11	Danny Hylton?
12	MR. HYLTON:
13	Here.
14	MS. BORDELON:
15	Jason Creel?
16	Beau LaGrange?
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	Present.
19	MS. BORDELON:
20	Dr. Ricardo de Abreu?
21	DR. de ABREU:
22	Here.
23	MS. BORDELON:
24	David Greene.
25	MR. GREENE:

1	Here.
2	MS. BORDELON:
3	Connie Henry.
4	MS. HENRY:
5	Here.
6	MS. BORDELON:
7	Gary Bonvillain?
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	Here.
10	MS. BORDELON:
11	Wes Wyche?
12	Mia Townsel?
13	MS. TOWNSEL:
14	Here.
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	Okay. On the agenda, we've got

20	Doesn't appear to be an incinerator,
21	though, from what his duties are.
22	MS. TOWNSEL:
23	No, no. It's probably something
24	like I don't know if it's a grease trap
25	facility or I don't think it's medical

waste. But if y'all want me to make a 1 quick phone call and find out, I can. 3 MR. LAGRANGE: Well, whatever it is, if you look at 4 5 his explanation of duties, from experience 6 he has experience. It seems like he would 7 meet that requirement from his experience. MS. TOWNSEL: 8 9 Do you want me to find out what type? MR. BONVILLAIN: 10 11 Ms. Townsel can go ahead and make a 12 call, if y'all want. We can just set it off to the side for now. 13 MS. BORDELON: 14 I will make one comment to -- that he 15 made to me this morning. I don't recall 16 17 that, but he had brought his application

made to me this morning. I don't recall that, but he had brought his application before the Board back in 2009, and the Board had approved it in 2009, but he had never come and taken the test. So, I told him it was just -- probably we needed to just reapprove it, because it been so long.

4	It's two years experience for Class

9	which is what she's apply for.
10	MR. LAGRANGE:
11	Yeah, Class B.
12	And on for experience, she was an
13	Accounts Payable clerk, and before that
14	for several years lead scale operator.
15	And she previously held a Level B license
16	since 2005. She missed her
17	recertification hours, so that's why she's
18	going back through
19	MR. GREENE:
20	Right. She worked for
21	MR. LAGRANGE:
22	the recertification process.
23	MR. HYLTON:
24	So, she's already had a B?
25	MR. LAGRANGE:

1	Yeah.
2	MR. HYLTON:
3	Well, then work history doesn't
4	matter if she already had it.
5	MR. LAGRANGE:
6	Right.
7	MR. BONVILLAIN:
8	I'd be kind of hard to deny it if she
9	already had a license. Okay.
10	Eric Hart, Landfill, Level B.
11	DR. de ABREU:
12	I had a question about this one. It
13	doesn't seem that he describes his work
14	from 2007 to 2013. It shows that he
15	worked at the landfill, but it doesn't
16	show what type of work he did.
17	MR. GREENE:
18	Are we speaking of
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Well, then he's got '13 to the
21	present.
22	MR. GREENE:
23	Eric Ray Hart?
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	Yeah.

1	MR. GREENE:
2	Yeah, it says he's worked there from
3	'13 to the present at Jeff Davis or
4	Jefferson Parish with his
5	DR. de ABREU:
6	I thought that was 2018.
7	MR. LAGRANGE:
8	Yeah, I did, too. But looking at his
9	previous work was well, he terminated
10	employment in 2013
11	MR. GREENE:
12	Right.
13	MR. LAGRANGE:
14	then the next day he went to
15	Jefferson Parish.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	Yeah. So, he's got plenty of
18	experience at Jefferson Parish.
19	DR. de ABREU:
20	Uh-huh (yes).
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	Richard Isgitt, Landfill, Level A.
23	And he was previously certified.
24	MR. HYLTON:
25	On the last item on there, super

1	signature of current supervisor, how
2	important is that?
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Well, I think Mr. Isgitt is not
5	employed right now; is that right, David?
6	MR. GREENE:
7	He's yeah, he's not employed
8	from a landfill.
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	Yeah.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	Yeah.
13	MR. GREENE:
14	At this point, he did work for
15	well for us, just until recently.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	Okay. Brandon Murry. This is a
18	C & D, Level B.
19	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	Excuse me, but we skipped David
21	Jones?
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	Actually, yes, we did. And the
24	reason being is because he is now going to
25	request a conditional instead of a

1	Landfill, Level A, because he actually,
2	Wes brought to my attention yesterday he
3	does not have a diploma or GED, which you
4	have to have for a Level A. So, when I
5	contacted Dawn Thibodeaux yesterday and
6	pointed it out to her, she wanted they
7	wanted to request a conditional instead.
8	And he is going to replace Ricky Falgout,
9	who was their Level A. And
10	MR. HYLTON:
11	Well, how can he have a B an A if
12	he doesn't meet the requirements?
13	MS. BORDELON:
14	Well, he's in she stated that he
15	is in the process of obtaining a GED.
16	MR. HYLTON:
17	Okay.
18	MR. BONVILLAIN:
19	Okay. Brandon Murry C & D, Level B.
20	He's actually been on temporary
21	certificates for two years, so.
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	And he passed his test in March of
24	this year, earlier.
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

1	That was the first time he passed the
2	test?
3	MS. BORDELON:
4	Yeah. He took the test back in
5	March.
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	Okay. But he's been on conditional
8	certificates for two years?
9	MR. LAGRANGE:
10	No. No, he's just on conditional.
11	He worked for a year before he applied for
12	a conditional, I think.
13	MS. BORDELON:
14	Yeah.
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	Okay. Okay.
17	MS. BORDELON:
18	It was the second extension
19	request
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	All right. Okay.
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	and then he passed the yeah.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	I read that I interpreted it

1	wrong.
2	MS. BORDELON:
3	Okay.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	Anthony Nunez, C & D, Level B.
6	Walter Parks, Landfill, Level B.
7	Eric Pederson, C & D, Level A.
8	DR. de ABREU:
9	So on Pederson so the issue is
10	that he didn't resubmit the application
11	for recertification within three months
12	after it expires; is that correct?
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	Correct.
15	MS. BORDELON:
16	Right.
17	DR. de ABREU:
18	And, in those cases, what needs to be
19	done?
20	MR. BONVILLAIN:
21	They have to
22	MS. BORDELON:
23	They have to retest.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	they have to retest.

1	DR. de ABREU:
2	Oh, they have to retest.
3	MR. BONVILLAIN:
4	Right.
5	DR. de ABREU:
6	So, it's the same issue that we have
7	with Richard Isgitt?
8	MS. BORDELON:
9	Yes.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Right, the same yeah, the same
12	thing.
13	MS. BORDELON:
14	Yeah.
15	DR. de ABREU:
16	Okay.
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	They have to retest if they don't do
19	it within three months of the expiration
20	date.
21	MS. BORDELON:
22	After their expiration, right.
23	DR. de ABREU:
24	Thank you.
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

1	Okay. Ms. Townsel, what did you find
2	out for us?
3	MS. TOWNSEL:
4	Used oil processing facility.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Okay. Used oil processing facility.
7	Okay. We'll go back to
8	MS. BORDELON:
9	Brent Broussard.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Brent Broussard, Level A,
12	Incinerator waste handling, used oil
13	processing facility.
14	MR. LAGRANGE:
15	Looking at all of his experience, he
16	has ample years of experience in this
17	waste handling operation, but also he's
18	held various different positions:
19	Facility manager, vice president, and then
20	operations manager at another facility, US
21	Filter in Bayou Vista. So, I think he's
22	got plenty of experience.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	Okay. Next we go to review request
25	for conditional certification.

1	First one Peggy Ross, Landfill, Level
2	B. She is replacing regularly certified
3	operator Judy Ortego who left in January
4	of '19.
5	MR. LAGRANGE:
6	Excuse me, Mr. Chairman. Did we vote
7	on these?
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	We vote on we need to vote now?
10	MR. LAGRANGE:
11	You go to the next agenda item.
12	MS. BORDELON:
13	Yes, we do.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	We do? Okay.
16	All right. We'll wait on the
17	conditionals. Ms. Bordelon, could you go
18	ahead and read off the applications we
19	have approved?
20	MS. BORDELON:
21	Nicholas Chreene, Landfill, Level A;
22	Milas Davidson, Landfill, Level B; Tara
23	Dupaty, Landfill, Level B; Eric Hart,
24	Landfill, Level B; Richard Isgitt,
25	Landfill, Level A; Brandon Murry, C & D,

1	Level B; Anthony Nunez, C & D, Level B;
2	Walter Parks, Landfill, Level B; Eric
3	Pederson, C & D, Level A; and Brent
4	Broussard, Incinerator, Level A.
5	MR. BONVILLAIN:
6	Do I hear a motion to approve the
7	applications?
8	MR. LAGRANGE:
9	Moved, Mr. Chairman.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	Moved by Mr. LaGrange.
12	DR. de ABREU:
13	Second.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Seconded by Dr. de Abreu.
16	Any objection to the motion?
17	Hearing none, the motion passes.
18	Okay. Conditional certification.
19	First one Peggy Ross, Landfill, Level B,
20	replacing a regularly certified operator.
21	MR. LAGRANGE:
22	I move to approve, Mr. Chairman.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	And a motion by Mr. LaGrange.
25	MS. HENRY:

1	Second.
2	MR. BONVILLAIN:
3	Seconded by Ms. Henry to approve the
4	conditional certification for Peggy Ross.
5	Any objection to the motion?
6	Okay. Hearing none, the motion
7	passes.
8	Request review request for
9	conditional certifications
10	MS. BORDELON:
11	Did you go back to David Jones?
12	MR. BONVILLAIN:
13	Okay. David Jones, as Ms. Bordelon
14	explained, he was actually applying for a
15	Landfill, Level A, but since he does not
16	have his high school diploma or GED, he is
17	requesting a conditional. He is replacing
18	a regularly certified operator.
19	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	I move to approve, Mr. Chairman.
21	MR. BONVILLAIN:
22	A motion by Mr. LaGrange.
23	MR. GREENE:
24	I second.
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

1	Seconded by Mr. Greene to approve the
2	conditional for David Jones.
3	Any objection to the motion?
4	MR. LAGRANGE:
5	Just a comment, I guess. A
6	clarification. I mentioned that I read,
7	say, for a regular certificate you have to
8	have a minimum of a high school diploma or
9	equivalent.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	That's correct.
12	MR. LAGRANGE:
13	So, I know he's conditional. He
14	if he does apply for a regular
15	certificate, he would need to meet those
16	requirements.
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	That's correct.
19	MR. GREENE:
20	Correct.
21	MR. HYLTON:
22	And how long can he stay conditional?
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	That's at the Board's discretion. In
25	a normal situation, they're getting a

1	conditional because they don't have the
2	experience. So, you have a set time frame
3	for them to get that experience. In his
4	case, he's got to get his GED. There is
5	no set time frame on that. That's
6	strictly up to the Board as to how long
7	they want to extend that condition.
8	MR. HYLTON:
9	Okay.
10	MR. BONVILLAIN:
11	And there's nothing specific in the
12	regulations about it.
13	MR. LAGRANGE:
14	So, when we sent him a conditional
15	certificate, is there an expiration date
16	on it?
17	MS. BORDELON:
18	Six months.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	It's six months. It's still six
21	months.
22	MR. LAGRANGE:
23	Okay.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	The question is: How many extensions

1	are you going to give him? And that would
2	be up to the Board that's in place at the
3	time he comes up for renewal or of the
4	conditional.
5	MR. GREENE:
6	And he's got experience, and he has a
7	SWANA certificate, so.
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	And, I mean, it's not like he doesn't
10	know what is doing. You know
11	MR. GREENE:
12	Right.
13	MS. HENRY:
14	Right.
15	MR. BONVILLAIN:
16	he know's what's going on.
17	MR. GREENE:
18	Right.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Okay. Request for conditional
21	certification extension for Dalton Carter,
22	Richard LeBouef
23	MR. LAGRANGE:
24	Wait. We didn't vote
25	MR. BONVILLAIN:

1	Oh, we
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	we had comments on that motion.
4	MR. BONVILLAIN:
5	We didn't vote on it?
6	MS. BORDELON:
7	Huh-uh (no).
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	Okay. Do I hear a motion to approve
10	the conditional for David Jones?
11	MR. LAGRANGE:
12	We have a motion and a second.
13	MR. BONVILLAIN:
14	Oh, we didn't vote on it.
15	MR. LAGRANGE:
16	Right.
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	That's right. We interrupted the
19	vote.
20	MR. LAGRANGE:
21	You asked if anyone had an objection,
22	I said I had a comment.
23	MR. BONVILLAIN:
24	That's correct. You're right.
25	All in favor of issuing a conditional

1	for David Jones?
2	Are there any objections to issuing a
3	conditional?
4	Hearing none, the motion passes.
5	Okay. Review request for conditional
6	certification extensions for Dalton
7	Carter, Richard LeBouef, and David
8	Woodson.
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	And Keith Daigle.
11	MR. BONVILLAIN:
12	And Keith Daigle.
13	All have taken the appropriate class
14	and passed the test?
15	MS. BORDELON:
16	Yes.
17	MR. BONVILLAIN:
18	Okay.
19	MR. LAGRANGE:
20	I move to grant the extensions of the
21	conditionals for those four.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	Okay. A motion by Mr. LaGrange.
24	MS. HENRY:
25	Second.

1	MR. BONVILLAIN:
2	Seconded by Ms. Henry that the
3	conditional certifications for Dalton
4	Carter, Richard LeBouef, David Woodson,
5	and Keith Daigle be granted.
6	Any objection to the motion?
7	Hearing none, the motion passes.
8	Re-certifications.
9	MS. BORDELON:
10	Wait a minute. We have to do that
11	application from John
12	MR. GREENE:
13	John, yeah.
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Okay. I was reading okay.
16	Application from John Ovella, which
17	was tabled from the March 2019 meeting. I
18	think we had requested
19	MS. BORDELON:
20	It's probably going to be on the very
21	bottom of the stack. That's it.
22	MR. BONVILLAIN:
23	That's it.
24	We had requested additional
25	information about his actual work

1	experience, because the original
2	application was somewhat vague.
3	And he is requesting a C & D,
4	Level A.
5	MR. GREENE:
6	I see where he's trying. He's taken
7	his test and his operators, trying to get
8	certification, doing his hours. But I
9	unless I'm just not reading this
10	correctly, I just don't see the experience
11	on anything, just what he's trying to do.
12	Is that we were trying to clarify last
13	time?
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	Yeah.
16	MR. GREENE:
17	I mean, I can be way wrong on this,
18	but.
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	I think the question was: Did he
21	have the actual hands-on experience
22	MR. GREENE:
23	That's
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	I believe was the question.

1	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	Yeah, it seems like through the, I
3	guess, the heavy construction, Durr is
4	it Durr Heavy
5	MS. BORDELON:
6	Yeah.
7	MR. LAGRANGE:
8	heavy construction role. I mean,
9	he's had a hand in a lot of a different
10	things.
11	MR. GREENE:
12	Yeah.
13	MR. LAGRANGE:
14	And which, part of it has been
15	affiliated with the operating of the
16	Gentilly Landfill. The question is, as
17	you said, how much of it has been really
18	directly on that versus the other
19	MR. GREENE:
20	That's the only thing I question.
21	MR. LAGRANGE:
22	Durr's heavy construction.
23	MR. GREENE:
24	And hopefully I thought maybe
25	somebody would know of this gentleman.

1	MR. LAGRANGE:
2	And because of the it's a Level A,
3	his construction experience doesn't count
4	toward his experience. Is that correct,
5	Mr. Chairman?
6	MR. BONVILLAIN:
7	That's correct, unless you're
8	constructing landfills.
9	MR. GREENE:
10	Correct.
11	MS. TOWNSEL:
12	And it's for a conditional?
13	MS. BORDELON:
14	No.
15	MS. TOWNSEL:
16	Okay. So, it's
17	MR. GREENE:
18	It's regular.
19	MS. TOWNSEL:
20	Okay.
21	MR. LAGRANGE:
22	A regular certificate.
23	MR. HYLTON:
24	Well, it does say that back in the
25	beginning his construction projects were

1	related to Gentilly Landfill.
2	MR. LAGRANGE:
3	Apparently so.
4	MR. GREENE:
5	It doesn't it doesn't state that.
6	MR. HYLTON:
7	It doesn't say exactly that, but
8	MR. WYNN:
9	It doesn't he doesn't even have
10	the college degree.
11	MS. HENRY:
12	I think in his cover letter
13	MR. LAGRANGE:
14	It says he has a bachelor of arts
15	degree, but it doesn't say what it's in.
16	MR. BONVILLAIN:
17	It doesn't indicate
18	MR. LAGRANGE:
19	A bachelor of science degree.

23	of just answering A, B, C, D. And I'm a
24	simple person. Maybe in between the lines
25	this is it, but I'm saying at this point

1	in time I would request if he can't
2	provide somebody from the Gentilly
3	Landfill saying, Hey, what's he do there?
4	That's all I know, but I'm not for
5	this at this time.
6	MR. LAGRANGE:
7	Mr. Chairman, a question.
8	MR. BONVILLAIN:
9	Yes.
10	MR. LAGRANGE:
11	If he has a bachelor of science
12	degree, is that does it have to be
13	in the regs that's
14	MR. BONVILLAIN:
15	It's got to be having to do with
16	engineering.
17	MR. LAGRANGE:
18	Yeah, that's what I thought
19	MR. BONVILLAIN:
20	Engineering or environment.
21	MR. LAGRANGE:
22	Environmental-related degree, and
23	that offsets one year.
24	MR. BONVILLAIN:
25	That offsets one year. Still need

1 two years.

MR. LAGRANGE:

And he says in here he started working directly with the president of Gentilly in 2017. So, he may potentially have two years solid waste experience, but he doesn't say what his bachelor of science degree was in on his application.

MR. BONVILLAIN:

Would y'all like him to come to a meeting in person?

I'm just throwing that out there.

Today's my last day, so, I mean, it's -y'all are the ones who will deal with it
if you don't do it today.

## MR. HYLTON:

You've got to straighten this mess out.
