12	Here.
13	MS. BORDELON:
14	Danny Hylton?
15	MR. HYLTON:
16	Here.
17	MS. BORDELON:
18	Wes Wyche?
19	MR. WYCHE:
20	Here.
21	MS. BORDELON:
22	Jason Creel?
23	MR. CREEL:
24	Here.
25	MS. BORDELON:

1	David Greene?
2	MR. GREENE:
3	Here.
4	MS. BORDELON:
5	Troy Barber?
6	MR. BARBER:
7	Here.
8	MS. BORDELON:
9	Ricardo de Abreu?
10	DR. de ABREU:
11	Here.
12	MS. BORDELON:
13	Bo Lagrange?
14	MR. LAGRANGE:
15	Here.
16	MS. BORDELON:
17	Gary Bonvillian?
18	MR. BONVILLAIN:
19	Here.
20	Okay. We have a quorum. Matter of
21	fact, we have everybody here today. Okay.
22	First item is review agenda for 2019 LSWA
23	workshop for approval of hours. We have
24	Ms. Yolanda Righteous with the LSWA Board

1	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	Excuse me, Mr. Chairman.
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Yeah.
5	MR. LAGRANGE:
6	What about minutes?
7	MS. BORDELON:
8	You skipped.
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Oh, I sure did. Sorry about that.
11	Okay. We'll put you on hold, Yolanda.
12	MS. RIGHTEOUS:
13	Okie dokie.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Everybody had a chance to review the
16	minutes of the December 8th meeting? Are
17	there any corrections to those minutes?
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	December 7th meeting.
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	What did I say?
22	MR. LAGRANGE:
23	Eighth.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Okay, December 7, 2018 I didn't

1	sleep well last night.
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	I move to accept them
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	Are there any corrections?
6	Okay.
7	MR. LAGRANGE:
8	I move to accept the minutes as
9	presented.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Motion by Mr. Lagrange to accept the
12	minutes as presented.
13	MR. BARBER:
14	Second.
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	Second by Mr. Barber.
17	Any objection to the motion?
18	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
19	passes.
20	Now we'll have the agenda for the
21	workshop hours. Ms. Righteous?
22	MS. RIGHTEOUS:
23	Okay. I think everybody has a copy,
24	right?
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

1 Speak up. 2 MS. RIGHTEOUS: Okay. Everybody has a copy? 3 4 MR. GREENE: 5 Yes. 6 MS. RIGHTEOUS: 7 Okay. Have you-all had a chance to 8 glance at it? No? 9 10 Okay. 11 MR. BONVILLAIN: We just passed it around. You may 12 13 want to go through it. 14 MS. RIGHTEOUS: 15 Okay. Okay. Okay. 16 All right. So, we have our workshop 17 scheduled for July 16th and October 8th. 18 And this is the agenda for both of those 19 workshops. And, as you can see, on the 20 first day we have our OSHA refresher 21 followed by asbestos management. First 22 day we have equipment training and HazCom 23 training. And then, on the second day we 24 had our ethics training, and, actually,

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the last three topics on the first day are

1	topics that have been presented here at
2	this year's well, actually this
3	this conference. We have "I'm here to
4	inspect your landfill." And these are all
5	regional surveillance folks.
6	"The inspection is done What's
7	next?" That's more or less the
8	enforcement process.
9	And then "Compliance at Transfer
10	Stations."
11	So, this is the proposed agenda. If
12	you have questions, I'll try and answer
13	any questions that you may have.
14	This agenda mimics this March agenda.
15	Almost 80 percent of this agenda will
16	carry over to the July and October
17	meeting.
18	MR. BARBER:
19	I offer a motion to approve it.
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	Okay. Motion by Mr. Barber to
22	approve the proposed agenda.
23	Is there a second motion to the
24	motion?
25	MR. GREENE:

1	I second.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Second by Mr. Green.
4	Any further discussion?
5	MR. LAGRANGE:
6	Just to clarify, then that's for ter
7	hours, right?
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	Yeah, it would be for ten hours.
10	MS. RIGHTEOUS:
11	Yes. Ten hours, yes.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Okay. Is there any objection to the
14	motion?
15	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
16	passes.
17	MS. RIGHTEOUS:
18	Thank you.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Next up we have consideration of
21	operator certifications, and we've got a
22	stack to go through this morning, so.
23	First up we have Joshua Bidleman,
24	Landfill, Level B. Any comments or
25	questions about Mr. Bidleman?

1	Okay. Next we'll go to Nicholas
2	Boutte, Landfill, Level B. Any questions
3	on Mr. Boutte?
4	Next we have Ronald Christen,
5	Landfill, Level B.
6	MS. TOWNSEL:
7	I didn't see that he had anything
8	written for education.
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Level B has no requirement there's
11	no educational requirement.
12	MS. TOWNSEL:
13	Okay.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Level A requires a high school
16	diploma.
17	MS. TOWNSEL:
18	All right.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	It would have been nice if he filled
21	it in, but it's
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	Yeah.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Angel Darling, Landfill, Level B.

1	MR. WYCHE:
2	I just noticed that the experience is
3	mostly kind of clerical, but it does
4	include in here profiling and reporting.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Right.
7	MR. WYCHE:
8	Do we consider that to be sufficient
9	for experience?
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Yeah.
12	MR. BARBER:
13	Historically we have, yeah.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	It's all part of the whole process,
16	you know.
17	Next up, Ronald Dartez, C & D, Level
18	A.
19	Okay. Next is Terry Dedon, which is
20	one Ms. Bordelon gave you with the agenda,
21	so if you want to take a minute or two to
22	look at it. It's a DEQ employee.
23	MS. BORDELON:
24	He had been previously certified
25	before. He had just not attended enough

1	classes to recertify so he tested again.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Uh-huh (yes).
4	MR. BARBER:
5	So, did he pass?
6	MS. BORDELON:
7	Yes.
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	Yeah.
10	MR. BARBER:
11	All of them?
12	MS. BORDELON:
13	Yes.
14	MR. BARBER:
15	Wow.
16	MR. HYLTON:
17	He deserves it.
18	MR. BONVILLAIN:
19	What a man.
20	MR. BARBER:
21	And he passed.
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	Yeah.
24	MR. BARBER:
25	Okav.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Okay. Next up is Erick Gomez,
3	Incinerator, Level A.
4	MR. BARBER:
5	I've got a question on him, I think.
6	I'm not sure I'm seeing the experience.
7	MR. BONVILLAIN:
8	Okay. If you look on the on page
9	three, he worked at a water and wastewater
10	treatment facility from sometime in '16
11	until February of '19. And this is the
12	type of facility that he's actually going
13	to be in.
14	MR. LAGRANGE:
15	Also, prior to that, he was at,
16	evidently, this facility.
17	MS. BORDELON:
18	Same facility.
19	DR. de ABREU:
20	Uh-huh (yes).
21	MR. BONVILLAÍN:
22	Right.
23	MR. LAGRANGE:
24	For two years.
25	MR. WYCHE:

1	Do they incinerate their sewage
2	sludge? Is that what this was
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	I believe so, yeah.
5	MR. LAGRANGE:
6	That's correct.
7	MR. BARBER:
8	Well, it I mean, if y'all think
9	that qualifies for experience, I'm I
10	guess it's okay.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	This is one of those facilities
13	that's kind of in the middle of nowhere,
14	really.
15	MR. BARBER:
16	Uh-huh (yes).
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	And it's hard to classify exactly
19	where we're going to put them at, but DEQ
20	requires that they have certified
21	operators, so we kind of try to place them
22	as close as we can according to the
23	certification regulations.
24	MR. BARBER:
25	Okay.

MR. LAGRANGE:
Also, just so you know, if you look
on page four at the top, he holds a lot of
wastewater certifications from DHH, which
you know, tells you the guy's got
experience if he's acquired those
certifications for wastewater plants at
level three and four. And so I think that
helps with the overall experience
MR. BARBER:
Okay.
MR. LAGRANGE:
for that type of for the type
of application or facility he's at.
MR. BARBER:
All right.
MR. BONVILLAIN:
Okay. Next we have Keely Grigsby,
Landfill, Level B.
MR. BARBER:
Did he's got
MR. GREENE:
I think I
MR. BARBER:

-- conditional checked; is that

2	MS. BORDELON:
3	Right. I actually moved that one to
4	the regulars. I felt like maybe she migh
5	qualify for regulars
6	MR. BARBER:
7	Well, I agree.
8	MS. BORDELON:
9	so I moved it to
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Yeah.
12	MS. BORDELON:
13	Yeah.
14	MR. BARBER:
15	Okay. That's my only question then.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	Tammy Lastrapes, Landfill, Level B.
18	Richard Meyer, Landfill, Level A.
19	MR. BARBER:
20	I've got a question on this one. I
21	believe this is the engineer; is that
22	correct?
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	I think you're correct.
25	MR. BARBER:

1	He shows
2	MS. BORDELON:
3	Yeah. And he's had he's got a
4	Level B, that he's had since 2014. He's
5	been a Level B operator.
6	MR. LAGRANGE:
7	So, he's got at least a year
8	experience and a civil engineering degree
9	I think he's that meets his experience
10	requirements.
11	MS. BORDELON:
12	Yeah, you only have to have a B for
13	one year to qualify for an A.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Right.
16	MR. BARBER:
17	Well, it doesn't he doesn't say
18	that he has he says he has a degree,
19	but he doesn't say anything and I know
20	there's a lot of those engineers out ther
21	that
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Well, actually
24	MR. BARBER:
25	has the degree, but didn't pass

1	the exam, you know.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Yeah.
4	MR. BARBER:
5	So, technically, they're not an
6	engineer.
7	MR. BONVILLAIN:
8	But he's got his Level B since '14.
9	MR. BARBER:
10	And that and I didn't notice that,
11	so.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	So, he's yeah, he's got the
14	experience.
15	MR. BARBER:
16	Yeah. He meets it under that. All
17	right. I'm good.
18	MR. BONVILLAIN:
19	Okay. Next up, Todd Merriett,
20	Landfill, Level A and C & D, Level A.
21	MR. BARBER:
22	I put a question mark on this one. I
23	think maybe because he's got conditional
24	checked on
25	MR. GREENE:

1	Right. Both of them.
2	MS. TOWNSEL:
3	Right. Yeah.
4	MR. BARBER:
5	both of those.
6	MS. BORDELON:
7	Uh-huh (yes).
8	MR. WYCHE:
9	His experience would be three years
10	as of this upcoming April 1st.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	Correct. Right. And I think that's
13	why, probably, Suzanne moved it into the
14	regular.
15	MS. BORDELON:
16	Right. Because he's had a
17	conditional since July of 2016.
18	MR. WYCHE:
19	So, maybe he doesn't have the three
20	years as we sit today.
21	MS. BORDELON:
22	He will he will, yeah.
23	MR. BARBER:
24	So, we need to do this separate
25	and

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:	
2	Yeah. That yeah.	
3	MR. LAGRANGE:	
4	put that pending that	
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:	
6	We can	
7	MS. BORDELON:	
8	Well, it's actually April he'll have	4
9	the three years. April 1st.	
10	MR. LAGRANGE:	
11	That's what he's talking about.	
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:	
13	Right.	
14	MS. BORDELON:	
15	Yeah. Okay.	
16	DR. de ABREU:	
17	And when we do this, do they have to	)
18	be tested for the class A?	
19	MS. BORDELON:	
20	He did.	
21	DR. de ABREU:	
22	Okay.	
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:	
24	Yeah, normally we go ahead and make	a
25	motion to approve it upon completion of	

1	the three years coming up.
2	DR. de ABREU:
3	Uh-huh (yes).
4	MR. LAGRANGE:
5	I so move, Mr. Chairman.
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	Okay. Moved by Mr. Lagrange.
8	MR. BARBER:
9	Second.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Second by Mr. Barber.
12	Any objection to the motion?
13	Hearing none, the motion passes.
14	Curtis Morrison, Landfill, Level B.
15	John Ovelia, C & D, Level A.
16	MR. BARBER:
17	I put a question mark here, but I'm
18	not let me look to see what I I'm
19	not sure what I was questioning. It looks
20	like his experience is certain well, so
21	he was a supervisor or a manager and
22	supervised several employees, but that
23	wasn't at a landfill; is that correct?
24	MR. GREENE:
25	It says the Gentilly Landfill.

1	MS. TOWNSEL:
2	Uh-huh (yes).
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Yeah, it was at Gentilly.
5	MR. BARBER:
6	I'm not seeing that.
7	MR. GREENE:
8	It's under his brief work detail
9	history on page two.
10	MS. TOWNSEL:
11	In the description.
12	MR. BARBER:
13	On three?
14	MR. GREENE:
15	Page two.
16	MS. TOWNSEL:
17	Page two at the bottom in the
18	description.
19	MR. BARBER:
20	Well
21	MS. TOWNSEL:
22	And then it references Durr Heavy
23	Construction, as well.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	They have a subcontractor at that

1	facility.
2	MR. BARBER:
3	Yeah, it really don't sound to me
4	like it's landfill operation. It sounds
5	like it was construction. I mean, am I
6	misreading that?
7	MR. WYCHE:
8	It is kind of confusing to me. I
9	know what you're saying.
10	MR. BARBER:
11	Because he's talking about
12	MR. GREENE:
13	It's saying he's not worked
14	MR. BARBER:
15	budget and subcontractors and
16	labor and equipment and project needs
17	and
18	MR. GREENE:
19	My issue was, I don't see where
20	MR. BARBER:
21	And then he goes on to say estimate
22	and manage both public and private
23	demolition projects. So, it don't sound
24	like that's
25	MR. WYCHE:

1	At a landfill.
2	MR. BARBER:
3	at a landfill.
4	MR. LAGRANGE:
5	Well, I think the first sentence is
6	what applies to the landfill in that
7	description.
8	DR. de ABREU:
9	Uh-huh (yes).
10	MS. HENRY:
11	Uh-huh (yes).
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	So, the question becomes, he
14	definitely has at least two years
15	construction experience.
16	MR. BARBER:
17	Okay. Let me read that out loud so
18	I might can let it sink in. Assist in
19	managing and fulfilling the responsibility
20	and duties of Durr Heavy Construction
21	subcontract agreement with Alid, AMID
22	Metro partnership. Then he's got in
23	parentheses Gentilly Landfill.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Right.

1	DR. de ABREU:
2	Uh-huh (yes).
3	MS. HENRY:
4	That's their that's like their
5	name. Like, you know, you'll have one
6	title and the Dutifully Known As or
7	that's their
8	MR. LAGRANGE:
9	Doing Business As.
10	MS. HENRY:
11	Right. That's their that's how
12	they register. All their employees,
13	everything.
14	MR. BARBER:
15	But he goes on and everything he's
16	talking about from there sounds like
17	projects that may or may not be at the
18	landfill. I don't know, I just had a
19	question about it. I'm not clear on it.
20	MS. HENRY:
21	I think it's as Bo says
22	MR. BARBER:
23	He's asking for an A Level for a C
24	D site.
25	MS. HENRY:

1 -- he leads in with where he works. MR. BONVILLAIN: 2 3 One at a time, please. 4 MS. HENRY: 5 I'm sorry. I think it's like Bo said, he leads 6 7 in with where he manages and where he 8 assists and then he goes on to list the 9 duties, like, he gives you a lead sentence with, This is where I do these projects, 10 11 and then he lists the projects that he 12 does. 13 MR. BONVILLAIN: 14 Yes? 15 MR. LAGRANGE: 16 I think you need -- for an A Level 17 you need at least two years construction 18 experience -- three years experience and 19 two years can be construction, one in 20 solid waste; is that correct? MR. BONVILLAIN: 21 22 No. 23 MS. BORDELON: 24 Not --25 MR. BONVILLAIN:

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1	We took that out.
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	Oh, we took it out. Okay.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	On the last rewrite of the regs
6	MR. LAGRANGE:
7	Okay.
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	construction experience doesn't
10	count for the Level A.
11	MR. LAGRANGE:
12	So, it's all solid waste then?
13	MS. BORDELON:
14	Uh-huh (yes).
15	MR. LAGRANGE:
16	Okay.
17	MR. BARBER:
18	Right.
19	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	So, the question becomes, since 2010
21	has he been how must assisting and
22	managing the responsibilities and duties
23	at the Gentilly at that facility?
24	MR. BARBER:
25	Right. And, I mean, it looks like

1	he's been there for nine years with the
2	company, but it doesn't I'm just not
3	seeing anything that satisfies me that he
4	has the experience to be an A Level
5	operator in charge of a site.
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	Okay. Would y'all want to get some
8	more clarification?
9	MR. BARBER:
10	I would love to have more
11	clarification.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Okay. Would you like to make a
14	motion to that effect?
15	MR. BARBER:
16	I will. I'll make a motion that we
17	table this application and ask him to give
18	us some clarity on his experience.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Okay. We have a motion from
21	Mr. Barber to table the application for
22	Mr. John Ovelia until we can get further
23	explanation on his experience.
24	Is there

MR. WYCHE:

1	Second.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Seconded by Mr. Wyche.
4	Any further discussion?
5	MR. LAGRANGE:
6	Just a comment or question. Do we
7	believe he at a minimum would be eligible
8	for a Level B based on this? And we
9	may when we ask him for more
10	information the reason I'm saying that
11	we could also tell him that, potentially,
12	you may
13	MR. BARBER:
14	Well, he's worked for that
15	MR. LAGRANGE:
16	could possibly be approved for a
17	level B. If you think so.
18	MR. BARBER:
19	he's worked for that company
20	for obviously, for nine years but
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	Yeah, it's not the question of the
23	number of years. It's the question of
24	exactly what is the experience.
25	MR. BARBER:

1	Right.
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	Right.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	So, if you're questioning it for the
6	Level A, you'd also have to question it
7	for the Level B.
8	MR. LAGRANGE:
9	Okay. Uh-huh (yes).
10	MR. BARBER:
11	I would, yeah.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Okay.
14	MR. HYLTON:
15	Well, if he passed the A test then
16	that means he knows what he needs to know.
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	Not necessarily.
19	DR. de ABREU:
20	Not necessarily.
21	MR. HYLTON:
22	Okay.
23	DR. de ABREU:
24	You still have to have the
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

1 That's the minimum that -- you know, that they have to do. 2 3 MR. LAGRANGE: 4 Knowledge, yeah. 5 MR. BONVILLAIN: 6 But that doesn't necessarily mean 7 that he meets the experience requirements. 8 MS. HENRY: 9 So, based on the people he lists that 10 he supervises along with the duties that 11 he's listed, that's not enough? 12 MR. BONVILLAIN: 13 That thing is in so fine a print, I 14 didn't even see it. 15 MS. HENRY: 16 Well, he lists that he supervises 17 the -- an operator a foreman, laborers, a 18 superintendent, another operator, as well 19 as a truck driver. And it -- I mean, he 20 listed out. So, if you're supervising all 21 of those people along with this list of 22 detailed duties that he does, I'm not sure 23 why we're pushing it. 24 MR. BARBER:

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Title 46 also in that same place says

that he supervise them in the area of good 1 2 drainage practices, not just the heavy 3 equipment. And, you know, I don't see 4 anything that shows me that. I mean, I 5 don't know what he's done for those nine 6 years. DR. de ABREU: 7 8 I think the question is, he -- the 9 regulations require at least three years 10 of solid waste management experience, so 11 that's exactly what's in the regs. We 12 just need to know from this nine years how 13 many years he has experience -- he has worked with solid waste management. 14 15 MR. BONVILLAIN: 16 Okay. Any further discussion? 17 Okay. Is there any objection to the 18 motion? 19 Ms. Henry, you're free to object if 20 you want to. 21 MS. HENRY: 22 No, I won't. 23 MR. BONVILLAIN: 24 Okay. Hearing no objections, the

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motion passes. This application will be

1	tabled until we can get more clarification
2	on the experience.
3	Next up, Seth Natali, C & D Level B.
4	MR. BARBER:
5	I've got a question on this one.
6	This company it looks like he's worked
7	from this company from '13 to present,
8	is Suzanne, is this a new company
9	that's taken over a C & D site or has this
10	been
11	MS. BORDELON:
12	No, they've been huh-uh (no).
13	It's not new.
14	MR. BARBER:
15	I think the reason I came back and
16	questioned this, I believe further on in
17	the application, maybe in conditionals or
18	something, that I saw several more for
19	this same facility.
20	MS. BORDELON:
21	There's no, I think there's one
22	more.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	Yeah, they had two for that facility
25	MS BORDELON:

1 There's two. 2 MR. BONVILLAIN: 3 One was a Level A, one was a Level B. 4 MR. BARBER: 5 Because I'd initially checked it off 6 as okay and then I came back and put a 7 little question mark. I'm just not quite 8 sure that -- I was --9 MS. BORDELON: 10 I believe his -- maybe his father is 11 certified as a Level A already for this 12 facility, because there's another -- I 13 think that they have two other operators 14 already there at the facility. 15 MR. BARBER: Okay. All right. I'm good. 16 17 MR. BONVILLAIN: 18 Robert Read, Landfill, Level B. 19 Luis Sanchez, Landfill, Level A. 20 Christopher Smith, C & D, Level B. 21 Nicole Soileau, Landfill, Level B. 22 Hector Vasquez, Landfill, Level B. 23 John Vice, Landfill, Level B. 24 Desmond Washington, Landfill, Level

10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Seconded by Mr. Creel.
12	Any objection to the motion?
13	Hearing none, the motion passes.
14	Next up we have a we have review
15	request for conditional certifications.
16	First up Tamisha Jordan, Landfill,
17	Level B, replacing Kristal Smith.
18	MR. BARBER:
19	I put myself a note here and asked
20	why conditional.
21	MS. BORDELON:
22	I think it was because I remember
23	calling them, and from what I recall they
24	needed the her certification now

because she was not going to be able to

1 test until July. 2 MR. BARBER: 3 Oh, so she has not tested? 4 MS. BORDELON: 5 She has not tested. 6 MR. BARBER: 7 Okay. 8 MR. GREENE: 9 That's Tamisha, she works over in 10 Shreveport. She was recently moved to the 11 landfill in replacement of Kristal. 12 Kristal was moved back to Holly division, 13 so she basically our QAC, quality control 14 special waste person there at the 15 landfill. 16 MS. BORDELON: 17 Yeah, so they needed her 18 certification until she can test. 19 MR. GREENE: 20 And right now she's doing dual --21 she's doing all her work at the landfill 22 and then coming in on Saturday and doing 23 billing until we get replacement there. 24 So, that's why she's asking for a

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conditional.

1	MR. BARBER:
2	Okay. I'm good with that.
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Okay. Do I hear a motion to approve
5	MR. BARBER:
6	So moved.
7	MR. BONVILLAIN:
8	Moved by Mr. Barber.
9	MR. CREEL:
10	Second.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	Second by Mr. Creel, that the
13	conditional for Tamisha Jordan be
14	approved. Any objections to the motion?
15	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
16	passes.
17	Okay. Richard LeBouef, Landfill,
18	Level A.
19	MR. BARBER:
20	Well, I've never written this across
21	one before, but I wrote across the front
22	of this one "Absolutely not."
23	Y'all we gonna put somebody in
24	charge of a landfill, and especially a
25	landfill like Gary Bonvillain used to

manage, with a reputation like it has, we can't give him a conditional. He has got to have some experience.

## MR. BONVILLAIN:

Actually, he has met the requirements for a conditional. He is replacing a regularly certified operator.

### MR. BARBER:

Well, I understand that.

#### MR. BONVILLAIN:

And I will tell you this, I've talked to Mr. LeBouef several times, and there is no grass growing under his feet. He has already taken quite a few steps to improve the operations, and he is learning by leaps and bounds on what he has to do, and I keep an eye on him myself.

## MR. BARBER:

Well -- and, I mean, I still think, you know, I understand replacing, and that is -- to me that should be the only way you can give a conditional, but on the A Level, managing a facility like that -- and I understand you and I -- you know I respect you, Gary.

2	Okay.
3	MR. BARBER:
4	And I respect your opinion, and the
5	fact that you are keeping an eye on him,
6	but I'm sitting over there in Washington
7	Parish. I don't know what this guy is
8	doing.
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Right. No, I understand that.
11	MR. BARBER:
12	His paperwork tells me he does not
13	have the experience.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Right. But, again, the only
16	requirement of the regulations to get a
17	conditional is that you are replacing a
18	regularly certified operator, which he is
19	doing.
20	MR. BARBER:
21	And, I agree with that. And this
22	Board probably should take a step to
23	eliminate the A Level conditional, period.
24	And, I know that don't have anything to do

with this.

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# 1 MR. BONVILLAIN: Right. 3 MR. BARBER: 4 But we probably should, just because 5 this guy may be all right. You say he is, I'm -- I totally respect that, but for my 6 7 part, I don't know. MR. BONVILLAIN: 8 Yeah. And I understand. 9 10 MR. St. Landry Landfill way back to when you manage it yourself, Gary. And just the way that it's managed, with the commission and everything, I have a great, great respect for it, but didn't these -- this management realize that these people were going to retire, and start bringing people along behind them that could take their place, step into that position --

# MR. BONVILLAIN:

They --

#### MR. BARBER:

-- as a qualified -- not come to us and ask us to help them with these conditionals.

#### MR. BONVILLAIN:

Yeah, they do have -- and I don't know what the number is -- but they do have regularly certified operators besides these. I don't know the numbers are right now, because there's a lot of them that -- of those individuals I don't know, but these are not the only certified operators

1	that they're going to have on-site. They
2	do have regularly certified operators that
3	have met their experience requirement.
4	MR. LAGRANGE:
5	And I think, as Gary said before, the
6	management knew there was a provision in
7	the regs that allowed them, these new
8	employees, to get a conditional if they're
9	replacing someone, so maybe because they
10	knew that that's why they didn't say,
11	Well, we've got to get people.
12	DR. de ABREU:
13	Uh-huh (yes).
14	MR. BARBER:
15	More reason we need to move away
16	from
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	Well, I'm just saying that's probably
19	why the crew isn't questioning the
20	management and why they didn't kind of
21	plan ahead
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Also, what happened
24	MR. LAGRANGE:
25	but if they knew they had this in

1	their pocket, they didn't need to do that.
2	DR. de ABREU:
3	Right.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	The director that had succeeded me
6	died about two years ago, two and half
7	years ago, and so one of the longtime
8	employees was appointed as the director,
9	basically as a caretaker position, because
10	he was ready to retire himself
11	MR. BARBER:
12	Uh-huh (yes).
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	until they brought in somebody
15	else that would be able to take it over.
16	And these retirements most well,
17	actually all of these retirements happened
18	during the caretaker's reign, if you will.
19	MR. BARBER:
20	Okay. All right. I'm good.
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	Okay. Do I hear a motion to approve
23	Mr. Kevin Celestine's conditional?
24	MR. CREEL:
25	So moved.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Moved by Mr. Creel.
3	MR. CREEL:
4	Yep.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Second by who?
7	MR. LAGRANGE:
8	Second.
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Oh, by Mr. Greene.
11	MR. LAGRANGE:
12	Oh, he did?

5	Any objection to the motion?
6	Okay. Hearing
7	MS. BORDELON:
8	And look who we have here.

Titus. 1 MS. BORDELON: 3 -- and the owner and Titus, who has a conditional. Yeah, just two. 4 5 MR. LAGRANGE: 6 And that's two Bs? 7 MS. BORDELON: 8 No. One A and one B. 9 MR. LAGRANGE: 10 An A and a B. 11 MR. WYCHE: 12 Is there any -- are there reasons for 13 granting a conditional other than 14 replacing? 15 MR. BONVILLAIN: 16 If, in the opinion of the Board, the 17 individual has some type of experience 18 where it not necessarily meets everything 19 according to the normal regulations, but 20 you feel that experience is sufficient, 21 that you could grant him a conditional, 22 particularly if the site is short of 23 certified operators. And that's a 24 decision based strictly on what the Board

25

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wants to do. Okay. He does not meet an

1 automatic conditional qualification. So, this is like Mr. Barber says, look at his 2 3 experience and whether or not you think he 4 should be granted a conditional. 5 MR. BARBER: 6 I mean, he's been there two months --7 three months, and before that he worked for Wilson Construction doing a little 9 dozer work, bobcat work, with some 10 excavator. 11 MR. LAGRANGE: 12 I see the comment. Evidently, it was 13 a -- they had a C & D, Trahans had a C & D in New Iberia -- in Iberia Parish. 14 15 MR. BONVILLAIN: 16 Right. 17 MR. LAGRANGE: 18 And according to this e-mail, evidently, Mr. Trahan was part of that 19 20 family, as they said, as a young kid he 21 grew up at that facility that is family 22 operated. 23 MR. BONVILLAIN: Well, see, but on his actual 24 25 experience, he doesn't list that he worked

1	at that facility.
2	MS. HENRY:
3	Uh-huh (yes).
4	DR. de ABREU:
5	And I think they give just why they
6	need him as a conditional, I mean, when
7	you have a conditional if the facility
8	wants to tell, We are short of people
9	here, and we need to have one more person
LO	they can get them.
11	MR. LAGRANGE:
12	Just to clarify, Suzanne, they have
13	two regular certified operators and one
L4	conditionally certified?
15	MS. BORDELON:
16	No, I think it's just the one, the
17	one regular and the conditional.
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	Titus is the conditional?
20	MS. BORDELON:
21	Uh-huh (yes).
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Okay. Anybody like to make a motion
24	in either direction?
25	MR LAGRANGE:

1	And I see they scheduled testing for
2	both of them. Did they test, Suzanne?
3	MR. WYCHE:
4	What is the downside to him
5	MS. BORDELON:
6	Yes.
7	MR. WYCHE:
8	not getting a conditional?
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	Titus I mean, Trahan did, Titus
11	didn't.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	In the the regulations require
14	that, yeah, while you're actually
15	operating, you have to have at least one
16	Level B on-site. And if you only have two
17	employees, say one gets sick, then the
18	other one is stuck. He can't take any
19	time off at all. This is the reason that
20	I think that they are requesting it.
21	DR. de ABREU:
22	Uh-huh (yes).
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	He doesn't specifically say that, but
25	that's normally the situation.

	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	Mr. Chairman, I Suzanne indicates
3	Mr. Trahan did take the test and passed
4	it, although we said, you know, that's no
5	the you know, the final blessings, so
6	to speak for getting a certification, but
7	you know, considering what we're looking
8	at here and that he passed the exam, I'd
9	like to move to grant the conditional.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Okay. We have a motion from
12	Mr. Lagrange to grant the conditional for
13	Arthur Trahan. Is there a second to the
14	motion.
15	MR. WYCHE:
16	I'll second.

24	Bo Lagrange?
25	MR. LAGRANGE:

1 Yes. 2 MR. BONVILLAIN: 3 Okay. Motion fails, six to two. 4 MR. LAGRANGE: 5 Five to three. Had three yays. MR. BONVILLAIN: 6 7 You, you, and --8 MR. LAGRANGE: 9 And Jason. 10 MS. HENRY: 11 Jason. 12 MR. BONVILLAIN: 13 Oh, okay. And Jason. Okay. I'm 14 sorry. Five to three. Motion fails. 15 MR. BARBER: 16 What I would like to do is ask this 17 guy to come back to the Board. I 18 personally would like to -- for him to 19 come in and meet with us. I would like to 20 know what he knows from growing up in a C & D landfill. You know, you can write 21 22 anything you want to on paper. And so, if 23 he wants to do that in July, I would 24 certainly entertain it, but, you know,

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under the condition that, you know, I go

3	Yeah.
4	MR. BARBER:
5	If we want to, you know, maybe want
6	to contact him and ask him to attend the
7	next Board meeting and
8	DR. de ABREU:
9	I think we just need some more
10	information about him, that's my or why
11	the facility needs to have another one.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Okay.
14	DR. de ABREU:
15	He is not clear here.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	Right.
18	DR. de ABREU:
19	And I don't want to make a decision.
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	Can you send a letter out?
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	Uh-huh (yes).
24 .	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Good. Ms. Bordelon will take care of

1	sending a letter out.
2	MR. GREENE:
3	Are we sending a letter out to have
4	him show up or just supply more
5	information? I'm just concerned you're
6	setting a precedent of having everybody
7	have to come up here. I mean, we've
8	agreed
9	MR. BARBER:
10	No, not necessarily.
11	MR. HYLTON:
12	We don't want to do personal
13	interviews. We go by the
14	MR. LAGRANGE:
15	Exactly.
16	MR. GREENE:
17	I think if he clarifies his training,
18	because everything I've approved has been
19	on writing.
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	Right. And clarify the need
22	MR. GREENE:
23	Correct. Uh-huh (yes).
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	for the facility to have him.

# DR. de ABREU:

For the facility to have him.

# MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay. Next up is James Dickerson.

He's coming under Transfer Station, Level

A. Again, this is one of those facilities
that's kind of in the air, and we're
trying to plug them into our testing
situation.

### MR. BARBER:

The note I put on mine is this -- the Board's not -- it's not the Board's job to help these facilities meet compliance.

You know, I'm sorry, but that's not what we're here for. It's our job to make sure that we're putting qualified people in these positions, and if they are coming asking us for all of these conditional certifications, it's telling me they don't have qualified people. And this particular one looks like he has been there since October.

#### MR. LAGRANGE:

The -- if you read those two letters, the first letter from CK Associates, which

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I assume is their consultant working on their permit renewal or their permit, they indicate they're asking for an exemption from their permit to have certified operators because they never previously had to have them.

### MR. BARBER:

Right.

### MR. LAGRANGE:

And then they indicate that -Dickerson says that the permit writer
responded they would be required to have
certified operators. So, they never had
them before, so -- and they've been
operating. And now they were told they
had to get a DEQ permit.

### MR. WYCHE:

A tough set of circumstances for the company.

### MR. LAGRANGE:

Right. So, that's kind of the situation that, it wasn't necessarily they failed to be proactive in making sure they had certified operators, it was something where they got caught in their permit

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1 renewal or a new permit. You know, that's 2 what I read in it. 3 DR. de ABREU: 4 So, the reason is because they -- I 5 mean, they include a new process in 6 their -- I mean, they were a Transfer Station that didn't require, now they 7 8 require to have certification? Is that --9 is that the reason? 10 MS. TOWNSEL: 11 I don't think they were aware that they needed to have it and they've been 12 13 operating all this time. So, when it's 14 time for the permit renewal to come up, and they go through this, and they get 15 16 the, you know, deed saying that you need 17 this. Now they're like, okay, so that's 18 the situation there. 19 MR. BONVILLAIN: 20 Is this a new facility --21 MS. TOWNSEL: 22 No. 23 MR. BONVILLAIN: 24 -- or a renewal?

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MS. TOWNSEL:

This is a renewal. 1 MR. BONVILLAIN: 2 3 Okay. So, they've been operating all 4 these years without having been required 5 to have a certified operator? 6 MS. TOWNSEL: 7 From my understanding. Not having --8 not that they didn't -- they weren't 9 required. I think that our testing -- and 10 that was one thing I wanted to bring up 11 at, you know, a little later today, the 12 testing that we require for the type II As 13 are either incinerator or transfer 14 stations. They're neither. But they're 15 like, Which one are we closer to? 16 Because it is required in the 17 regulations that type II A facilities have 18 to have these operators. So, I told them 19 the closest that you have is the Transfer 20 Station. So, now they're trying to come 21 into compliance in that way? MR. BONVILLAIN: 22 23 Okay. Exactly what kind of facility is it? 24

MR. CREEL:

1 That was my question. 2 MS. TOWNSEL: 3 I think they are like a grease trap processor, where they take the grease trap 4 and separate the solids from the green --5 6 green -- brown grease, yellow grease, that 7 type of thing, take whatever is usable, 8 dispose whatever is not. So, it's like 9 the testing that we have for it right now doesn't fall into either one. So, I 10 11 would --12 MR. LAGRANGE: 13 If you read on here it says that they receive grease trap waste, treat and 14 process the material, discharge the clean 15 16 and treated water to the City of Kenner, 17 send the grease waste to the 18 solidification disposal sites. 19 MR. BONVILLAIN: 20 Okay. So -- and this is a renewal. 21 It's not a new permit? 22 MS. TOWNSEL: 23 No, it's not new. 24 MR. BONVILLAIN:

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So they've got operators that have

25

1	been working there, don't they?
2	MS. TOWNSEL:
3	I'm not certain what they have. The
4	do have operators. I'm not sure exactly
5	what they have on their staff right now,
6	but it must not be what we're asking the
7	normal type II A facilities to have.
8	MR. LAGRANGE:
9	Well, I think what Gary's getting to
10	is they've had a permit and they're
11	supposed to have operators, why DEQ has
12	never forced it on them in the past. Is
13	that your question, Gary?
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Well, not only that, but what I'm
16	saying is, if they've been operating all
17	these years they should have people on
18	staff that would meet the experience
19	requirements.
20	MR. BARBER:
21	It would seem like.
22	MS. TOWNSEL:
23	They should. And I think that they
24	didn't think that they needed it, and I'm

not sure if no one's gone out there since

then and has noticed it. I'm not certain what's transpired between then and there.

DR. de ABREU:

Okay. But I have a question. Why
they are being required to be on type II A
Transfer Station, because clearly they
don't -- they are not a Transfer Station
to me.

# MR. BONVILLAIN:

Correct.

### DR. de ABREU:

And the regulations don't require

type II A processing to have a certified

operator. They ask for type II A

facilities -- incinerator, waste

facility -- refuse derived fuel

facilities, and Transfer Stations. So, to

me it doesn't require to have an operator.

That's my take on that.

#### MR. BONVILLAIN:

And I think -- and I kind of agree with you, but I think what happened is that the permit writer at DEQ said, You will have to have certified operators.

Even though it doesn't fit into the

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1	category of the areas that we certify.
2	MR. GREENE:
3	That's what the both the letters
4	state.
5	MR. WYCHE:
6	What kind of permit do they have now?
7	DR. de ABREU:
8	So, to me, what good is going to have
9	him to them to have a type II A
10	Transfer Station if they don't do that?
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	I agree with you.
13	MS. TOWNSEL:
14	The thing is, the way the regulations
15	are written right now it says type II A
16	permitted facilities need to have
17	certified operators. It doesn't say "if
18	you're an incinerator," "if you're a
19	Transfer Station," "and you don't have to
20	have one if you are a grease trap
21	operator."
22	DR. de ABREU:
23	Uh-huh (yes).
24	MS. TOWNSEL:

So, the regulations need to be

clarified or we need to come up with a test specifically for grease trap facilities.

### MR. GREENE:

Well, you've got two issues here.

You've got one that the DEQ is telling
them on April 9th of 2018 they have one
year. So, there just trying to squeeze by
that right now. So, that's one year.

But, I mean, liquid environmentals
theirselves say that to get the type A on
Title 46, a minimum of two years
certification as an operator has been
there, but then they expressly say that
their people do not meet these
requirements.

#### MR. BONVILLAIN:

That's what -- the part to me that's confusing is that -- and first off, it takes three years not two for a Level A -- but if they've got operators that have been operating at the facility, it seems like they would have somebody that's been there that would have the experience that could apply for a certificate.

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1	MR. GREENE:
2	Well, they even state theirself that
3	none of their operators meet the
4	qualifications.
5	MS. TOWNSEL:
6	The operators that they have there
7	now are specific for their grease trap
8	operations. The test that we have right
9	now are specific for either Incinerator or
10	Transfer Station.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	Okay.
13	MS. TOWNSEL:
14	So, that's probably why they say that
15	the ones they have don't qualify.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	But see, what we're looking at right
18	now is experience.
19	MS. TOWNSEL:
20	Right.
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	Regardless of what test
23	MS. TOWNSEL:
24	Right.
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

1	they're going to end up taking.
2	And if they've been operating this
3	facility, unless they have a high
4	turnover, I would think that they should
5	have some operators on site that would
6	have the necessary experience to where
7	they could qualify for a regular
8	certificate, rather than asking for a
9	conditional.
10	MR. CREEL:
11	They also have two facilities in our
12	state. Has anybody checked into that?
13	They have about 30 facilities
14	nationwide, and they have one in
15	Shreveport and one in Kenner.
16	MR. WYCHE:
17	Lake Charles, too.
18	MR. CREEL:
19	Here in the state of Louisiana.
20	MR. WYCHE:
21	Nevermind.
22	MR. CREEL:
23	So, I didn't know if they had
24	operators at another site. I was just
25	looking online on what they actually do.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Okay. So, they do have two other
3	facilities in the state?
4	MR. CREEL:
5	Uh-huh (yes).
6	MR. GREENE:
7	They have one in Shreveport.
8	MR. CREEL:
9	They have one in Shreveport. One in
10	Shreveport, one in Kenner. And they do
11	have I think I counted 32 or 33 across
12	the nation. They're headquartered out of
13	California.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Okay. Suzanne, do you know if they
16	have certified operators at the Shreveport
17	facility?
18	MS. BORDELON:
19	No, I don't. I don't think they do,
20	so.
21	MR. GREENE:
22	Because this gentleman's only been
23	there since October of '18.
24	MR. CREEL:
25	Right.

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### MR. GREENE:

And it's not showing -- well, of course, his next job is -- well, he's an oil field chemical distributor, but they're just not giving us a whole lot to go on --

### MR. LAGRANGE:

Has he --

## MR. GREENE:

-- to approve it, in my opinion.

# MR. CREEL:

For a Transfer Station.

# MR. GREENE:

Correct.

#### MR. HYLTON:

Well, look at the definition of II A, though. It says -- if I can find it -- facility used for processing residential, infectious, or commercial waste. And in parentheses it defines a little better, but that's what they do. They process waste. And so they should have a II A permit, and they should have II A operators.

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1	Uh-huh (yes).
2	MR. BARBER:
3	I'm going to offer a motion we deny
4	this application.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Okay. We have a motion from
7	Mr. Barber to deny the request for
8	conditional for James Dickerson with
9	Liquid Environmental Solutions.
10	Is there a second to the motion?
11	MR. HYLTON:
12	(indicating)
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	Seconded by Mr. Hylton.
15	Okay. Any further discussion?
16	Okay. We'll go ahead and have a role
17	call vote again.
18	MS. BORDELON:
19	Okay. Connie Henry?
20	MS. HENRY:
21	No.
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	Danny Hylton?
24	MR. HYLTON:
25	No.

1	MS. BORDELON:
2	Wes Wyche?
3	MR. WYCHE:
4	No.
5	MS. BORDELON:
6	Jason Creel?
7	MR. CREEL:
8	No.
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	David Greene?
11	MR. GREENE:
12	No.
13	MS. BORDELON:
14	Troy Barber?
15	MR. BARBER:
16	Are we 'no'ing to the motion?
17	MS. HENRY:
18	No.
19	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	No, I think
21	MR. GREENE:
22	It's the approval.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	Let's start over and clarify.
25	MR. LAGRANGE:

1	No, you're voting against his motion
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Let's start over and clarify to make
4	sure everybody's on the same page. The
5	motion is to deny. If you're voting yes
6	then you're voting against the motion,
7	you're not voting against the conditional
8	MR. LAGRANGE:
9	No, wait wait. If you vote
10	it's the other way around.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	You're voting against if you vote
13	no, you're voting you're not voting
14	against the conditional, you're voting
15	against the motion, because the motion is
16	to deny.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	All right.
19	MR. CREEL:
20	Yes. Okay.
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	So, if you want to deny it, you have
23	to vote yes on the motion.
24	MR. WYCHE:
25	So, we should probably start over.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	We're going to start over. Just to
3	make sure everybody's clear. Okay. So,
4	if you want to deny the request, you vote
5	yes. Okay. Ms. Bordelon.
6	MS. BORDELON:
7	Okay. Connie Henry?
8	MS. HENRY:
9	No.
10	MS. BORDELON:
11	Danny Hylton?
12	MR. HYLTON:
13	Yes.
14	MS. BORDELON:
15	Wes Wyche?
16	MR. WYCHE:
17	Yes.
18	MS. BORDELON:
19	Jason Creel?
20	MR. CREEL:
21	Yes.
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	David Greene?
24	MR. GREENE:
25	Yes.

1	MS. BORDELON:
2	Troy Barber?
3	MR. BARBER:
4	Yes.
5	MS. BORDELON:
6	Ricardo de Abreu?
7	DR. de ABREU:
8	Yes.
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	Bo Lagrange?
11	MR. LAGRANGE:
12	Yes.
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	Okay. Motion passes, eight to
15	seven to one to deny the request for a
16	conditional on James Dickerson.
17	MR. GREENE:
18	I got I've just got one question
19	so the Board is not I'm not meaning
20	liable or but, I totally agree with
21	what we did, but it seems like the DEQ is
22	putting Liquid Environmental Solutions in
23	a very
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Precarious.

1	MR. GREENE:
2	precarious decision (sic), and I
3	just don't like us having to enforce the
4	DEQ I mean, I want to follow DEQ's
5	rules and regs to the max, but this is
6	something they're throwing on us that
7	could potentially shut them down.
8	MS. TOWNSEL:
9	Uh-huh (yes).
10	MR. GREENE:
11	Or get them fined.
12	MR. HYLTON:
13	Yeah. Right.
14	MS. HENRY:
15	Uh-huh (yes).
16	MR. GREENE:
17	But, I mean, in good conscience, we
18	did what we from what we're given, but
19	where does that place us
20	MR. BARBER:
21	But listen
22	MR. GREENE:
23	in the grand scheme? We just
24	don't worry about it?
25	MR. BARBER:

1	I've been on this Board 13 years. It
2	has never one time crossed my mind to do
3	anything but make sure that these
4	operators are qualified. That's our job.
5	MR. GREENE:
6	Uh-huh (yes). I agree with that.
7	MR. BARBER:
8	If it causes a facility to shut down,
9	that is not on us.
10	MR. GREENE:
11	Well, that's that was what I'm
12	trying to clarify.
13	MR. BARBER:
14	It's not on us.
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	It
17	MR. BARBER:
18	We just need to do our job and make
19	sure that they meet the qualifications.
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	And it's not the Board's
22	responsibility to provide certified
23	operators.
24	MR. GREENE:
25	Correct. And that's what I'm getting

1	at.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Now, also
4	MR. GREENE:
5	But it just seems like the DEQ is
6	throwing this back on the Board; is that
7	not correct?
8	MS. TOWNSEL:
9	No. We're not throwing it on the
10	Board at all.
11	MR. GREENE:
12	Okay.
13	MS. TOWNSEL:
14	We're letting them know, according to
15	the regulations, type II A facilities need
16	to have certified operators, period.
17	MR. GREENE:
18	So, you enforce this afterwards?
19	MS. TOWNSEL:
20	Uh-huh (yes).
21	MR. WYCHE:
22	What seems strange to me is this
23	company, I'm guessing, may very well have
24	a lot of employees that are very
25	experienced at processing grease trap

1	waste. So, they may be very experienced
2	in doing what they do and what they're
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	And that was my point all along, is
5	that I feel they probably have operators
6	that have the necessary experience to
7	operate that facility.
8	MR. WYCHE:
9	To do what they do.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	But that's not what that's what I
12	was asking for. He's just been there a
13	short time.
14	MR. HYLTON:
15	Just get someone else to apply within
16	the company.
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	That's that was my point exactly.
19	Another point, Ms. Townsel, I think we
20	need to go ahead and draw up another test
21	for processing facilities
22	MS. TOWNSEL:
23	Yes.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	II A processing facilities.

1	MS. TOWNSEL:
2	Yes. I agree. How can we get that
3	started?
4	DR. de ABREU:
5	Then we revise the regulations.
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	Well, the regulations
8	DR. de ABREU:
9	It says for type II A facilities. It
10	doesn't include processing.
11	MR. HYLTON:
12	Yes, it does.
13	MS. TOWNSEL:
14	That was written a long time ago.
15	Maybe we can amend those.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	On the testing on the
18	certification regulations, correct.
19	MS. TOWNSEL:
20	Maybe we can amend the current
21	guidelines that we have to include that
22	type of testing for type II A facilities.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	Right. Yeah. We'll have to amend
25	the regs have to get the regs amended.

1	You will spearhead that for us?
2	MS. TOWNSEL:
3	Certainly.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	Okay. If you need any help, yell at
6	Mr. Lagrange and Dr. de Abreu. Okay.
7	That was Dickerson.
8	Next we have Steven Wayne Gomez.
9	Again, this is let's see what his
10	experience this is with Liquid
11	Environmental, also. He's requesting a
12	Level B, but he's been employed there
13	since February of '16 to the present, so
14	he's got three years of experience. That
15	would qualify for regular A.
16	MR. GREENE:
17	And this is at the same facility.
18	MR. BONVILLAIN:
19	Same facility.
20	MR. GREENE:
21	Yeah. And that would put them in
22	compliance with the DEQ
23	MS. TOWNSEL:
24	Uh-huh (yes).
25	MR. GREENE:

1	and all of us.
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	Depends if he took an exam, though.
4	MR. GREENE:
5	Yeah. If he had, right.
6	MR. CREEL:
7	Upon completion of the test, if he
8	passed it.
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	Yeah.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	They have not applied to test, have
13	they?
14	MS. BORDELON:
15	All three tested, and this is the one
16	that of the three that did not pass the
17	test.
18	MR. BARBER:
19	You have to be kidding.
20	MS. TOWNSEL:
21	Great.
22	MR. GREENE:
23	I'm trying to help them out.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Okay.

1	MR. GREENE:
2	You're killing me, Smalls.
3	MR. CREEL:
4	That's right.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Testing aside for right now, would
7	anybody like to make a motion to
8	approve
9	MR. CREEL:
10	I don't even know
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	the application for a regular
13	certification. This is just
14	MR. BARBER:
15	Upon passing
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	approving the application
18	MR. BARBER:
19	Yeah.
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	no, no. You're approving the
22	application. He's got to pass the test to
23	get certified.
24	MR. BARBER:
25	Uh-huh (ves).

1	MR. GREENE:
2	Well, I'll make a motion to approve
3	the application.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	Right. Okay. Motion by Mr. Green to
6	approve the application.
7	MR. LAGRANGE:
8	For?
9	MR. BARBER:
10	As a regular?
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	For a regular certification
13	MR. LAGRANGE:
14	Level?
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	Level A.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	Okay. He applied for B, but since
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Well, he's got the experience to
21	go
22	MR. LAGRANGE:
23	Okay. Just making
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	for Level A. The Board is trying

1	to help them out as much as we can within
2	the guidelines, the regulations. Okay.
3	We have a motion by Mr. Greene.
4	Is there a second?
5	MR. CREEL:
6	Second.
7	MR. BONVILLAIN:
8	Second by Mr. Creel that Steven
9	Gomez's application for a regular Level A
10	certification be approved.
11	Any objection to the motion?
12	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
13	passes.
14	Okay. The next one is Dustin
15	McClendon with Level B, Liquid
16	Environmental Solutions. And I think
17	we're
18	MR. BARBER:
19	I'm not seeing the experience.
20	DR. de ABREU:
21	Uh-huh (yes). It's the same thing.
22	MR. GREENE:
23	He's the same as the first one.
24	MR. BARBER:
25	I offer a motion we deny it.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Okay. A motion by Mr. Barber to deny
3	the conditional request for Mr. Dustin
4	McClendon. Is there a second to the
5	motion?

5	and these are all of these
6	conditional certifications or regular
7	certifications?
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	I would assume they're regular.
10	MS. BORDELON:
11	Yeah, I think these are all regulars.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Yeah.
14	MR. LAGRANGE:
15	Okay. I just wanted to
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	Okay. Is there any objection to the
18	motion to deny the request for
19	conditional?
20	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
21	passes.
22	Okay. Jamar Grant, Incinerator,
23	Level B, Stericycle.
24	MR. LAGRANGE:
25	I moved to deny.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Okay. A motion by Mr. Lagrange to
3	deny the request.
4	MR. BARBER:
5	Second.
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	Seconded by Mr. Barber.
8	MS. HENRY:
9	Taking up for Troy.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Any discussion?
12	Any objection to the motion?
13	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
14	passes.
15	Next up William Noegel, I guess
16	that's pronounced, Landfill, Level B,
17	Vermilion Parish Police Jury.
18	MR. BARBER:
19	Do we know the history on why they're
20	needing a conditional here?
21	MR. WYCHE:
22	His the cover letter.
23	DR. de ABREU:
24	Here's the cover letter.
25	MR. BARBER:

1	Well, but I mean
2	DR. de ABREU:
3	Is he replacing anyone?
4	MS. BORDELON:
5	No.
6	DR. de ABREU:
7	He doesn't say anything here.
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	It appears to be that, you know, he's
10	basically the supervisor, being the Public
11	Work Director. And it seems like he would
12	like a certification since the people
13	under him have to be certified. To me,
14	that's what it boils down to.
15	MS. BORDELON:
16	Yeah.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	Well, he says his Police Jury asked
19	him to get it in his cover letter.
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	Yeah. But, you know, consider the
22	experience and you may want to consider
23	issuing a regular or approving a regular
24	application.

MR. BARBER:

1	Well
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	That's entirely up to the Board.
4	MR. BARBER:
5	I think I would rather do that than I
6	had and then him has he tested,
7	Suzanne?
8	MS. BORDELON:
9	This is yes, he passed.
10	MR. BARBER:
11	He passed?
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	Level B?
14	MS. BORDELON:
15	Yes.
16	MR. WYCHE:
17	He himself says he doesn't have the
18	experience, but maybe we can disagree with
19	that.
20	MR. BARBER:
21	Well, I mean, am I missing am I
22	missing something? I mean, I know he has
23	been with that with the parish since
24	2004, which is 15 years.

MR. CREEL:

1	He supervised the solid waste
2	supervisor as Director of Public Works.
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Yeah, basically as Director of Public
5	Works, the landfill fell under him.
6	DR. de ABREU:
7	Uh-huh (yes).
8	MS. HENRY:
9	Uh-huh (yes).
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	He was the overall supervisor.
12	MR. BARBER:
13	And he's asking for conditional B, so
14	I think he qualifies for a regular B.
15	MR. LAGRANGE:
16	I move
17	MR. GREENE:
18	I second.
19	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	we approve the application for a
21	regular certificate, Level B.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Okay.
24	MR. HYLTON:
25	I second.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Motion by Mr. Lagrange, seconded by
3	Ms. Henry that we approve Mr. Noegel's
4	application as a regular application,
5	Level B.
6	Any objection to the motion?
7	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
8	passes.
9	Okay. Conditional extension
10	requests.
11	Jeddie Bankston, C & D, Level B, 108
12	Disposal. Brandon Murray, C & D, Level B,
13	108 Disposal. Keith Daigle, C & D, Level
14	A, 108 Disposal. David Woodson, Landfill,
15	Level B, St. Landry Parish Landfill.
16	Russell Schilling, Landfill, B, Landworks,
17	Inc.
18	All the individuals have done their
19	required testing and training?
20	MS. BORDELON:
21	Yes.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Okay.
24	MR. LAGRANGE:
25	I move to grant the extensions to the

1	conditionals.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Okay. A motion by Mr. Lagrange to
4	grant the above named conditional
5	extension requests.
6	Is there a second?
7	DR. de ABREU:
8	Second.
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Second by Dr. de Abreu. Any
11	objection to the motion?
12	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
13	passes.
14	Okay. Next we have a review a
15	request from David O'Mary for
16	certification by reciprocity.
17	MR. BARBER:
18	He's got a MOLO certification, and
19	historically the Board has always honored
20	the MOLO, certification which is certified
21	by the
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	SWANA.
24	MR. BARBER:
25	SWANA. And I know, personally

15	recertifications, Mr. Donald Colona,
16	Landfill, Level A, Tangipahoa Parish. And
17	he is attending, because he was given an
18	award yesterday, so.
19	Gary Jackson, C & D, Level A,
20	Natchitoches Parish. Is he attending?
21	MS. HENRY:
22	Yes.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	Yes? Okay.
25	Do I hear a motion to approve these

1	applications upon submittal of their hours
2	for this session here?
3	MR. BARBER:
4	So moved.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Moved by Mr. Barber.
7	MR. WYCHE:
8	Second.
9	MR. BONVILLAIN:
10	Seconded by Mr. Wyche.
11	MR. WYCHE:
12	Yeah.
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	Yeah. Okay. Any discussion?
15	Any objection to the motion?
16	Okay. Hearing none, the motion

19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Okay. Do I hear a motion to move
21	issuance of certificates?
22	MS. HENRY:
23	So moved.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Moved by Ms. Henry.

1	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	Second.
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Seconded by Mr. Lagrange. Any
5	discussion?
6	Any objection to the motion?
7	Hearing none, the motion passes.
8	Okay. Committee reports.
9	Awards, Mr. Hilton?
10	MR. BARBER:
11	Mr. Chairman?
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Yes.
14	MR. BARBER:
15	Before we get to that, I had I
16	received a thing from Suzanne on some
17	hours that I can't pronounce this guy's
18	name
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Hieu Truong?
21	MS. BORDELON:
22	It's on the agenda.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	It's further down on the agenda.
25	MR. BARBER:

1 Okay. Nevermind. 2 MR. BONVILLAIN: 3 Well, I'm glad somebody else has 4 trouble reading the agenda this morning. 5 Okay. Committee reports. 6 Awards, Mr. Hylton? 7 MR. HYLTON: 8 Can one of these ladies help me out 9 here? 10 MS. BORDELON: 11 Awards? No. We just need to verify 12 the awards for -- at this conference. 13 MR. BONVILLAIN: 14 Okay. Yeah. 3	and October the eighth and ninth in Lake
4	Charles.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Very good.
7	Nominating, Ms. Henry?
8	MS. HENRY:
9	There are no nominations to report.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Okay. Who comes off in October of
12	this year?
13	MR. BARBER:
14	I do, for one.
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	I believe I do, too.
17	MS. BORDELON:
18	Yeah.
19	Connie will need to renew her term.
20	Her term her first term ends.
21	MS. HENRY:
22	I thought you got my letter already.
23	MS. BORDELON:
24	Oh, yeah, we did.
25	MS. HENRY:

1	Uh-huh (yes).
2	MS. BORDELON:
3	I sure did. Sorry. Maybe that's not
4	my most updated list.
5	Oh, here it is. Yeah. Gary goes off
6	and Troy goes off.
7	MR. BONVILLAIN:
8	Troy, who
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	And Danny will need to be Danny's
11	first term ends.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Troy who are you appointed by?
14	Municipal?
15	MR. BARBER:
16	LMA.
17	MS. BORDELON:
18	Yeah, LMA.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	LMA. Okay. So, we'll need to find a
21	replacement for myself and for Troy. And
22	I'm with the Associations. I'm appointed
23	by the associations.
24	Okay. Other business requests from

Hieu Truong to approve CEUs. You've got

1	it in your packet that was e-mailed to
2	you.
3	MS. HENRY:
4	Eleven how many hours is he
5	requesting?
6	MS. BORDELON:
7	I had personally, on the first -
8	on one of them I think I counted, like,
9	five and a half. So, I would think
10	probably ten for both days would be
11	MS. HENRY:
12	For solid waste? Is that what he's
13	requesting? I don't know.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Is he certified?
16	MS. BORDELON:
17	Yes.
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	Landform, Level A.
20	MS. BORDELON:
21	They're Landform.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Okay.
24	MS. HENRY:
25	Okay.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Do I hear a motion to approve hours
3	for Mr. Truong.
4	MR. LAGRANGE:
5	Moved to approve ten hours.
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	Okay. A motion by Mr. Legrange to
8	approve ten hours of CEUs for Mr. Truong.
9	Is there a second for the motion?
10	MR. BARBER:
11	I second.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Seconded by Mr. Barber. Any
14	discussion?
15	MR. LAGRANGE:
16	Yeah, I was wondering what that topic
17	Cannabis and Industrial Hemp Analysis is
18	about.
19	MR. GREENE:
20	I touched on this subject when we
21	were in Lake Charles. It still concerns
22	me, if we don't I mean, I understand
23	the rules and the online and going
24	elsewhere for your training, but how do we

know that that training aligns with

1	Louisiana DEQ and this Board's and
2	that's what I brought up before. And
3	there's just no way I'm just concerned
4	that I don't understand why anybody
5	wouldn't want to come to an LSWA/DEQ
6	sponsored training, to get us to
7	approve I just I mean, I looked
8	these people up online, and, I mean, I
9	don't have a clue what they were talking
10	about. The biggest thing I could see for
11	him was the analytical part.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Uh-huh (yes).
14	MR. LAGRANGE:
15	Uh-huh (yes).
16	MR. GREENE:
17	But how does the analytical part with
18	the t-clip, benzine, et cetera, if he's
19	just learning, have to do now, I
20	understand. I just want my concerns to be
21	heard.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Right.
24	MR. GREENE:

25

I think I would love to see a list of

1	qualified outside sources that the DEQ is
2	comfortable with.
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Well, it's not DEQ's prerogative.
5	MR. GREENE:
6	It's the Board?
7	MR. BONVILLAIN:
8	It's our it's the Board's
9	prerogative that approves training.
10	MR. GREENE:
11	I would love to see that for our
12	Board, then. If we have to recommend
13	and I totally understand other people.
14	But we do, what three? Four classes a
15	year.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	We do three.
18	MR. GREENE:
19	I just can't see why people wouldn't
20	want to come here, that we all know that
21	everybody is having the same level of
22	training that we're voting on.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	Okay. Just historically, okay.
25	SWANA courses we approve.

## MR. GREENE:

I understand that.

#### MR. BONVILLAIN:

You know, and I think everybody pretty much is in agreement that those courses are generally good courses. Other than that, it's on a case-by-case basis to look at the agenda and see if we feel that it falls in line with what they need. And particularly with, like, Landfarms and stuff, at our training sessions, we really don't offer them very much that's actually geared towards them. And it -- because it gets very difficult in a ten hour session when you try, particularly at the smaller session --

#### MR. GREENE:

Uh-huh (yes).

#### MR. BONVILLAIN:

-- to try to maybe have a breakout session or something that's dedicated to that, because it's not a big number of them. And they probably feel more comfortable going to something that's actually geared toward what they do.

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1	MR. GREENE:
2	I can understand that explanation for
3	this.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	Right. For this, right.
6	MR. GREENE:
7	Yes.
8	MR. HYLTON:
9	Well, can we redefine it? As you
10	said, not much for Landfarms, but, like
11	you require hours or SWANAs for a
12	Landfill, Level A, because we offer
13	everything you need to know for that.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Right. We do.
16	MR. LAGRANGE:
17	But I think the regulations
18	provide does not specify where or how
19	to get your CEUs
20	DR. de ABREU:
21	Exactly.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Correct.
24	MR. LAGRANGE:
25	in the regulations. So, do we

1 have the authority or purview to establish our own quidelines as to what would be 2 acceptable to the Board to grant CEUs for 3 4 other type -- other trainings outside of what's provided through the association 5 and DEQ? That would be a question that we 6 7 would want to get answered, and then if 8 so, then we would need to develop that and 9 say these are approved sources or courses 10 that we would accept -- you know, we would 11 have to kind of establish that. 12 MR. BONVILLAIN: 13 Right. And, like I said, historically SWANA is approved. 14 15 MR. LAGRANGE: 16 Yeah. 17 MR. BONVILLAIN: 18 And I think that's the only one that 19 going forward we approve ahead of time. 20 You know, that -- you know, if it's a 21 SWANA course we're going to approve it. 22 Anything else we want to see the very 23 specifics of it. 24 MS. HENRY:

Why aren't we asking -- in line with

25

1	what David said, why are we requesting,
2	like, before LSWA can even put on a
3	workshop or put on a conference, they're
4	presenting an agenda to be approved
5	because, I mean, as a person who sends
6	employees here, I wouldn't want to send
7	them on an "Oh, I hope they get their ten
8	hours."
9	Why aren't we requiring we as a
10	Board asking, you know, before you go,
11	get this approved.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	And if the Board wants to do that, I
14	think it's within our purview. See, the
15	Board is actually responsible for
16	providing training.
17	MS. HENRY:
18	Because had you not said landfarm, I
19	was kind of with Bo on, Well, what does
20	this have to do with all the cannabis
21	and stuff
22	DR. de ABREU:
23	Uh-huh (yes).
24	MS. HENRY:
25	you know, I was like (indicating).

### MR. BONVILLAIN:

And, you know, if the Board wants to go ahead and pass a resolution that anything not -- that any outside training has to be approved by the Board before the individual goes to it otherwise it won't be approved, then, of course, we'd have to send notice out to all of the facilities about that.

#### MR. GREENE:

Yeah, I didn't want to reinvent the wheel, but it's just a concern of mine since I'm new or started last year.

#### MR. BONVILLAIN:

Okay.

#### MR. GREENE:

I just -- we had some online courses that were brought up, and I was just -- I was just taken aback. I didn't really understand --

#### MR. BONVILLAIN:

Why don't we do this? Let's not take any action on it at this meeting.

#### MR. GREENE:

That's fine.

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1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Everybody think about it and then
3	we'll bring it up Suzanne, if you
4	would, put it on the agenda for the July
5	meeting that we can talk about it some
6	more. Everybody can think about it, and
7	then if at that point you want to make
8	take any action on it, you can.
9	MR. GREENE:
10	I feel much better about him going to
11	a class than I was the online stuff.
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Right.
14	MR. GREENE:
15	You know, that really just I
16	didn't agree with that.
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	The online is shaky, because anybody
19	can take it.
20	MR. GREENE:
21	Yes.
22	MR. BARBER:
23	Right.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Okay. Any public comments?

1	If there's no
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	Mr. Chairman, I don't think we
4	actually
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Oh, did we vote? We didn't vote on
7	it.
8	MR. LAGRANGE:
9	I don't think we voted on the motion
10	yet.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	Okay. We did have a motion.
13	MR. LAGRANGE:
14	And then we got caught up in the
15	discussion.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	Okay. I'm sorry. Okay. So we
18	had who made the motion?
19	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	I did.
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	You made the motion. Ms. Henry, you
23	seconded it, right?
24	MS. HENRY:
25	(INDICATING YES)

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Okay. Is there any objection to
3	motion?
4	MR. HYLTON:
5	I forgot what the motion was.
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	The motion was to approve the ter
8	hours
9	MR. LAGRANGE:
10	Ten hours.
11	MR. HYLTON:
12	For this guy?
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	for Mr. Truong.
15	MS. HENRY:
16	Yes.
17	MR. HYLTON:
18	Okay.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Any objection to the motion?
21	Hearing none, the motion passes.
22	Do I hear a motion to adjourn?
23	MR. BARBER:
24	So moved.
