## CERTIFICATION OF INABILITY TO MEET IN PERSON DUE TO COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY FOR STATE MINERAL AND ENERGY BOARD

In accordance with La. Acts 2020, No. 302 and Executive Proclamations JBE 2021-6 and JBE 2021-7, this notice shall serve as a certification of the Louisiana State Mineral and Energy Board's ("Board") inability to otherwise operate in accordance with the Louisiana Open Meetings Law as a result of the COVID-19 public health emergency. The Board will provide for attendance and quorum at its essential government meeting on February 10, 2021, via video conference. Pursuant to La. Acts 2020, No. 302, the Board must meet because:

- 1) Matters that, if they are delayed, will cause curtailment of vital public services or severe economic dislocation and hardship. Because the Board must administer the state's proprietary interest in minerals by granting leases on state owned lands, has full supervision of all mineral leases granted by the state, and has general authority to take any action for the protection of the interests of the state under Louisiana Revised Statue 30:121 et seq., its continued function during this pandemic is essential and, failing timely meeting, would result in the curtailment of vital public services or severe economic dislocation and hardship.
- 2) Matters that are critical to continuation of the business of the public body and that are not able to be postponed to a meeting held in accordance with the other provisions of this Chapter due to a legal requirement or other deadline that cannot be postponed or delayed by the public body. The Board's operations must follow statutorily-mandated deadlines. It is impossible to postpone or delay the matters of the Board.

Considering the foregoing, and in accordance with La. Acts 2020, No. 302 and Executive Proclamations JBE 2021-6 and JBE 2021-7, the Board's meeting on Wednesday, February 10, 2021, at 9:15 a.m. will be held via video conference and in a manner that allows for observation and input by members of the public, as set forth in the Notice posted on February 5, 2021.

The Regular Meeting of the State Mineral and Energy Board was held on **Wednesday**, **February 10**, **2021**, beginning at 9:30 a.m. via Zoom.

## I. CALL TO ORDER

Mr. W. Paul Segura, Jr. Chairman, called the meeting to order.

### II. ROLL CALL

He then requested Mr. Jamie Manuel, Assistant Secretary of the Office of Mineral Resources, call the roll for the purpose of establishing a quorum.

## a) LEASE REVIEW REPORT February 10, 2021

(Resolution Nos. 21-02-001 thru 21-02-002)

## I. GEOLOGICAL AND ENGINEERING STAFF REVIEW

According to the SONRIS database, there are 1,076 active State Leases containing approximately 465,952 acres. Since the last Lease Review Report, the Geological and Engineering Division reviewed 99 leases covering approximately 40,796 acres for lease maintenance.

## II. BOARD REVIEW

1. Staff reported on State Lease No. 195, Selection C, Quarantine Bay Field, located in Plaquemines and St. Bernard Parishes, Louisiana.

Staff reported that Cox Operating L.L.C. (Cox) is the field operator and Staff last reviewed this lease on January 8, 2020.

Staff further reported that the Board accepted Cox's report and granted Cox until December 9, 2020 to report on their continued development on the lease.

Staff continued that by letter dated December 9, 2020, Cox reported the following:

- Cox was able to limit downtime from April to November of 2020 to just 33 days despite a very challenging year due to Covid, low product prices, and multiple hurricanes over Quarantine Bay, including State Lease Nos. 195 and 1349.
- Cox is actively working with two (2) oil and gas companies to farm-out state acreage within the field for two (2) separate prospects.
- The farm-outs will require the drilling of an initial test well within one (1) year of execution and will develop reserves from sands within the field.
- Cox is optimistic that the new drills will improve their current seismic profile over Quarantine Bay.
- As discussed by Cox in their previous report, a farm-out proposal with Southern Oil was met with delay for 2020 but they are hopeful a resumption of discussions will occur.

- Unlike Hurricane Katrina, 2020's hurricane damage to facilities were not catastrophic.
- Future Plans include:
  - o To perform tubing swaps on several wells over these two (2) state leases.

Staff recommended that the Board accept Cox's report and grant Cox until December 8, 2021 to report on their continued activities on the lease.

Upon motion of Ms. Michaud-Dugas, seconded by Mr. Watkins, and by unanimous vote of the Board, the Board approved the acceptance of Cox's report and granted Cox until December 8, 2021 to report on continued activities on the lease. There were no comments from the audience concerning this item. (Resolution No. 21-02-001)

## III. FORCE MAJEURE

1. Mr. Charles Bradbury of the Office of Mineral Resources (OMR) reported that Tellus Operating Group LLC (Tellus) requested a ninety (90) day extension to the force majeure affecting State Lease No. 16381 to permit time to complete negotiations to repair a portion of a Hilcorp production facility damaged by the 2020 hurricanes.

Mr. Bradbury further reported that the well was previously producing to that facility but Hilcorp recently reported that they did not plan to repair the portion of the facility that handled Tellus' production.

Mr. Bradbury recommended that the Board grant the ninety (90) day extension until the May 12, 2021 Board Meeting where the matter will be reconsidered.

Upon motion of Mr. Arnold, seconded by Ms. Michaud-Dugas, and by unanimous vote of the Board, the Board approved the request by Tellus Operating Group LLC (Tellus) for a ninety (90) day extension to the force majeure affecting State Lease No. 16381 to permit time to complete negotiations to repair a portion of a Hilcorp production facility damaged by the 2020 hurricanes. There were no comments from the audience on this item. (Resolution No. 21-02-002)

The first matter on the audit report was the election of the February 2021 gas royalty to be paid on a processed basis at the Discovery Plant at Larose and the Sea Robin Plant at Henry per the terms of the State Texaco Global Settlement Agreement.
