SCHILLACE: 10 Based according to State law, if he works 35, he's 11 12 eligible. He's Firefighter I? 13 14 MS. RYLAND: 15 Yes. 16 MR. SCHILLACE: 17 He responds to fires? MS. RYLAND: 18 19 Yes. 20 MR. SCHILLACE: 21 I make a motion we approve him. He meets the State law 22 requirements. MR. RUIZ: 23 24 Any second for discussion? 25 MR. PRICE:

1 Second. 2 MR. RUIZ: 3 Open for discussion. MR. SCHILLACE: 4 5 Well, as I stated, regardless of what the policy is whether they classify him full time or not, he meets State 6 7 law, right, Paul? MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 8 In fact, I was just looking through some stuff the 9 10 other day, and I found some old rules that we had for 11 supplemental pay, and it defines eligibility requirements for 12 supplemental pay are, must be a full-time certified firefighter performing his regular job duties at least 35 13 hours a week. 14 15 MR. SCHILLACE: That's the way I read it, so we're only going by what 16 17 the law says, and he meets those qualifications. I don't see 18 how this Board can deny this gentlemen his State supplemental 19 pay. 20 MR. RUIZ: I'm in favor of giving this gentleman supplemental pay 21 too, but are we going to have a problem with his boss signing 22 23 the warrant? 24 MR. ROBICHAUX: 25 They've done it before.

#### MS. RYLAND:

Okay. The next application you will see is for Mr. David Tibbetts who is here with us today. We actually received his application coming in and we thought he was an employee of the New Orleans Fire Department, to give you all a background on this. He was approved, I think last year some time. We put him on. Everything was good, and we got a call from New Orleans Fire Department saying that he was not an employee from New Orleans Fire Department. We contacted Mr. Tibbetts, talked to him, and then I'm going to let you all talk to him, if you don't mind, and let him talk to you to kind of give you an understanding of who he works for and what is going on with him.

#### MR. TIBBETTS:

Thank you, ladies and gentlemen. I appreciate the time.

My name is David Tibbetts. I appreciate the time.

#### MR. RUIZ:

Can you give him an oath?

19 (Witness sworn.)

#### MR. TIBBETTS:

I don't know where to start, so I'll start back. I'm retired from the New Orleans Fire Department. I worked for the New Orleans Fire Department for 24 years. I retired in '02. I did some consulting work. It's not anything to do with it.

I found out about an opening at the airport for a fire chief a year or so ago and applied through the City of New Orleans and got the job as the Aircraft Rescue Firefighter Manager/Fire Chief for the Aviation Board at the airport. The firemen at the airport are New Orleans firemen. I don't work for the fire department, so when I applied for the State pay, I guess it maybe got -- my application was convoluted or something.

Anyway, I work for the City through the Aviation Board. The City -- the Aviation Board rents the New Orleans firemen. As you probably know, the airport is on New Orleans property in the City of Kenner, in the Parish of Jefferson. So I work for the Aviation Board, and apparently, when I was given acceptance for this, the money was going through the Fire Department, and, of course, I do not work for the Fire Department anymore. I am retired from there.

So I got an e-mail and started on the paperwork to apply for a new department, that paperwork right now is sitting in Colonel Sneed's office. He is the deputy director to the mayor, but I thought he might be the person to get that signature. I'm not sure if it should have been somebody I work for on the Aviation Board, so -- I mean, that's kind of where I stand.

I certainly didn't plan on doing malice or anything else.

I thought I had all my ducks in a row. Obviously, I don't.

# 1 MR. RUIZ: Does the Aviation Board qualify as a fire department 2 3 according to statute? MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 4 That is what I was looking for. I know they granted the 5 Port Authority, but as far as the Aviation Board, I don't see 6 7 it. 8 MR. RUIZ: The biggest problem we have today is the fact that, even 9 though after he fills out an application to become a fire 10 department, he's not part of the statute. He would have to 11 get legislative authority in order to grant him --12 13 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: Yes. 14 15 MS. RYLAND: Don't you have firefighters that work under you? 16 MR. SCHILLACE: 17 What is your official job title? 18 MR. TIBBETTS: 19 It's -- yes. It's the Aircraft Rescue Firefighter 20 21 Manager, and fire chief of the department. 22 MR. SCHILLACE: So you, in essence, are the fire chief? 23 MR. TIBBETTS: 24 25 Yes. I attend meetings --

# MR. SCHILLACE: 1 2 You supervise firefighters? 3 MR. TIBBETTS: Yes, sir, captains, operators, firefighters. I manage 4 them. I manage their training --5 MR. SCHILLACE: 6 7 Just the fact that you work for the Board, not a fire 8 department? MR. TIBBETTS: 9 I work for the City, and then the -- you know, my 10 paycheck is from the City of New Orleans. My division, if 11 you will, I guess is I work for -- according to this, I work 12 13 for the Aviation Board. MR. RUIZ: 14 15 You have a question? MR. ROBICHAUX: 16 17 My question is, do your firemen get supplemental pay? MR. TIBBETTS: 18 19 Yes. 20 MR. ROBICHAUX: 21 The department has already got it. Why would we need a 22 new department application? MR. RUIZ: 23 24 Paul? 25 MR. SCHEXNAYDER:

1		How do they get supplemental pay?
2	MR.	TIBBETTS:
3		Through the City of New Orleans.
4	MR.	RUIZ:
5		How does your employees get their supplemental pay?
6	MR.	TIBBETTS:
7		Right.
8	MR.	RUIZ:
9		They are members of the New Orleans Fire Department.
10	MR.	TIBBETTS:
11		I don't know. I mean, I guess they get it like any
12	oth	er
13	MR.	SCHEXNAYDER:
14		That is who is signing the warrant?
15	MR.	RUIZ:
16		Uh-huh, that is who signs the warrant for them.
17	MR.	SCHEXNAYDER:
18		So who would be signing the warrant for you?
19	MR.	RUIZ:
20		That is the question.
21	MR.	TIBBETTS:
22		If you tell me who that is, I'll try to get their
23	sig	nature.
24	MR.	SCHILLACE:
25		I think a little clarification that these particular

1	firefighters, 30-some-odd
2	MR. TIBBETTS:
3	Thirty-six.
4	MR. SCHILLACE:
5	These 36 firefighters are City of New Orleans Fire
6	Department employees that are assigned maybe by contract to
7	the airport?
8	MR. TIBBETTS:
9	Yes, they are. The airport actually I manage their
10	budget. The airport rents those fireman from the City. Now,
11	they fall under the City charter, the City discipline, the
12	City rules and regulations, and benefits, everything.
13	MR. SCHILLACE:
14	That is why they get State pay.
15	But you as their supervisor, or whatever, you oversee
16	the firefighter duties at that airport?
17	MR. TIBBETTS:
18	Right.
19	MR. SCHILLACE:
20	You are ultimately held responsible?
21	MR. TIBBETTS:
22	Yes.
23	MR. SCHILLACE:
24	You're like the fire chief.
25	MR. RUIZ:

1 I agree that the gentlemen deserves supplemental pay. 2 The problem is, who are we going to get to sign that warrant 3 to make it legal? He's going to have to --MR. TIBBETTS: 4 5 Can the director of aviation sign that document? MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 6 7 Well, the statute says, municipality, parish, fire protection district, or other political subdivision 8 9 maintaining a fire department. It has to fit under one of 10 those. 11 MR. SCHILLACE: 12 Is the Airport Authority considered a public --MR. ROBICHAUX: 13 It's owned and run by the City of New Orleans, so it is a 14 15 political subdivision, okay. 16 MR. TIBBETTS: 17 The Board is a subdivision of the -- because I was 18 reading something about the new chairman coming in and its 19 appointments and stuff like that. 20 MR. RUIZ: So the Aviation Board -- I mean, it can be the chief, 21 22 that can be one, and then -- like, my chief signs off on it 23 and the Parish President signs off on it, and you all know who I'm talking about. 24 25 Who are we going to send that warrant to for him to get

1	signed, that is the biggest question that I have? Is it going
2	to be deputy mayor of Homeland Security or it's going to be
3	I mean, that's the problem that we've got to figure out before
4	he leaves.
5	MR. TIBBETTS:
6	I assume it would be me and Colonel Sneed.
7	MR. RUIZ:
8	Who are we going to allow to sign that warrant to make
9	it legal, because the City of New Orleans refuses to sign it?
10	MR. SCHILLACE:
11	I feel we need to clarify one thing first before we even
12	get to who is going to sign the warrant.
13	Number one, by statute, as a political subdivision, he
L 4	meets that?
L5	MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
16	Well, it sounds like it's a political subdivision. It's
L7	hard to say just right off sand.
18	MR. SCHILLACE:
19	We need some advice as our legal counsel.
20	MR. SCHEXNAYDER:
21	I would need some paperwork.
22	MR. TIBBETTS:
23	I'll write down what you need and I'll try to get it and
24	see
25	MD SCHEYNAYDED.

I need whoever you're working for to supply paperwork showing who they are and how they fit into the whole scheme of municipality. MR. RUIZ: Can we have a letter written to this gentleman and sent to him, and then that way he can explain what he needs to his supervisor, that way he can get the paperwork we need to satisfy Paul? Instead of us trying to explain to you what we need, if you've got it in writing, you know exactly what we need. MR. SCHILLACE: Once we get that clear and that satisfies the law, then we can talk about -- worry about who is going to sign it, but I want to try to help you as much as I can, but --MR. TIBBETTS: If I could ask a question, Kelly, did Amanda call you from Sneed's office? MS. KELLY: Yes. MR. TIBBETTS: I think what I -- because I mentioned about some of -getting to Colonel Sneed is not an easy thing, but I'm going to -- I'm still going to pursue the guy, but, yes, you know, a list of what you need, I'll certainly do the legwork and see

-- you know, get the documentation. The more I think about

it, the Aviation Board has got to be a political subdivision. 2 MR. RUIZ: 3 Yes. As long as we get the documents to have -- allow Paul to say that it is, that's fine with us. 4 5 My question to Katie is, is he getting supplemental pay? MS. RYLAND: 6 7 We took him off. 8 MR. RUIZ: If and when we do approve him, he will be getting 9 10 reimbursed, okay. MR. TIBBETTS: 11 12 And if I don't, then I've got to pay you all back. 13 MR. RUIZ: 14 It's a possibility. MR. SCHILLACE: 15 16 Okay. So we're at the point where, Katie, a letter is 17 going to be sent, and if that letter is to satisfaction, can 18 we approve today, based on satisfaction of that letter --19 MR. RUIZ: 20 I would rather not do that. I don't want -- I would 21 rather us owe him the money and back pay him and let Paul do 22 the research that he needs to do to make sure we're doing the 23 right thing. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 24 25 The only one that went to the legislature is the Port

1	Authority.

5	Do I need lawyers and stuff?

The fire chiefs work directly for the 20 Boards, the Port Commission or the Aviation Board, but they 21 still have supervisory authority over those firefighters. 22 23 They are fire chiefs. MR. RUIZ: 24

The problem is the way the statute was written.

25

### MR. ROBICHAUX: 1 2 I agree. I'm just saying that we need to clarify what 3 we're asking for. MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 4 I'm just saying, the statute reads can you supply 5 documentation that shows you are one of these and it lists 6 7 some --8 MR. RUIZ: You understand, Katie, what we --9 MR. SCHEXNAYDER: 10 11 I'll get with you. 12 MS. RYLAND: 13 Okay. 14 MR. BREWER: 15 It's kind of confusing. 16 MR. RUIZ: 17 Paul's right because the boys on the river came to us time and time again to get it because they were firemen 18 19 wanting supplemental pay. Eventually, what we did was, and 20 we assisted them was, getting them to pass legislation making 21 them part of the statute, and then once they became part of 22 the statute, we granted them supplemental pay. 23 I spoke to the gentleman downstairs, because he didn't 24 know where he was going, and he came in and was in the right 25 place, but -- so he told me what he was doing. I'm sure

1	Chief Robichaux probably knows the gentleman. This was the
2	first time I ever met him, so he started telling me his
3	problem. I knew what our problem was going to be. I think
4	we can solve this problem, hopefully, eventually, and we'll
5	work along with him.

8	Before we move on, I know you all approved the
