12 CHAIRMAN: I call the meeting of the Board of Certification  
13 and Training For Solid Waste Management Operators to order  
14 in Shreveport. We'll start off with roll call.

15 MS. BORDELON: Bo LaGrange?16 MR. LAGRANGE: Present.17 MS. BORDELON: John Fourrier?18 MR. FOURRIER: Here.19 MS. BORDELON: Danny Hylton?20 MR. HYLTON: Here.21 MS. BORDELON: Jason Creel?22 MR. CREEL: Here.23 MS. BORDELON: Wes Wyche?24 MR. WYCHE: Here.25 MS. BORDELON: Connie Henry?

1 MS. HENRY: Here.

2 MS. BORDELON: David Greene?

3 MR. GREENE: Here.

4 MS. BORDELON: Troy Barber?

5 MR. BARBER: Here.

6 MS. BORDELON: Gary Bonvillian? Mia Townsel?

7 CHAIRMAN: Okay. We have a quorum. Next on the agenda is  
8 review of March 16th board meeting minutes. Do we have any  
9 comments, questions, additions or deletions?

10 MR. BARBER: I offer a motion for approval.

11 CHAIRMAN: Approval. Do I have a second?

12 MR. CREEL: Second.

13 CHAIRMAN: Seconded by Mr. Creel. Any discussion? (no  
14 response) Motion carries. All right. We move on, right  
15 into review of applications for certification. I'll read  
16 the name, the type of certification, facility name and we'll  
17 go one by one. If anyone has any questions or comments,  
18 please speak up and we'll have that discussion. First is  
19 John M. Alexander for C&D, Level A, Stallion Oilfield  
20 Services.

21 MR. HYLTON: I have a question about experience for a Level  
22 A. Reading through his description of work, he's mainly a  
23 forklift operator, assists with a few other things. I'm  
24 just wondering if that qualifies him for a Level A in a C&D  
25 site.

1 MR. WYCHE: I had the same question.

2 MR. BARBER: Does anybody know if that is - if Stallion  
3 actually owns a C&D site or operates a C&D site?

4 MR. HYLTON: They're a big - a humungous company, but I  
5 don't know if they have a C&D site.

6 MR. BARBER: Yeah, and, obviously, this is in the Rayne  
7 area, North Louisiana, Abbeville. Vermillion, it says.

8 CHAIRMAN: Yeah, it's in Abbeville.

9 MR. FOURRIER: It's an air curtain destructor facility.  
10 It's a Type 3 facility, it's not a landfill. I sounds like  
11 they just burn it there and haul it off.

12 MR. HYLTON: Well, the Type 3 classification, does that mean  
13 it would cover a C&D landfill, also, that experience, a  
14 C&D --

15 MR. BARBER: Well, C&D - yeah, a C&D is a Type 3. I don't  
16 know that I've actually seen one that was permitted as a  
17 Type 3 that was only an air curtain destructor other than  
18 like during storm time when there was a lot of tree debris.

19 MR. HYLTON: Not even permitted, generally, just a letter.

20 MR. FOURRIER: This facility has a permit, Suzanne, do you  
21 know?

22 MS. BORDELON: I do not know.

23 MR. FOURRIER: Well, is there process where they have to  
24 have a permit? And that may be what they have. But the  
25 question still remains, does he have enough experience to

1 be --

2 MR. CREEL: Does a forklift operator qualify you for a level  
3 A.

4 MR. FOURRIER: -- a Level A. And the answer to your  
5 question, I mean, according to the breakdown of the  
6 classifications, he is at a Type 3 facility. It's not a  
7 landfill, but if he does get the Level A, that transfers to  
8 C&D Landfill, but that's not our choice. That's the - well,  
9 no, I mean, that's the way the classifications are broken  
10 down.

11 CHAIRMAN: All right. So it seems to be the discussion as  
12 to the question on the experience of Mr. Alexander to  
13 qualify him for a Level A regular certificate for C&D, or  
14 wood waste facility. Do I have a specific motion relative  
15 to this application?

16 MR. WYCHE: I'm new to the committee - or to the board, but  
17 I just don't know, maybe, traditionally, what the board -  
18 how the board views that type of experience, you know.

19 CHAIRMAN: Well, pretty much, it depends on the level of the  
20 operator's certification. Level A is someone who is in  
21 overall responsible charge of the facility and, you know,  
22 knows all of the permit and knows - you know, probably knows  
23 his permit for that facility frontwards and backwards or was  
24 part of writing the permit, you know, and dealing with DEQ  
25 in obtaining the permit a lot of times, and so I don't know

1 that a Level A - it also comes with experience requirements,  
2 so many years experience in that solid waste area, which  
3 operating a forklift and hauling ash off, does that  
4 constitute the type of solid waste experience needed for a  
5 Level A operator? So there are some subjective areas that  
6 this board has to decide on, and that's kind of why we're  
7 discussing this.

8 MR. BARBER: Ms. Bordelon, did he take the test today?

9 MS. BORDELON: He did not. He's testing in October.

10 MR. BARBER: Okay. I think, for my part, I could probably  
11 agree to a D level, but I'm - I'm hesitant to give him an A  
12 level based on that experience.

13 CHAIRMAN: Mr. Barber and the rest of the board, let's do  
14 this. Let's not take action on this application and I  
15 recommend maybe that, if the board is in agreement, that we  
16 ask Ms. Bordelon to get into - further review that and maybe  
17 resubmit it. If he's taking an exam in October, anyway,  
18 he's not asking for a condition or anything, so we could  
19 take his application up at our October board meeting. So do  
20 I have a motion to that effect?

21 MR. BARBER: So moved.

22 CHAIRMAN: Second by --

23 MR. FOURRIER: Second.

24 CHAIRMAN: By Mr. Fourrier. All in favor? Okay. Next is  
25 Catherine D. Chapman, separation Level B, Southern Disposal.

1 And we have Mary M. Dupree, C&D, Level B, Natchitoches  
2 Parish Compactor Station.

3 MR. BARBER: This one, apparently, has worked three  
4 different times for precisely seven months each time and  
5 even if you add the three together, you still don't have the  
6 two years of experience, but I - I think I'm okay with  
7 everything else, providing she gets that three months  
8 experience. I think I said three years. Three more months  
9 of experience, and this is one that, apparently, she is  
10 replacing Linda Jones, who was, obviously, a certified  
11 operator and I think maybe she had in mind that we - if we  
12 didn't give her a regular certification, that we would give  
13 her a conditional. I'm fine with granting a conditional  
14 replacing Linda Jones for the next three months and upon her  
15 completing the next three months of experience and passing  
16 the test, that we will give her the regular certification.  
17 I'm sorry I took so much time saying that.

18 CHAIRMAN: That's quite all right.

19 MR. CREEL: Well, she would almost have it, based on her  
20 4-11 - April 11th. July would put her in a three-month  
21 period that we're needing.

22 MR. WYCHE: I think there was a gap, though.

23 CHAIRMAN: There's a gap from October of '16 to April of  
24 '17, so that's why she's short on having the minimum two  
25 years experience requirement. Did she comment on the

1 conditional - let's see, because they did fill out the  
2 portion of her application that she was succeeding someone?

3 MS. BORDELON: No, she didn't. She's here today. My  
4 suggestion was to approve it for conditional and regular in  
5 three months, and then we could always ask her if she  
6 doesn't want the conditional, if she wants to wait the three  
7 months, because it would only - it would cost her an extra  
8 hundred dollars for a new certificate.

9 CHAIRMAN: I entertain the motion to issue a conditional  
10 certification and also approve her application for a regular  
11 certificate once she achieves her two years experience.

12 MS. BORDELON: And if she wants to just wait three months  
13 and have it issued then, a regular then...

14 CHAIRMAN: Right, but we'll authorize a conditional, because  
15 they may need that now to - you know, to be in compliance.

16 MR. HYLTON: So is that a motion?

17 CHAIRMAN: Mr. Wyche moves, seconded by Mr. Creel?

18 MR. CREEL: Yeah, I second it.

19 CHAIRMAN: Any other discussion? (no response) All in  
20 favor, I. All right. Thank you. Next is Dustin Falgoust  
21 for a landfill, Level A, St. James Parish.

22 MR. BARBER: I'm still not quite satisfied with the response  
23 that we've gotten.

24 CHAIRMAN: Well, I think the question is, is that he's  
25 requesting a certification for a Level A landfill and does



1 his - although St. James Parish, he doesn't work at a  
2 landfill. He's not employed at a landfill. He's employed  
3 by the parish government, but he does work in their solid  
4 waste area, because he refers to a facility in Gramercy and  
5 a facility in Vacherie. And Mr. Creel mentioned that the  
6 facility in Vacherie that you saw was a transfer station?

7 MR. CREEL: Yes, sir.

8 CHAIRMAN: And so it's not a Type 2 - neither one is a Type  
9 2 facility, which - so does his experience still qualify him  
10 for a Type 2 regular certificate?

11 MR. GREENE: No.

12 CHAIRMAN: Based on what's provided here, I don't see that  
13 it does. It says, oversees the daily activities at two  
14 transfer stations, so that doesn't give him experience in  
15 solid waste, but is that, you know, appropriate experience  
16 for that license?

17 MR. GREENE: He is asking for a Landfill Type 2, not a  
18 transfer station Type 2.

19 CHAIRMAN: That's right, that's correct.

20 MR. WYCHE: And the regulation, I think, is pretty specific,  
21 that your experience has to relate to the certification that  
22 you're trying to obtain, as I read it.

23 MR. GREENE: Did he say anything, he's trying to get a  
24 conditional transfer station or did he just make a mistake  
25 in Landfill A? I just can't see his reasoning trying to get

1 a Landfill A. There's just no backing for that part, but I  
2 could see if he wasn't paying attention and just wrote  
3 Landfill Level A.

4 MR. CREEL: This letter that they sent in from Hope Borne  
5 states their South Vacherie - but there is no South Vacherie  
6 landfill that I'm aware of in St. James Parish, so I don't  
7 know if...

8 CHAIRMAN: When you spoke to her, Ms. Bordelon, do you  
9 recall anything referring about landfill or C&D or transfer  
10 station or anything?

11 MS. BORDELON: No, because I only asked it to list  
12 facilities that --

13 CHAIRMAN: That he worked for?

14 MS. BORDELON: Yeah.

15 MR. FOURRIER: I worked at a --

16 CHAIRMAN: And experience, he put on there that he oversees  
17 two transfer stations, so I would deduce that to mean those  
18 two sites are transfer stations.

19 MR. CREEL: Yes, I agree.

20 CHAIRMAN: So maybe we ought to approve his application for  
21 a transfer station Level A license and if he chooses to...

22 MR. GREENE: I'll make that motion. That's what...

23 CHAIRMAN: All right. Moved by Mr. Greene to, in lieu of a  
24 Landfill Level A, to approve his application, a regular  
25 certificate for a transfer station Level A license. Do I

1 have a second?

2 MS. HENRY: I second.

3 CHAIRMAN: Seconded by Ms. Henry. Any other discussion?

4 (no response) All in favor, I. Motion carries. Okay.

5 Moving on to Kevin Henderson, Landfill Level A, Mundy

6 Landfill. I mean, Level B.

7 MR. FOURRIER: Well, it says Level A on the list, but it's B

8 on the application.

9 CHAIRMAN: B on the application. Okay. So that's correct.

10 Landfill Level B, Mundy Landfill.

11 MR. WYCHE: It looked to me like his only experience is as a

12 truck driver at the landfill. Did I read that right?

13 MR. HYLTON: A spotter.

14 MR. BARBER: They own their own hauling - they do their own  
15 hauling within the parish and I think most of these guys are  
16 kind of interchangeable, truck driver --

17 CHAIRMAN: If you look at his description of work, it says  
18 he operates light and heavy equipment. He kind of does  
19 what's needed evidently, so...

20 UNIDENTIFIED MEMBER: I'm good with him.

21 CHAIRMAN: Yeah, I think he's got the experience on that.

22 All right. Rachel Lacy, separation facility, Level A. It  
23 looks like she had a regular certificate that expired and  
24 now she's applying back for that separation Level A. All  
25 right. Justin M. Lennard, or Lennard, incinerator, Level B,

1 Stericycle.

2 MS. BORDELON: Those of you that don't know, Mr. Brian  
3 Sayers is no longer with Stericycle.

4 MR. FOURRIER: They are getting some regulars now, though,  
5 with experience.

6 CHAIRMAN: All right. Warren Pagel, landfill, Level B,  
7 Woolworth Landfill.

8 MR. WYCHE: My only probably dumb question on that one is  
9 why would he just be requesting Level B? I guess I thought  
10 that he might have been - might could qualify for a Level A.

11 MS. BORDELON: Because he --

12 MR. BARBER: He, apparently, already had a B.

13 MS. BORDELON: No, he took the level - he didn't pass the  
14 Level B when he took it the first time.

15 MR. BARBER: That was in 2012. Did he pass it this time?

16 MS. BORDELON: He passed it today.

17 MR. BARBER: I'm good.

18 CHAIRMAN: All right. Next, is Johnny Salard, C&D, Level B,  
19 Natchitoches Parish Compactor Station. Christopher B.  
20 Smith, landfill, Level B, Mundy Landfill. Don Edward Smith,  
21 separation, Level B, Southern Disposal. James S. Smith,  
22 incinerator, Level A, Stericycle.

23 MR. BARBER: Now, this is one that, apparently, lived in  
24 Nevada most of his life. There isn't no way for us to  
25 immediately verify this, but does this experience look - I

1 mean, on the - on the first one, he's got like twenty years  
2 - thirty years - twenty-eight years, so - but I'm not sure  
3 if that's landfill. Y'all? Anybody?

4 CHAIRMAN: Well, he's asking for incinerator, Level A.  
5 (several members said incinerator at the same time)

6 MR. CREEL: I see where the address is Nevada and in  
7 parentheses it says, all for incineration at El Dorado,  
8 Arkansas facility.

9 MR. BARBER: Yeah, I see that.

10 MR. WYCHE: Is that level of experience that he lists there  
11 the type of experience that would be sufficient for...

12 MR. CREEL: We were just concerned about the Nevada deal. I  
13 just now seen the El Dorado, Arkansas.

14 CHAIRMAN: All right. Next is Kristal L. Smith, landfill,  
15 Level A, Woolworth Landfill. Theda G. Smith, landfarm,  
16 Level B, Clean Harbors. Raymond L. Stinson, landfill, Level  
17 B, Webster Parish Landfill.

18 MR. WYCHE: I didn't see that he had a diploma.

19 MS. BORDELON: For Level B --

20 CHAIRMAN: B level, you're not required to have one. All  
21 right. Hieu D. Truong, landfarm, Level A, Clean Harbors.  
22 Sherman F. Youngblood, landfill, Level B, Mundy Landfill.

23 MR. BARBER: Apparently, he had let his expire?

24 MS. BORDELON: He did.

25 MR. BARBER: Did he pass the test today?

1 MS. BORDELON: He did.

2 MR. BARBER: Okay. I'm good with it.

3 CHAIRMAN: Okay. So we reviewed the applications and some  
4 of them, we've already taken action on, so I'll ask Ms.  
5 Bordelon to read the ones that we have to officially approve  
6 and then I'll entertain a motion to approve them for regular  
7 certifications.

8 MS. BORDELON: Catherine Chapman, separation, Level B;  
9 Rachel Lacy, separation, Level A; Justin Lennard,  
10 incinerator, Level B; Warren Pagel, landfill, Level B;  
11 Johnny Salard, C&D, Level B; Christopher Smith, landfill,  
12 Level B; Don Smith, separation, Level B; James Smith,  
13 incinerator, Level A; Kristal Smith, landfill, Level A;  
14 Theda Smith, landfarm, Level B; Raymond Stinson, landfarm  
15 (SIC), Level B; Hieu Truong, landfarm, Level A; Sherman  
16 Youngblood, landfill, Level B.

17 CHAIRMAN: Repeat Stinson. Did you say landfarm or  
18 landfill?

19 MS. BORDELON: Raymond Stinson, landfill, Level B.

20 CHAIRMAN: Okay. Any other discussion or questions on these  
21 applications for regular certification?

22 MR. BARBER: Offer motion with approval.

23 CHAIRMAN: Motion by Mr. Barber.

24 MR. CREEL: Second.

25 CHAIRMAN: Second by Mr. Creel. Any more discussion? All

1 in favor, signify by saying I. Motion carries. Thank you.  
2 Now, we'll move on to the review of Request for Conditional  
3 certification. We have Mr. Dennis Keith Gibson for C&D,  
4 Type 3, Level A, Vernon Parish and he is replacing the  
5 regular certified operator, Bruce Harris.

6 MR. BARBER: If you look at his work experience on the next  
7 page, from 2013 - 9-3 of 2013 to 12-31 of 2017, he's,  
8 apparently, working for the same people, Vermillion  
9 Parish --

10 MS. BORDELON: Vernon.

11 CHAIRMAN: Vernon Parish.

12 MR. BARBER: Yeah, Vernon Parish. Apparently, he's working  
13 for the same people, but at this particular time, he was  
14 working at the recycle center and I'm not against the  
15 conditional. Let me say that, first, but I'm not sure that  
16 the experience at the recycle center wouldn't qualify him  
17 just as much for a regular as the experience that he has  
18 gotten where he's now working. I mean, if you read what  
19 he's doing, he's mowing the yard and picking up litter and  
20 stuff, and he's actually working at a C&D site, so what - I  
21 guess what I'm suggesting is that I think we could consider  
22 go ahead and offer him a regular certification based on the  
23 experience at the recycle facility and, I mean, this is a  
24 C&D, this is - I mean, he's got more experience fooling with  
25 garbage than the guy that we rejected earlier. Just a



1 suggestion.

2 MS. BORDELON: Well, at this point, can I suggest that you  
3 approve his application for regular but we would need to  
4 issue him a conditional today, because he did not pass the  
5 test, so he would have to retest and he would have to pass  
6 the test in order to be issued a regular.

7 MR. BARBER: Now, he did not test today --

8 MS. BORDELON: He did test today. He did not pass --

9 MR. BARBER: He did test, but he did not pass. Okay.

10 MS. BORDELON: So he would have to be issued a conditional.

11 MR. BARBER: Well, I think probably just go ahead and give  
12 him his conditional --

13 MS. BORDELON: But if you feel like he warrants regular - I  
14 mean, the application warrants regular certification, then  
15 you can approve it for regular now. That way, we don't have  
16 to re-approve it at a later date, once he passes the test.

17 MR. BARBER: And, you know, I don't want our board to start  
18 trying to look into how we can help facilities, but, I mean,  
19 if a facility specifically needs an A level, that's one  
20 thing, but I could definitely go a whole lot more for him  
21 being a regular B level with the experience that he's got,  
22 and he could probably - well, there's no problem, he could  
23 pass the test a lot easier, I would think.

24 CHAIRMAN: Well, the first thing we have is his application  
25 is for a conditional and in lieu of the information Ms.



1 Bordelon just provided us, I'll entertain a motion to  
2 approve the conditional certification.

3 MR. BARBER: I offer a motion we approve the conditional.

4 CHAIRMAN: A motion by Mr. Barber. Second by --

5 MR. FOURRIER: Second.

6 CHAIRMAN: -- Mr. Fourrier. Any other discussion? All in  
7 favor, signify by saying I. Motion carries. All right.

8 Next we have requests for Extension to Conditional

9 Certifications. We have three applicants. Jeddie L.

10 Bankston, C&D, Level B, 108 Disposal; Kenneth C. Newman, C&D

11 Level B, 108 Disposal; Keith W. Daigle, C&D, Level A, 108

12 Disposal. They've all met the requirements for the

13 conditional extension, Ms. Bordelon?

14 MS. BORDELON: Yes, they have. They are all at the workshop  
15 today as well.

16 CHAIRMAN: Okay. Any motion for the extension to  
17 conditional.

18 MS. HENRY: I.

19 CHAIRMAN: Ms. Henry moves. Do I have a second?

20 MR. WYCHE: Second.

21 CHAIRMAN: Second by Mr. Wyche. Any other discussion?

22 MR. HYLTON: Just a question along those lines. Is there  
23 any limit to extensions? Can you do it for ten years?

24 MS. BORDELON: No, once they - once they - they can keep  
25 asking for extensions until they meet the qualifications for

1 a regular, so, in other words, every six months, they can  
2 get an extension and so after four extensions, that's two  
3 years, then --

4 MR. WYCHE: Then they have to test?

5 MS. BORDELON: Well, no, they have to test - they have to  
6 test, regardless, after the first six months to get - the  
7 stipulation for a conditional is that they test and attend a  
8 ten-hour workshop to get the first extension, which they've  
9 already done.

10 CHAIRMAN: And then they continue getting extensions until -  
11 the theory is, they will meet their experience requirements  
12 for a regular certification.

13 MR. HYLTON: Okay. Got it. Thank you.

14 CHAIRMAN: All in favor, signify by saying I. Motion  
15 carried. All right. Next, we have the review of  
16 applications for recertification. I will read them. Dieter  
17 Becker, C&D, Level A; Raywood Buteaux, C&D, Level B; Dianna  
18 Delahoussaye, C&D, Level B; Jerry Frost, landfill, Level B;  
19 Walter Johnson, C&D, Level A; John Helms, landfill, Level A;  
20 Denny Smith, C&D, Level A and a separation, Level A; Jada  
21 Steib, landfill, Level B; Terrance Stewart, landfill, Level  
22 A, surface impoundment, Level A, landfarm, Level A,  
23 incinerator, Level A, refuse-derived fuel facility, Level A,  
24 transfer station, Level A, C&D, Level A, composting, Level  
25 A, separation, Level A; Kristina Suire, C&D, Level A; Ricky

1 Suire, C&D, Level A; Bobby Taylor, C&D, Level B. We have a  
2 motion to approve these applications for recertification.

3 MR. FOURRIER: I motion.

4 CHAIRMAN: Moved by Mr. Fourrier.

5 MR. BARBER: Second.

6 CHAIRMAN: Second by Mr. Barber. Any other discussion? All  
7 in favor, signify by saying I. Motion carried. All right.  
8 We have one incomplete application for recertification.

9 MS. BORDELON: Two.

10 CHAIRMAN: Two, I'm sorry, two. Dusty Braase, landfill,  
11 Level B, Tangipahoa Regional Solid Waste Facility, who is  
12 attending the conference. He's here now to get his last ten  
13 hours, and Joseph Guidry, C&D, Level B, Tommasi Disposal,  
14 attending the October conference for last ten hours of  
15 continuing education credit. Do I have a motion to issue  
16 recertification contingent upon verification that they have  
17 obtained their last ten hours of continuing education  
18 requirements?

19 MR. BARBER: So moved.

20 CHAIRMAN: Move by Mr. Barber.

21 MR. CREEL: Second.

22 CHAIRMAN: Second by Mr. Creel. Any other discussion? All  
23 in favor, signify by saying I. Motion carries. Okay. Now,  
24 we will move on to the issuances of operator certificates.  
25 These are people whose applications have been approved for

1 regular certification and who have passed the exam, and Ms.  
2 Bordelon will read those for us, please.

3 MS. BORDELON: Catherine Chapman, separation, Level B;  
4 Rachel Lacy, separation, Level A; Justin Lennard,  
5 incinerator, Level B; Warren Pagel, landfill, Level B;  
6 Johnny Salard, C&D, Level B; Christopher Smith, landfill,  
7 Level B; Don Smith, separation, Level B; James Smith,  
8 incinerator, Level A; Theda Smith, landfarm, Level B;  
9 Raymond Stinson, landfill, Level B; Hieu Truong, landfarm,  
10 Level A, and Sherman Youngblood, landfill, Level B.

11 CHAIRMAN: Okay. Do I have a motion to issue regular  
12 operator certificates to those persons just listed Ms.  
13 Bordelon?

14 MS. HENRY: Moved.

15 CHAIRMAN: Moved by Ms. Henry.

16 MR. GREENE: I'll second.

17 CHAIRMAN: Second by Mr. Greene. Any other discussion? All  
18 in favor, signify by saying I. Motion carries. Okay.  
19 Next, we'll move on to our committee reports. First would  
20 be our Awards Committee, Mr. Danny Hylton. Do you have a  
21 report for us on the Awards Committee?

22 MR. HYLTON: This young lady does.

23 MS. BORDELON: We have nothing to report at this time.

24 CHAIRMAN: Okay. Testing. Mr. Bo LaGrange, I'll let Ms.  
25 Bordelon give my report.

1 MS. BORDELON: Yes, sixteen tested today, three failed.

2 CHAIRMAN: Have you had any folks coming in to DEQ to take  
3 any exams?

4 MS. BORDELON: Yes, I had two. Theda Smith and Hieu Truong  
5 tested last week.

6 CHAIRMAN: Okay. Thank you for that report. Continuing  
7 Education, Mr. Barber.

8 MR. BARBER: I'll take care of mine myself.

9 MS. BORDELON: Thank you, Troy.

10 MR. BARBER: I had to say that. We had fifty-three  
11 attending the workshop today and our next workshop will be


