a date for the December meeting, I  
25 think Miss Righteous with the LSWA board wants to address



1 the council -- LSWA matter.

2           Okay. If we can give the floor to  
3 Miss Righteous for a few minutes.

4           MS. RIGHTEOUS: As you all know, the Lafayette  
5 conference is scheduled for next March, actually,  
6 March 20th and March 21st. We actually switched up the  
7 tracks a little bit for next year's conference. We  
8 have -- still have five tracks. We have a solid waste  
9 track, an industrial/energy track, a regulatory compliance  
10 track, a USD track, a water and a waste water track, and  
11 we have been working very closely with Annex Star  
12 (phonetic), with the DEQ in an effort to garner a little  
13 bit more DEQ participation. And we're working with her  
14 and actually, as far as just regulatory compliance track,  
15 we are hoping that this will also serve as training for  
16 DEQ (inaudible) so we are hoping to have quite a few DEQ  
17 inspectors from all of the different regions of the state  
18 attend the conference to participate in this -- in this  
19 training. It's actually an EPA-sponsored training, so  
20 we're really excited about that aspect of the conference  
21 because we are hoping to see more DEQ faces.

22           As far as the continuing education units,  
23 we feel like we have met that requirement with the solid  
24 waste track, and as you can see, there's some overlap.  
25 There's also some solid waste related topics in some of

1 the other tracks, the water track as well as the  
2 regulatory compliance track, but as far as the ten hours,  
3 you can see that we have met that requirement with the  
4 solid waste track.

5 And you guys have a copy. If you have any  
6 questions, feel free, we can discuss those.

7 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Give everybody a little time  
8 to review it and I can get a motion, please.

9 MR. BERTHELOT: Approve.

10 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. Motion made by  
11 Mr. Berthelot.

12 MR. BONVILLAIN: Second.

13 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Second by Mr. Bonvillain.

14 All in favor?

15 ALL: AYE.

16 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Any opposed?

17 Motion carries.

18 MS. RIGHTEOUS: Okay. Great. Thank you.

19 CHAIRMAN STEWART: You have your agenda.

20 Okay. Moving on, set date for the December  
21 meeting.

22 Anybody have any ideas?

23 MR. WILLIAMS: Mr. Chairman, we are working on a  
24 couple of ideas about -- for the meeting. We are looking  
25 at some venues. We have got our good friend, Bo, who is

1 not on the board anymore, but is still offering, if we  
2 would like. I also know that Connie was looking at some  
3 other things as far as LSWA, and we were going to try to  
4 incorporate LSWA and the certification board meeting at  
5 the same time, and LSWA was going to provide the venue.

6 We are looking at two dates right now: One  
7 is December 6th, the other one is December 12th. And we  
8 are looking at New Orleans as opposed to Patterson. Those  
9 plans have not been finalized yet, so unless the board  
10 just wants to go ahead and try to set a date today and a  
11 location, we can notify the board once we have completed  
12 those arrangements.

13 MR. BONVILLAIN: And Mr. LaGrange is going to  
14 have to host us again?

15 MR. WILLIAMS: We can twist his arm.

16 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I thought the new  
17 chairman was going to host us over at --

18 CHAIRMAN STEWART: They said they don't want  
19 to --

20 MS. BORDELON: Vacation spot.

21 CHAIRMAN STEWART: They say they don't want  
22 to do Tangipahoa.

23 MR. WILLIAMS: Where is Tangipahoa? Nobody  
24 knows.

25 MR. WYNN: It's on the other side of --

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It is an exciting trip.

2 You need to --

3 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Mr. LaGrange, you got any  
4 comments?

5 MR. LAGRANGE: Not to go to Patterson and go to  
6 New Orleans.

7 MR. WILLIAMS: We also know that Bo could -- BO  
8 could host us on the 6th but not on the 12th.

9 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. So would you guys like  
10 to try to finalize something before we get out of here, or  
11 do we want to kind of play with this a little bit?

12 MR. BARBER: As far as I'm concerned, I say just  
13 let Fred finalize this and get with Susanne and notify all  
14 of us.

15 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. So we need a motion on  
16 that.

17 MR. WYNN: Make that --

18 MR. BONVILLAIN: No. We don't really need a  
19 motion on that. No.

20 CHAIRMAN STEWART: I don't want to miss no  
21 motions.

22 MR. BONVILLAIN: Executive order.

23 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. We don't want to miss  
24 no motions.

25 MR. BONVILLAIN: We're not going to let you.

1 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Okay. All right. Any public  
2 comments?

3 MR. BERTHELOT: Move adjourn.

4 CHAIRMAN STEWART: Mr. Berthelot seconded by the  
5 guys on that second down there.

6 That's it.

7 (The meeting was adjourned.)

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
