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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Meeting of the Board of Certification and Training for Solid Waste Management Operators will come to order. Meeting in Marksville, Louisiana, July 11, 2017, 1:15 PM.

Roll call, please, Ms. Bordelon.

MS. BORDELON:

Jason Creel?

MR. CREEL:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Troy Barber?

MR. BARBER:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Danny Hylton?

MR. HYLTON:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Mia Townsel?

MS. TOWNSEL:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Bo Lagrange?

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MR. LAGRANGE:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Jonathan Fourrier?

Fred Williams?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Lindsey Turtle?

MS. TURTLE:

Here.

MS. BORDELON:

Gary Bonvillain?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Here.

Okay. Review of the March 17th minutes. Ms. Bordelon had emailed them to everybody. Is there any corrections to those minutes?

MR. BARBER:

I offer a motion they be approved.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

A motion by Mr. Barber.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Second.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Second by Mr. Williams that the minutes of the March 17th meeting be approved. Any objection to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion is passed.

Consideration of operator certifications. Applications for certification. First up is Steve Benjamin, incinerator waste handling, Level A.

MR. BARBER:

This is the one that we tabled --

MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

MR. BARBER:

Does anybody see where there was a change in information he provided us? I mean, he looks like a wastewater guy. He doesn't look like what I would consider having experience in incinerator or any type of solid waste. He looks like wastewater.

MR. HYLTON:

I agree.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Well, under Veolia Water from 3/15/11 to the present, at the beginning of the shift inspect the incinerator for leaks, hotspots, make sure that all pumps and blowers are functional, check the pilot oil level, make adjustments to the belt presses needed, assist with repairs, record and log all related information.

I'm not sure what he had on the original one, but this one he's specifically referring to incinerator.

MR. HYLTON:

But it's incinerating water?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I'm not sure what he's incinerated.

MR. LAGRANGE:

No, he's incinerating sewer sludge.

MR. HYLTON:

Yeah, stuff like that. Liquids.

MS. TURTLE:

He did the incinerator work from '92 to 2001.

MR. BARBER:

Well --

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

So, I mean, from this, he's had experience with incinerators, and that was our question before, is that, you know, he had -- he worked with water and wastewater but it wasn't showing where he had experience with incinerators, but this he's breaking it down, and to me he's showing that he's got incinerator experience.

MR. BARBER:

So, you're talking about the one that says US Filters?

MS. TOWNSEL:

Yes.

MR. BARBER:

That's the part you're talking bout.

MS. TOWNSEL:

Yes. On the first page at the bottom.

MS. TURTLE:

Uh-huh (yes).

MS. TOWNSEL:

'92 to 2001.

MR. BARBER:

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Well, if -- I mean, if that qualifies as experience, then I'm good with it.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah. Well, our biggest question, I think, the last time was that -- what does he know about incinerators?

MR. BARBER:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BONVILLAIN:

You know, because there was nothing in his application to indicate he had any experience with incinerators. It all seemed to be geared towards water, but they're incinerating the sewer sludge.

MR. BARBER:

Okay.

MR. CREEL:

Yeah, that's what they're doing. Running it across the belt press, incinerating the solids and turning the water loose. The polymer --

MR. BARBER:

All right. I'm good.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

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Next, Brenda Coutee, C & D, Level A.

Next, Donald Dillard, Jr.,

Incinerator, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

This is -- there's some confusing stuff here.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

You too, huh?

MR. BARBER:

In the experience on page three, he claims to have been employed from 7/1 of 2005 --

MS. TURTLE:

There's no end date.

MR. HYLTON:

To something.

MR. WILLIAMS:

No end date.

MR. BARBER:

I'm assuming to present, but then if you look over on the next page, apparently he was employed somewhere else from the same period of time or part of the same period of time as a maintenance tech.

MS. TURTLE:

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Calumet. Uh-huh (yes).

MS. TOWNSEL:

Calumet.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Well, my confusion was that he said he worked at the Stericycle facility since 2005. That facility wasn't in operation for the last several years.

MR. CREEL:

It's only been --

MR. BARBER:

Exactly. I was going there too.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

So, I'm not sure what --

MR. BARBER:

Well, I think based on a couple of confusing, conflicting information on here, I'm just going to have to make a motion to deny this application until we can get some more information.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. We've got a motion from Mr. Barber.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Second.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Second by Mr. Williams that the application of Mr. Donald Dillard, Jr. be denied at this time until we receive further clarification concerning his experience.

MR. HYLTON:

And perhaps a more legible application? I can't read the dates, I don't know if y'all can.

MR. BARBER:

I agree.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MS. BORDELON:

Wait, you can't read what?

MR. HYLTON:

The dates.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

It's hard to read.

MS. BORDELON:

Is it?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah.

MS. BORDELON:

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Okay.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Particularly when we got down to the dates, there was -- they're using a small type and by the time they make copies and copies and copies, it gets hard to read.

Okay. Is there any objection to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Next we have Rachel Fox applying for a C & D, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

Does anybody here know who Rachel is?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Well, Bubba's at the meeting downstairs.

MR. BARBER:

Is this -- Southern Disposal Service, is that what's qualifying for experience?

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, he told me that she -- because I questioned him about her application, and he looked at it this morning and said she failed to put on there her employment

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prior to Southern Disposal, which would --
I think he said was with the City of
Monroe, maybe.

MR. BARBER:

In solid waste?

MS. BORDELON:

Yes. She has several years there.
And she is currently certified right now
as a --

MR. CREEL:

Level B.

MS. BORDELON:

-- Separation and landfill Level B.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah. She's got landfill Level B
already.

MR. BARBER:

And --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Now she's applying for the C & D,
Level B.

MR. BARBER:

Okay. I'm good. I didn't know that.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Well --

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MR. BARBER:

I guess I -- that was --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

And the application itself could have been done much better, but the fact that she does already have a Level B, she's been approved before, so.

Jonathan Faulk, Landfill, Level B.

Anthony Garrett, Landfill, Level B.

David Jones, Landfill, Level B.

Brandon Marcantel, Landfill, Level B.

Anybody have a problem with his experience?

MR. BARBER:

Well, I'm just picking this one up and looking at it. It looks like he's got basically a year, 13 months. And I can't see this --

MS. BORDELON:

Well, he's got the construction experience on the next page where he's -- as a supervisor, almost two years of that.

MS. TURTLE:

With heavy equipment.

MS. BORDELON:

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Yeah.

MR. BARBER:

Okay. So, he's supervisor, looks like, a couple of employees.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, they can use construction experience for a Level B but not for a Level A.

MS. BORDELON:

Correct.

MR. BARBER:

Right.

MS. TURTLE:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MR. BARBER:

So, with that in mind, with the --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. So -- that would be okay?

MR. BARBER:

-- 13, 14 months, I'm good.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

Next, Margie Randle, Transfer

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Station, Level B.

MR. BARBER:

I have a question or two. I mean, first of all, my biggest thing is her narrative here. Saying that I assisted -- I think that's supposed to be 'assisted' -- the supervisor with employee every day keeping streets clean and junk picked up on the side of the roads and streets.

MR. CREEL:

Checks for potholes.

MR. BARBER:

I also check the streets for potholes.

Does any of that have anything to do with solid waste?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Chairman, it's kind of confusing, because her position is Assistant Street Supervisor, she says she employs the Level A operator, Cheryl Mclayland. If you look at that --

MR. CREEL:

She supervises a Level A operator.

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MR. LAGRANGE:

And another thing, on type and class facility, someone put type III Transfer, it's a type II A facility. If you look right here at the type of facility. So, there's a lot of inconsistencies, it seems like, with this application.

MR. BARBER:

And it appears that she had attended two LSWA training in '16, the March and the July, and then LB -- is that LB OE or DE? -- that's on page two at the very top.

MS. TURTLE:

It looks like --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Looks like LBOE.

MS. TURTLE:

Yeah.

MR. BARBER:

LBOE. I don't know what that is. That was this year, in March. So, I mean, apparently has attended some training, but then I'm not seeing the experience that satisfies me that she's qualified for this position.

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MR. LAGRANGE:

Suzanne, was there any discussion with her about her experience or nothing about conditional or anything.

MS. BORDELON:

No. No. The only thing I know about her is she's come to every -- she's come to the last several classes, and thought she was registered to take the test and we had never received an application for until now.

MR. BARBER:

So, did she test today?

MS. BORDELON:

She tested today.

MR. BARBER:

And passed?

MS. BORDELON:

She did.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Well, what's your pleasure?

MR. BARBER:

I still have a problem with it, with the experience, unless she could provide us with something -- I mean, it looks like

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she's been there since 2000, so.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I think Winfield is probably one of those situations where you have, like, the -- maybe the street department or Public Works or whatever they want to call it, and it encompasses a whole broad area, and I don't know that she's necessarily worked in that facility, but she supervises those people that work in that facility.

MR. HYLTON:

She's got a pretty good job then.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah.

MR. HYLTON:

But I don't think --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

But how you want to take that, that's up to you.

Do I hear any kind of motion?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Chairman, I move that we request more information on her experience.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And maybe for the next meeting.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

All right. Got a motion from
Mr. Lagrange.

MR. BARBER:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Second from Mr. Barber that we
request additional information regarding
Ms. Randle's experience so that we can get
a clarification of exactly what she does.

Is there any objection to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. That completes the review of
the applications.

Ms. Bordelon, would you like to read
all of those that had no objections?

MS. BORDELON:

Yes. Steve Benjamin, Incinerator,
Level A; Brenda Coutee C & D, Level A;
Jonathan Faulk, Landfill, Level B; Rachel
Fox -- I'm sorry, she didn't test -- not
her.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

No, we're approving applications.
Whether they test or not.

MS. BORDELON:

Okay. Rachel Fox C & D, Level B;
Anthony Garrett Landfill, Level B; David
Jones, Landfill, Level B; and Brandon
Marcantel, Landfill, Level B.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Did you say Jonathan Faulk?

MS. BORDELON:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. LAGRANGE:

I move, Mr. Chairman.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

All right. Moved by Mr. Lagrange.

MR. CREEL:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Creel that the
previously mentioned applications be
approved.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Next up, we have the review of

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requests for conditional certification extensions. Which is --

MS. BORDELON:

That's going to be Ross Walet and McHugh.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Rod McHugh. This is Gordon's Landfill.

MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

They've taken the test, passed the test. It's just an -- automatic -- I mean, a routine extension.

MR. BARBER:

And this should be their last --

MS. BORDELON:

It should be the last for both of them, because one's an A and one's a B.

MR. BARBER:

-- extension?

MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah.

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MR. BARBER:

Because one's an A and this -- the fifth time, so.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Do I hear a motion to approve the extensions?

MR. BARBER:

So moved.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Moved by Mr. Barber.

MS. TURTLE:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Second by Ms. Turtle.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Next we have the review requests for conditional certificates.

First up, Jeddie Bankston.

MR. BARBER:

Can we take -- there's a cover letter here from Mr. Daigle.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Okay.

MR. BARBER:

Can we take all three of those --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yes.

MR. BARBER:

-- together?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yes. It will be Jeddie Bankston,
Keith Daigle, and Charles Mancuso.

MS. BORDELON:

No, Kenneth Newman.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Kenneth Newman.

MR. BARBER:

And I -- can I -- okay.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Go ahead, Mr. Barber.

MR. BARBER:

Thank you, sir.

I have a serious problem with this,
and I think everybody sitting at this
table knows how I feel. We represent the
Board -- the DEQ, which represents all of
the residents and citizens of this state,

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1 and I just don't feel comfortable putting
2 any facility, even if it is a simple C & D
3 facility into the hands of people that
4 have no clue about what they are doing.
5 And these three people -- this guy Daigle
6 apparently is buying this facility or in
7 the process of purchasing it, and he wants
8 us to come in and ask us a Board to sign
9 off on him and two of his employees that
10 he's bringing from another business -- now
11 they probably have all been in dirt work
12 business, but I've been to some of these
13 facilities that had unqualified people.
14 And I just don't feel comfortable as a
15 Board member representing the people of
16 this state to say let's put this facility
17 in this guy's hands without having someone
18 that has the experience to assist them
19 until they get their experience. I have
20 no problem with them getting their
21 experience, but I don't want it to be at
22 the expense of the environment or our
23 residents.

24 And I guess I could continue and also
25 say that they apparently thought they

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1 could slip by with asking for a
2 conditional replacing one guy with three
3 people, because they put the same guy's
4 name on all three applications.

5 MR. BONVILLAIN:

6 Yeah, now --

7 MR. BARBER:

8 And one can replace one, but --

9 MS. TURTLE:

10 Do you have the applications?

11 MR. BONVILLAIN:

12 Ms. Bordelon had --

13 MR. BARBER:

14 Huh?

15 MS. TURTLE:

16 Do you have the applications?

17 MR. BARBER:

18 Uh-huh (yes).

19 MS. TURTLE:

20 Oh, I didn't.

21 MR. BARBER:

22 It's Bankston, Daigle, and Newman.

23 MR. WILLIAMS:

24 Newman.

25 MS. TURTLE:

1 Oh, I don't think I got them.
2 MR. BONVILLAIN:
3 You should have got those in e-mail.
4 MS. TURTLE:
5 Oh, okay.
6 MR. HYLTON:
7 Does anybody on site have a current
8 certification of any kind?
9 MS. BORDELON:
10 Yeah, Mr. Abshire does.
11 MR. LAGRANGE:
12 He has a Level A?
13 MS. BORDELON:
14 Uh-huh (yes).
15 MR. BONVILLAIN:
16 He's the one that's retiring. Okay.
17 MR. LAGRANGE:
18 He is being replaced, so.
19 MS. BORDELON:
20 He is being replaced.
21 MR. LAGRANGE:
22 And there is an application for a
23 Level A to replace him --
24 MS. BORDELON:
25 Correct.

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MR. LAGRANGE:

-- for a conditional?

Let's take that one up first.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. I have a question about this, too. And, Mia, you may be able to help us on this. On this purchase of this company, is it a different company that's purchasing it? In other words, is the ownership going to change -- the corporate ownership going to change?

MS. BORDELON:

I think so.

MR. LAGRANGE:

What does the cover letter say?

MR. HYLTON:

It says purchasing. You purchase something, it changes ownership.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Well, it's a little confusing, because they talking about 108 Disposal, LLC, and then David A. Abshire, LLC - 108 Disposal.

MS. TOWNSEL:

It looks as though they're taking

1 over the entire facility. It may not
2 necessary -- it looks like a clean
3 ownership change, that's what it looks
4 like. Now, I don't work in the section
5 where we receive the information --

6 MR. BONVILLAIN:

7 Right.

8 MS. TOWNSEL:

9 -- that's in the Public Participation
10 Group, so they would receive a certain
11 form that would say whether it's ownership
12 change, name change, things like that, but
13 based on this it looks like it is strictly
14 an ownership change.

15 MR. BARBER:

16 Well, I also have a question for Mia.
17 When this happens, on the permit side of
18 the issue do they have to show that they
19 have certified operators?

20 MS. TOWNSEL:

21 Yes. They have to include it in the
22 application.

23 MR. BARBER:

24 And you would have --

25 MS. TOWNSEL:

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They have --

MR. BARBER:

And neither one of you would have any way of knowing that that application has been submitted to DEQ?

MS. TOWNSEL:

I could find out. It wouldn't, like, physically come across my desk, but I could find out. I work in the section where it would come.

MR. BARBER:

Well --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Because under the regulation --

MR. HYLTON:

Are they applying for a permit under their name or are they just assuming the old permit?

MS. TOWNSEL:

It looks like they're assuming the old one.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Under the regulations, okay, we could grant a conditional for the one --

MR. HYLTON:

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Well, then you might not --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- that's replacing Mr. Abshire,
except that Mr. Abshire has not left yet.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Chairman, I'm looking --

MR. BARBER:

8/1, that's what he's got on the
application.

MS. TURTLE:

So, could we do it pending his
departure?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Upon his departure.

MS. BORDELON:

Mr. Daigle indicated to me that as
soon as they received the -- he received
the conditional, that Mr. Abshire could
leave.

MS. TOWNSEL:

They have an August 1st date on here,
right?

MR. BARBER:

Right.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Mr. Lagrange?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Chairman, looking at the Secretary of State's website, shows that 108 Disposal, LLC, was registered with the Secretary of State on June 15th of this year.

MR. CREEL:

That's correct.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Who does it show as officers?

MR. LAGRANGE:

It shows as the members of the LLC as: Adam Daigle, manager; Keith Daigle, member; and James Daigle, member.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And what I would -- in line with what Ms. Mia was saying, I think that David Abshire, LLC, was the company that owned the facility and they're selling it to 108. It's the same facility, but they're selling it to 108 Disposal, LLC.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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1 Yeah, but they're selling it to a
2 different corporation. See, we had --
3 with Gordon's Landfill, Gordon sold out,
4 but those people bought the stock of
5 Gordon's Landfill. It wasn't a separate
6 company. This is a separate company
7 that's buying it.

8 MR. HYLTON:

9 What happens to the permit if it's in
10 one company's name and someone else buys
11 it, whose name is the permit in?

12 MS. TURTLE:

13 The legal entity's name.

14 MS. TOWNSEL:

15 Yeah, it's going to go into their
16 name, the 108 Disposal.

17 MR. HYLTON:

18 So, anybody can just go buy a
19 landfill and obtain a permit?

20 MS. TOWNSEL:

21 You would have to do a lot more.

22 MR. BONVILLAIN:

23 There's a process to go through. But
24 I'm wondering if they get that process
25 that quick.

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MS. TOWNSEL:

It takes months, ordinarily. It takes months.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

See, and they were just incorporated June 15th, he said, so they --

MS. BORDELON:

I think they're wanting to have their operators in line, because if you read the last paragraph it says, following the issuance of the operator certification then 108 Disposal will begin the facility ownership changes.

MS. HENRY:

So, they can't change over until a certified -- a conditional is granted. We can't grant one because they're doing a one for one, right.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MS. HENRY:

So, the other two would have to wait? Is that what you're saying?

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MR. BARBER:

And I'll just go ahead and tell y'all before somebody makes a motion, I cannot vote for a man to get a conditional Level A and be in charge with zero experience.

I can't do it. I'm not going to do it.

MS. BORDELON:

It's in the regulations.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, I think Mr. Daigle has construction experience, and there's solid waste experience, as you said, but he does have construction experience.

MR. BARBER:

I agree.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And you -- for -- and he would -- our consideration would be is the application -- one of the applications for the Level A is to replace a Level A at that facility. Notwithstanding who owns what, but he's replacing that --

MR. BARBER:

But he's going to be the guy in

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charge, though.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, I would think -- I know, but I think we would -- in according with the regs, we, in our -- it's within our purview to grant that conditional.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

That's correct.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Number one. The second part, on the two Level B applications, again, the regs allow us to grant conditionals if we feel that they -- I forget exactly how it reads, but if we feel that those applicants have enough qualifications to warrant getting a conditional at that level at that specific facility.

So, that's in the regs, regardless -- I know how you personally feel, and all, but I just want to make it clear that it is within the regs, whether it's a right or a wrong for the State of Louisiana or the people of Louisiana, evidently the folks at DEQ and the folks in the legislature and the administration of the

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state who promulgated those rules and regs
thought this was something that needed to
be available to the public for these types
of facilities.

So, having said that, Mr. Chairman,
I'd like to move on the conditional Level
A applicant. I'm not sure which one that
is. Is that --

MS. BORDELON:

That's Daigle.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Keith Daigle.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Keith Daigle.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Keith Daigle, to grant him a
conditional Level A, replacing
Mr. Abshire --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

-- at that facility.

MR. BARBER:

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Well --

MR. HYLTON:

I have a question, then.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yes.

MR. HYLTON:

Definition of conditional says it's
only good for six months.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Correct.

MR. HYLTON:

What happens to this guy in six
months?

MR. LAGRANGE:

He has to reapply.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

We extend the conditional. We can
extend the -- that's what just did
earlier --

MR. HYLTON:

Okay.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- for Gordon's Landfill people.

MR. HYLTON:

Okay. But how long can you extend

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it? When --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Basically what happens is, we extend it until they have the necessary experience to get the regular certificate.

MR. LAGRANGE:

But there are some stipulations. In order to get an extension, they have to --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right. Right. They have to attend class, they have to pass the exam.

MR. HYLTON:

Okay.

MR. BARBER:

Well, again, I don't have to tell you I'm opposed --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Chairman, I've got a motion on the table.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, is there a second to the motion?

MR. BARBER:

Well, I think it's --

MR. WILLIAMS:

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Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

Wait. Wait. Wait.

Okay. We have a motion on the floor by Mr. Lagrange to grant the conditional Level A to Keith Daigle, seconded by Mr. Williams.

Is there any discussion?

MR. BARBER:

Yes, there is.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Mr. Barber.

MR. BARBER:

And I don't know how I can stress this enough. This is no different than what we done with Stericycle the last couple of years. You're putting a facility in the hands of people that have zero experience. And I am opposed to it. I am highly opposed to it. And I can't believe that anybody sitting at this table is for it. It disappoints me in everybody that is for it.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Okay. There is --

MR. BARBER:

Because I have been to some of these facilities, and I can take y'all if y'all take time to get in your vehicle and go with me, I can show you some of these facilities that have been in the hands of people that don't know what they're doing.

MS. HENRY:

Then that would be up to the regulators to come down on --

MR. BARBER:

No, that's up to this Board when it comes to --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Now wait a minute, wait a minute.

MR. BARBER:

-- certifying the operators.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Wait a minute.

There's a difference between this instance here and Stericycle. Stericycle was starting a new facility with no operators. This is an existing facility

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1 and under the current regulations, a --
2 any individual can come in and get a
3 conditional to replace a regularly
4 certified operator, and that's
5 Mr. Lagrange's motion.

6 Okay.

7 MR. BARBER:

8 But there's nobody there --

9 MR. BONVILLAIN:

10 Now, the other two -- the other two,
11 that's a different discussion. Okay.
12 Right now we're just talking about
13 Mr. Daigle.

14 MR. BARBER:

15 There's nobody there -- this Abshire
16 guy's going to be gone, because he's the
17 one that's being replaced. There's nobody
18 here with the experience --

19 MR. BONVILLAIN:

20 I understand --

21 MR. BARBER:

22 -- to guide this facility.

23 MR. BONVILLAIN:

24 I understand exactly what you're
25 saying, but I'm telling you what the

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regulations say.

MR. BARBER:

I understand what the regulations say.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. The regulations require no experience to get a conditional to replace a regularly certified operator.

MR. BARBER:

But I think back to what Bo was saying with the legislatures and the people that made these laws. I think that's why we have -- they had a Board sitting here with people that are qualified and knowledgeable that understands this stuff, because these people making these laws don't understand, and they depend on us.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

All right. But, again, the discretionary part of this comes in the next two that want a Level B. They're not replacing anybody that's regularly certified. But the regulation specifically says if he is replacing a

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regularly certified operator, there is no experience requirement. All he has to do is be replacing him. Whether we like it or don't like it, that's the way the regulation is right now.

MR. HYLTON:

Do you even have grounds to not grant it under those guidelines?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

No. Okay.

Any further discussion?

Okay. I'll take a roll call vote. I know I'm going to get some objections.

MR. WILLIAMS:

I was going to request it.

MS. BORDELON:

Hold on, let me write the names down.

MR. CREEL:

I don't agree with it either, but based on the rules, there's nothing you can do about it.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Mr. Chairman, why don't you clarify what the vote is?

MR. BARBER:

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I can vote against it.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right.

MR. LAGRANGE:

The motion.

MR. WILLIAMS:

The motion.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

The motion on the floor is to approve a conditional certification, a Level A, for Keith Daigle to be replacing David Abshire.

MS. BORDELON:

Okay. Say yay or nay?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yes.

MS. BORDELON:

Jason Creel?

MR. CREEL:

Yay.

MS. BORDELON:

Troy Barber?

MR. BARBER:

Nay.

MS. BORDELON:

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Danny Hylton?

MR. HYLTON:

Do you allow abstentions?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

You can abstain if you wish.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yes.

MR. HYLTON:

I abstain.

MS. BORDELON:

Bo Lagrange?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yay.

MS. BORDELON:

Fred Williams?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yay.

MS. BORDELON:

Connie Henry?

MS. HENRY:

Yay.

MS. BORDELON:

Lindsey Turtle?

MS. TURTLE:

Yay.

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MS. BORDELON:

We have five yays and one nay and one abstention.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Five yays, one nay, and one abstention, the motion passes.

Okay. Now, moving on to Mr. Jeddie Bankston and Kenneth Newman requesting Level Bs for the same facility, not replacing a regularly certified operator.

MR. LAGRANGE:

All right. Mr. Chairman, just, again, going back to the regs, and this one says, or in part of the regs say, the Board must determine that the applicant is qualified to perform duties at a particular facility for the conditional.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Correct.

MR. LAGRANGE:

So, that's where it comes to this Board to review these applications and make that determination.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right. It's in the Board's

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discretion.

MR. LAGRANGE:

That's correct.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Does anybody have any comments on the experience of either of these two individuals that they'd like to bring forth?

MR. BARBER:

Y'all know what I think.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Well, the experience -- and they don't elaborate other than to say they're equipment operators, operate excavators, bulldozers and compactors, it says, for construction companies it looks like, and they pretty much put the same thing for both applicants from an experience standpoint. So, you know, the question for the Board is, is that enough information for us to make that determination on their qualifications.

MR. CREEL:

But they can't get a conditional under the other conditional, can they?

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MS. BORDELON:

No.

MR. WILLIAMS:

No.

MR. CREEL:

So, it doesn't matter.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Wait, wait. What do you mean, a conditional under the other conditional?

MR. CREEL:

They're applying for a conditional license under the conditional license that we just voted on for Mr. Daigle.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

No, they can.

MR. CREEL:

So, three applicants can apply for one --

MR. LAGRANGE:

No, they cannot.

MS. BORDELON:

No, they can't.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Not under the same provision.

MR. CREEL:

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Well, that's what they're doing.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

No -- well, initially, yes.

MS. BORDELON:

Well, that's what they requested. I informed them that they could -- that could not happen. It could only be one them.

MR. CREEL:

Okay. So, what do they --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

See, only one can get the condition to be replacing the other one.

MR. CREEL:

All right.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

The other two would be completely at the discretion of the Board as to whether you think they deserve to get a conditional certificate.

MR. CREEL:

All right.

MR. BARBER:

Well, Title 46 clearly defines what kind of experience they should have, and

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they don't meet it.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. I'm open for a motion in either direction.

MS. TURTLE:

Do they have two years of construction? I don't have the applications.

MR. BARBER:

One year of solid waste and one of construction as a supervisor.

MR. LAGRANGE:

That's what the requirements are. And currently -- their experience is just working for construction companies.

MS. TURTLE:

For how many years.

MR. LAGRANGE:

You have one year from 2009.

MS. BORDELON:

Fifteen years.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And then 2017.

MS. BORDELON:

Eighteen years.

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MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah. The other guy is --

MR. HYLTON:

It teaches you nothing about recognizing hazardous waste and all of this kind of stuff.

MS. TURTLE:

But under the requirements, I mean, a year in construction.

MS. BORDELON:

They still need one year of solid waste.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

For a regular certificate.

MS. TURTLE:

And -- oh, one year and two years. Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Those requirements are for a regular certificate, right?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Correct.

MS. BORDELON:

Right.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Correct.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Not a conditional.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And as I said, on a conditional, you know, the experience they put under construction, I mean, the experience, it shows construction experience, and they really don't elaborate other than they were equipment operators that operate excavators, bulldozers and compactors. So, the determination, you know, is that enough information for us to make a determination of their qualifications for a conditional, and if it is enough information, is it enough to grant one or not grant one?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

And here's something else you may consider, too, when we grant conditional certificates, we can put conditions on that conditional.

MR. HYLTON:

Such as?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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1 Such as taking classes in monitoring
2 incoming waste. I mean, the equipment
3 part of it, they obviously know how to
4 operate the equipment.

5 MR. HYLTON:

6 Sure.

7 MR. BONVILLAIN:

8 You know, that, I don't think, is the
9 issue. You know, what do they know about
10 actually receiving income waste, what's
11 acceptable, what's not acceptable, you
12 know, how do you have to maintain your
13 interim cover, all of that stuff.

14 MR. BARBER:

15 Ms. Bordelon, did these three people
16 test today?

17 MS. BORDELON:

18 Yes, they did. They all passed. And
19 they're all attending the workshop as
20 well.

21 MR. BONVILLAIN:

22 And the test is based on the
23 regulations. Strictly on the regulations.

24 MR. BARBER:

25 Yeah, but, you know, we have seen

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1 some of those girls walk in here that
2 worked in the office that knew nothing
3 about solid waste, but studied the regs
4 for three or four days and passed the
5 test. You know, that don't signify
6 knowing how to run a facility.

7 MR. HYLTON:

8 But it meets the regs if you pass the
9 test.

10 MR. BARBER:

11 It meets the regs. That still don't
12 make me feel better about it.

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Well, these gentlemen aren't people
15 who worked in the office, though.
16 Obviously, they work in construction.
17 They didn't work in the office.

18 MR. WILLIAMS:

19 Are they girls?

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 I wasn't going gender -- I was
22 talking about gender. I was just talking
23 about where they worked, Fred.

24 MR. WILLIAMS:

25 I know.

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MR. BARBER:

I understand that.

MS. TOWNSEL:

Gary, if we put conditions on the conditionals, like you said, as far as taking certain classes, do we specify when and where they take the class and do we have them to send a certification after they take? How do we --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Anyway you want to set it up.

MS. TOWNSEL:

Okay.

MR. HYLTON:

But where do you get a class that teaches you specific things other than -- and, you know, the conferences don't always cover everything you need to know.

MR. LAGRANGE:

I say they go spend a day with Rhonda in Lafayette.

MS. HENRY:

Oh, Lord.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I tell you what, I mean, they got a

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good lesson this morning.

MS. HENRY:

Yes, they did.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

We had one of the DEQ regional managers give a talk this morning. She went a little over an hour. Top to bottom. As an operator, what you've got to do, what you've got to look for.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And what she's looking for when they come, and what they expect of a facility.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah. You know, from that particular perspective, just sitting in on that lesson this morning, I'd feel a lot -- I feel a lot more comfortable that they know a little bit about what they can do and what they can't do. Okay. That's my personal opinion.

But we need to take some kind of action, so what's the pleasure of the Board? I can't make a motion.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Chairman, I'm going to take a

1 crack at it. I'm going to make a motion
2 to issue a conditional certification with
3 conditions that they attend -- each attend
4 a minimum of four hour class, course,
5 instruction, from a qualified source
6 relative to waste handling, waste
7 identification, waste acceptance for a C &
8 D type III C & D landfill. Within --

9 MR. BONVILLAIN:

10 Waste handling, waste acceptance, and
11 what?

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 Waste identification.

14 Within 90 days.

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 But is that type -- is that
17 available?

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Approved by -- I mean, it can be
20 instruction by someone at DEQ, you know.

21 MR. WILLIAMS:

22 Or it could be attending a workshop
23 out-of-state.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 By instruction --

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MR. WILLIAMS:

If we do reciprocity.

MR. LAGRANGE:

By instruction from a qualified source through DEQ or by attending a -- any other workshops that meet those qualifications.

MS. TURTLE:

Does that training need to be preapproved by the Board or?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah, preapproved by the Chairman of our Board.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Thank you, Bo.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Is that your motion?

MR. LAGRANGE:

That's my motion.

MR. WILLIAMS:

I second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Have a motion by Mr. Lagrange that we approve conditional applications for Kenneth Newman and --

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MS. TURTLE:

Jeddie Bankston.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- Jeddie Bankston.

Kenneth Newman and Jeddie Bankston with the following stipulations: That within 90 days they must attend a minimum of four hours of instructions pertaining to waste handling, waste acceptance, and waste identification for C & D type facilities with such training to be preapproved by the Chairman of the Board.

Any further discussion?

MR. BARBER:

I've got a question.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yes, Mr. Barber?

MR. BARBER:

If they haven't done that in 90 days, what happens?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

The conditional is no longer valid.

MR. WILLIAMS:

It's rescinded.

MR. BARBER:

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But it's valid from now until then.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

It will be valid from now until then.
And, as a matter of fact, if you want to
change your motion a little bit, issue it
for a 90 day period.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Yeah, I amend my motion that it be
for -- conditional for a 90 day period.

MR. BARBER:

And they can come back to us in
October?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right.

MS. HENRY:

Does the training they receive today
under Rhonda apply to any of that?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I'll approve an hour for this
morning.

MR. LAGRANGE:

It's up to the Chairman.

MS. HENRY:

I mean, because she did very
thoroughly --

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

No, I'm --

MR. LAGRANGE:

If this motion passes, it's up to the
Chairman.

MS. HENRY:

-- because she did very thoroughly go
over everything that you would need to
know, so.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right. That, you know, her
presentation this morning is the type that
we're looking for.

MS. HENRY:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BONVILLAIN:

She did an excellent job, and I would
be willing to -- as the Chairman -- I
would be willing to give them an hour
credit for that session this morning. And
there may be sessions tomorrow, I don't
remember what's on the agenda for
tomorrow, but we'll take a look at that to
see if there's anything there can be
applied. Okay.

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1 So the motion that we issue a
2 conditional certificate to Jeddie Bankston
3 and Kenneth Newman for a 90 day period
4 during which time the candidates must
5 obtain a minimum of four hours of training
6 in waste handling, waste acceptance, and
7 waste identification concerning C & D
8 landfills. Okay.

9 Any further discussion?

10 Okay. Is there any objection to the
11 motion?

12 MR. BARBER:

13 I'm going to go with this one.

14 MR. BONVILLAIN:

15 Okay.

16 MS. HENRY:

17 I have a question for you just
18 because -- and I like your motion --

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Wait? The motion carries?

21 MS. HENRY:

22 No, because I want you to hold up on
23 your motion for one second.

24 MR. BONVILLAIN:

25 No, because we haven't taken a vote

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yet.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Right.

MS. HENRY:

Just because -- all right. There --
as Suzanne pointed out, where do they go.
So, I looked at the agenda, there's an
hour tomorrow on C & D. Okay. So that
would -- you approve one hour this
morning, you give an hour to -- so you've
gotten them two hours, but -- okay, you're
starting a new facility --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I'm pretty sure that you can go
online with SWANA --

MS. HENRY:

Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MS. TURTLE:

You can.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- and get some training.

MS. HENRY:

Okay. I just was thinking from their

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perspective, you know, they're starting a new facility, they have to work, so you can't very well send them off to training. So, if there's online then okay.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I'm pretty sure SWANA's got some online training that they can take.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MS. HENRY:

Okay. I just was looking at it from, you know, like if we had to send all of our people out to get special training other than the workshops, it would be a bind for --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Right.

MS. HENRY:

Okay. Back to you, Bo.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Now, hearing that, is there any objection to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

MS. BORDELON:

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1 Okay. So, just to clarify, the
2 conditional will be good for three months.
3 Should -- upon them providing the proof of
4 their four hours, do we -- then we issue
5 them another three-month conditional? Are
6 we charging them for another certificate?

7 MR. HYLTON:

8 Give them the balance of the six
9 months.

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 I saw we give them another
12 three-month.

13 MR. WILLIAMS:

14 Yes.

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 Without charging them.

17 MR. BONVILLAIN:

18 Okay. Let's go ahead and make that
19 in the form of a motion so we've got it on
20 the record.

21 Mr. Williams, you've --

22 MR. WILLIAMS:

23 So moved.

24 MR. BONVILLAIN:

25 You'd like to make a motion that if

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they comply with the four hour classes --

MR. WILLIAMS:

Conditions set forth by the Board.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- the conditions set forth on the conditional --

MR. WILLIAMS:

They'll be granted a conditional.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- that they be granted the additional three months for a normal six months conditional.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yes.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Is there a second to the motion?

MS. TURTLE:

Seconds.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Ms. Turtle seconds.

MR. BARBER:

I will, but y'all need to consider this: When we meet in October, another three months after October is November, December, January, and they will have to

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1 come right back to our December meeting
2 and ask for an extension or else it's
3 going to lapse before we have the --

4 MR. BONVILLAIN:

5 That's correct.

6 MR. BARBER:

7 -- the March.

8 MR. BONVILLAIN:

9 That's correct. And that's their
10 responsibility.

11 MR. WILLIAMS:

12 Yeah.

13 MR. BONVILLAIN:

14 You know, to go ahead and file for
15 the extension. And I'm sure when
16 Ms. Bordelon sends the letter out that
17 she's going to explain all of that to
18 them.

19 MS. BORDELON:

20 Of course.

21 MR. BARBER:

22 To me --

23 MR. BONVILLAIN:

24 Yes.

25 MR. BARBER:

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It would be better in October for them to go ahead and ask for their second extension, a full six months, and that gets them through to our March meeting.

MS. TURTLE:

That would be a good idea.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. That's discussion.

Okay. Now, we've got a motion and we've got a second.

Any further discussion?

MR. LAGRANGE:

Repeat the motion, Mr. Chairman.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

The motion is that if the individuals comply with the conditions set forth in granting the conditional certificate, that their conditional be extended an additional 90 days to complete the original six months. Okay.

Is there any objection to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Next, we've got Charles Mancuso.

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Ms. Bordelon, would you like to explain what happened with Mr. Mancuso?

MR. CREEL:

Uh-huh (yes).

MS. BORDELON:

Mr. Mancuso submitted an application for recertification with all of his continuing education that he has completed over the last several years, which were complete, the only problem I had with it was that his certification had expired in August of 2016. After having notified him of that, I got a call from Ms. Karla Swacker asking if he could submit a new application and request a conditional until he is able to come back in and test again, because I did inform him that he would have to retest.

MR. BARBER:

How long has he been certified?

MS. BORDELON:

Oh, he's been certified since --

MR. CREEL:

A long time.

MS. BORDELON:

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Yeah. 2008, I believe.

MR. CREEL:

'04.

MS. BORDELON:

No, 2004.

MR. BARBER:

So, he's been certified for 13 years.

MR. CREEL:

Level A since 2008.

MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

MR. BARBER:

Listen, the guy is qualified, we know he's qualified. He meets everything. I would just charge him the additional fee, and if he wants to come to DEQ and test, I'm fine with that. If y'all are okay with it, I don't even -- the guy don't even have to test as far as me, but there should be some kind of penalty, because he should have been responsible enough --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Well, here's the deal, this is the regulation, okay? He has to test -- according to the regulation, he has to

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retest. He has to pay the \$100 entry fee
and then he has to pay for a certificate
again.

MR. BARBER:

Uh-huh (yes).

MR. BONVILLAIN:

That -- the -- having to test and pay
the \$100 fee, basically is the penalty.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. The issue right now is, he is
expired, okay? And he is a supervisor on
the weekends at the landfill, so he has to
have --

MR. BARBER:

So, he needs --

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- his certificate. So, we're
granting the conditional until such time
as he's able to come in and take the test.

MR. BARBER:

I'll make a motion to that effect.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

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MR. WILLIAMS:

Second.

MS. TURTLE:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Motion by Mr. Barber, seconded by Ms. Turtle.

MS. BORDELON:

Yeah, and he'll have to pay \$100 for the conditional certificate, \$100 for the test, and then another \$100 for a four year certificate.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. So, we have a motion by Mr. Barber, seconded by Ms. Turtle, that we grant the conditional certificate for Mr. Mancuso.

Any objections to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion passes.

Now, we will also need to approve his application for a regular certificate.

Okay. A matter of formality, as you said, but we have to approve the application.

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MR. BARBER:

So moved.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Moved by Mr. Barber --

MR. LAGRANGE:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- seconded by Mr. Lagrange.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Alfred Senegal, Angco,
requesting a conditional to replace a
certified operator, Bernard Ashford.

MR. LAGRANGE:

I move, Mr. Chairman.

MR. BARBER:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Moved by Mr. Lagrange, seconded by
Mr. Barber.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Okay. Review of applications for
recertification.

Okay. We have the following

1 individuals who have completed all of
2 their training requirements for
3 recertification: Thomas Campbell,
4 Landfill, Level C; Muriel Chrisley,
5 Landfill, Level A; Ronald Edwards,
6 Landfill, Level B; Robert Hebert,
7 Landfill, Level A; Paul Marks, Landfill,
8 Level A, C & D, Level A; David Mason,
9 Incinerator, Level A, Transfer Station,
10 Level A, C & D, Level A, Composting, Level
11 A, and Separation, Level A; Monica Nicks,
12 C & D, Level A; Patricia Pastor, Landfill,
13 Level B; Damian Patterson, Landfill, Level
14 B; Ronald Pellerin, C & D, Level A; John
15 B. Roy, Landfill, Level A; Jason Seals,
16 Landfill, Level B; Shelby Stokes,
17 Landfill, Level B; Joseph Williams, Jr.,
18 Landfill, Level C.

19 Do I hear a motion to approve the
20 recertification of these applicants?

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 I move, Mr. Chairman.

23 MR. BONVILLAIN:

24 Moved by Mr. Lagrange.

25 MR. WILLIAMS:

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Second.

MR. BARBER:

So moved. Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Williams -- he beat you, Mr. Barber.

Any objections to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, motion passes.

Okay. We also have three individuals who have not completed their recertification -- their training hours, but they are supposed to be attending this session here.

MS. HENRY:

All three are present.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

All three are present. Okay.

Do I hear a motion to accept the recertification applications for Kerry Outley, C & D, Level B; Clatter Polidore, Landfill, Level B, C & D, Level B; and Patrick Roth, C & D, Level A, upon proof of attendance at the Marksville seminar?

MR. BARBER:

So moved.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Moved by Mr. Barber.

MS. HENRY:

Second.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Lagrange.

MR. LAGRANGE:

Mr. Chairman, I think you said -- for Outley, you said Level B, and my page shows Level A.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Patrick -- for Roth?

MR. LAGRANGE:

For Kerry Outley, you said Level B.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Oh, I said Level B? I'm sorry.

That's a Level A.

MR. LAGRANGE:

It should be Level A, right?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. I'm sorry.

MR. LAGRANGE:

I want to correct it for the record.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. So, it's Kerry Outley,
Landfill, Level A.

Okay. Any objections to the motion?

Okay. Hearing none, the motion
passes.

And next we have the issuance of
operator certificates.

Ms. Bordelon?

MS. BORDELON:

Steve Benjamin, Incinerator, Level A;
Brenda Coutee, C & D, Level A; Jonathan
Faulk, Landfill, Level B; Anthony Garrett,
Landfill, Level B; David Jones, Landfill,
Level B; and Brandon Marcantel, Landfill,
Level B.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:

I move, Mr. Chairman.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Moved by Mr. Lagrange.

MS. TURTLE:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

1 Second by Ms. Turtle that the
2 previous applications be issued.

3 Any objection to the motion?

4 Hearing none, the motion passes.

5 Next, committee reports.

6 Awards, Ms. Turtle?

7 MS. TURTLE:

8 Nothing to report at this time.

9 MR. BONVILLAIN:

10 Nothing to report. Okay. No awards
11 to give out.

12 Testing, Mr. Lagrange?

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Thank you. Ms. Suzanne, would you
15 give my report for me?

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 We had nine individuals test this
18 morning. All nine passed.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Thank you.

21 MR. BONVILLAIN:

22 Continuing education, Mr. Barber?

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 Ms. Connie?

25 MS. BORDELON:

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We are the committee.

MS. HENRY:

Please note that on the record.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

We know who gets the work done.

MS. HENRY:

There are 79 people registered for the Marksville workshop.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Amen.

MR. BARBER:

And, I may add to that, we will also have a workshop in October in Shreveport.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

October 4th and 5th, correct?

MS. HENRY:

Yes.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

All right. Nominating, Mr. Williams?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yes, sir. Suzanne, I will not ask you to make my report. I will make it myself.

We have three Board members coming off in October, October 8th, which I guess

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will be after the meeting.

Bo Lagrange, Lindsey Turtle, and --
MS. BORDELON:

They're not coming off. Their terms
are ending -- their first terms are
ending.

MR. WILLIAMS:
Termination.

MS. BORDELON:
You're coming off.

MR. WILLIAMS:
Termination. Well, this says
'termination'. Well, my termination --
second term -- let me make this report,
thank you very much.

Mine is termination, second term.
Lindsey's is termination, first term. Bo
is termination, first term.

Okay.
MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.
MR. WILLIAMS:

So, actually, I'll be the only one
coming off.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Do we have to send any notification
to their appointing agencies?

MS. BORDELON:

Yes.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. You're going to take care of
that?

MS. BORDELON:

I will take care of that.

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Mr. Williams, is there any
idea of who will be replacing you?

MR. WILLIAMS:

I've got an idea.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

But I'm not ready to share it at this
time.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

All right. Especially on record,

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huh?

MR. WILLIAMS:

Yeah.

MR. BARBER:

Top secret.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS:

That concludes my report,
Mr. Chairman.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Very good, thank you.

Okay. Review requests for approval
of CEUs from Brian Duff for SWANA 2017
Spring Conference May 16-18, 2017.

Do we have anything?

MS. BORDELON:

Did y'all not get that? Did I not
send that? I'm sorry.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Evidently not. Everybody looks as
confusing as I am.

MS. BORDELON:

Okay. I have it.

He attended a conference in Biloxi

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1 May 16-18th. He is requesting -- well, he
2 didn't actually request it, but the CEU
3 report that he submitted was -- is for
4 nine hours. I'm not sure how much good
5 that will do him, but he's got nine hours.

6 MR. BARBER:

7 And this is a SWANA. I wonder why
8 they only do nine hours.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 It's three hours for the afternoon
11 technical sessions on May 16th, three --

12 MR. BONVILLAIN:

13 It's the Mississippi chapter of
14 SWANA.

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 Three on the 17th morning and three
17 on the 18th morning.

18 MS. HENRY:

19 There's not a luncheon speaker in
20 there that could give this poor guy his
21 ten hours?

22 MR. BONVILLAIN:

23 Well -- no, they don't start until
24 one o'clock on the first day.

25 MS. HENRY:

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Oh.

MS. BORDELON:

They go from one until 4:45 on the Tuesday -- well, I mean, it's all day on Wednesday, but he only has three hours for the morning session.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Second day, stormwater best management practices, collection and management system for water in landfills final cover drainage layer, ethics, recycling talk, emergency procedures.

Okay. That's only until 11:45 and the rest of it is networking.

MS. BORDELON:

So, eight to almost twelve, that's three hours and 45 minutes.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

The third day --

MS. BORDELON:

We do at ours, right?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, I think so.

Last day, industrial and special waste update, safety discussion, SWANA

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1 membership update, mapping service options
2 for landfills, safety vehicles and heavy
3 equipment. Eight to 11:30, that's three
4 and a half.

5 The first day the conference welcome,
6 solid waste management: Past, present,
7 and future, nationals SWANA update,
8 national SWANA safety update, Mississippi
9 waste division update, safety: Distracted
10 driving, and that's from 1:15 to 4:45.
11 That's three and a half hours.

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 It's another 3.75.

14 MR. BONVILLAIN:

15 Yeah, but that's close enough.

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 Okay.

18 MR. BARBER:

19 Is -- what facility is Brian Duff
20 working at?

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 Waste Management. I don't
23 remember --

24 MR. BARBER:

25 So, is it one of the -- is he one of

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those, like, David Mason that's crossing
state lines, that's in Louisiana and
Mississippi?

MR. BONVILLAIN:

I don't know.

MR. BARBER:

I'm just wondering why he's attending
this SWANA when there's plenty of training
here in Louisiana.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Well, some of them like to go out of
state, you know? They've got a travel
budget, sometimes, they like to use it.

MR. BARBER:

Yes.

MR. HYLTON:

But if it's not going to meet the
requirements, maybe you ought not do it.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

But, I think looking at it -- and we
can pass it around if everybody wants to
look at it --

MS. BORDELON:

And he says here he currently holds a
MOLO certification.

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MR. BONVILLAIN:

And that might be an issue, too, of why. This he can use towards his MOLO because it's a SWANA course. Ours, SWANA probably wouldn't approve it or he'd have to go through all kind of hoops to get it approved, you know.

But, you know, we can pass it around, and I think we could legitimately give him ten hours on it.

MR. BARBER:

Well, I don't need to look at it. If you are telling us that it's qualify for ten hours, I'd offer a motion that we grant him ten hours for this thing.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. A motion by Mr. Barber that we grant ten hours --

MS. HENRY:

Second.

MS. TURTLE:

Second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- for Brian Duff's SWANA Spring Conference.

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MS. HENRY:

I second.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Seconded by Mr. Henry.

Any objections to the motion?

Hearing none, the motion passes.

Next item, public comments. We've
only got one public.

You've got any comments?

MS. TULLIER:

No comments.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Then.

MS. BORDELON:

You don't want to ask Troy for a
conditional?

MS. HENRY:

Careful over there.

MR. WILLIAMS:

We want to get out of here.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Do I hear a motion to adjourn?

MR. WILLIAMS:

So moved.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

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Moved by Mr. Williams. _

MS. HENRY:

Second.

MR. BARBER:

Seconded by Ms. Henry that we
adjourn.

No objections?

Motion is approved.

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
