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1	TRANSCRIPT OF PROCEEDINGS
2	MR. GURVICH: Welcome, everyone, to the special
3	hearing of the Louisiana State Board of Private Security
4	Examiners. I would ask Mr. Blackburn to lead us in The
5	Pledge, followed by a brief moment of silence.
6	(Pledge of Allegiance. Moment of silence.)
7	MR. GURVICH: May we please have a quorum call.
8	(Roll call.)
9	MR. GURVICH: Okay. We appear to have a quorum.
10	And there being no other business, let's proceed to the
11	matters at hand. I believe we have a report which has
12	been filed into the record and has been issued to
13	everyone, I believe everyone. Has anyone not received
14	it?
15	MR. ROJAS: Mr. Chairman, I make a motion we
16	dispense with the reading of the previous minutes.
17	MR. GURVICH: Oh, good point. I guess we should
18	do that. So any debate/discussion? I'll second. All in
19	favor of the motion say aye.
20	ALL BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.
21	MR. GURVICH: Good. So at any rate, back to the
22	matter at hand. I think it's appropriate, Counsel, at
23	this point, if we are going to be discussing the report,
24	perhaps taking testimony from witnesses, since this all
25	has to do with a very confidential investigation

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involving board staff, I believe it's appropriate that we 1 2 go into executive session if two-thirds of the board 3 members agree. Is that your understanding? 4 MR. BLACKBURN: Yes, sir. 5 (Mr. Romero leaves room.) MR. GURVICH: Okay. I will therefore make a 6 7 motion that we go into executive session. Do I hear a 8 second? 9 MS. VINSON: Second. 10 MR. GURVICH: Motion by Mr. Gurvich, second by 11 Ms. Vinson. Any debate or discussion? All in favor of 12 the motion as stated say aye. This requires a two-thirds 13 majority. 14 ALL BOARD MEMBERS, EXCLUDING MR. ROMERO: Ave. 15 All right. Any nays? MR. GURVICH: The motion 16 We will go into executive session. For the passes. 17 purposes of the executive session, I would ask that all 18 board staff, witnesses -- board counsel can remain -- and 19 I believe our investigator. Will everyone else please 20 remove themselves, and I would invite you to have a cup 21 of coffee, but we apparently don't have any. And, of 2.2 course, our court reporter, you are also supposed to stay 23 in the room. I should have mentioned it. 24 (Executive session.) 25 (Board staff, Mr. Rogillio, and Mr. Cain reenter room.)

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1	MR. GURVICH: I think we are back on the public
2	record. The floor is open. Mr. Kennedy, did you have a
3	motion?
4	MR. KENNEDY: Yes, sir. I make a motion, a
5	four-part motion:
6	Number One, we authorize the immediate return and
7	reinstatement of Mr. Cain and Mr. Rogillio in that none
8	of the allegations against those two individuals in the
9	anonymous letter dated June 11th were sustained by the
10	investigation;
11	Number Two, we review and retrain board staff with
12	state HR personnel and Louisiana Property Assistance
13	Agency to bring all board staff in compliance of the
14	regulations of said agencies;
15	Number Three, review and reestablish the duties and
16	responsibilities of each job category and position within
17	this office;
18	Number Four, authorize counsel to respond to the
19	complaint filed with the Louisiana Property Assistance
20	Agency.
21	MR. ROJAS: I will second the motion.
22	MR. GURVICH: We have a motion on the floor by
23	Mr. Kennedy, second by Mr. Rojas. Debate? Discussion?
24	Board members, staff. Mr. Rogillio, did you care to
25	address the board at this juncture?

1	MR. ROGILLIO: Yes, sir. First, I apologize for
2	you guys having to listen to all this. Cops and
3	doughnuts go together. What can I say? Mr. Cain, I was
4	looking for an investigator. You remember the
5	circumstances with Mr. Thornton. And I think this is
6	somewhat of a retaliation for that situation, if you
7	will.
8	I called Mr. Cain, looking for another individual's
9	phone number from him to hire, and he indicated he might
10	be interested in this job. So he came and spoke with me
11	and I hired him.
12	He has done an exceptional job while he has been
13	here. He routinely averages 15 to 25, 30, 35 guards a
14	day, checking them at different locations, and files a
15	report on each one of those individuals.
16	I don't need to rehash the circumstances of why we
17	are here, obviously, but I do appreciate the
18	consideration from the board members of our positions
19	here at this agency.
20	MR. GURVICH: Thank you, Mr. Rogillio. Mr. Cain
21	back there, do you care to address the board or comment
22	on the
23	MR. CAIN: Yes, sir. I was retired 14 years
24	before I accepted this position. One of the reasons that
25	I did accept this position is Wayne Rogillio offered it

1	to me. I worked for him as at the Baton Rouge Police
2	Department for about eight years directly for him.
3	I have had tremendous effort, and I know most of you
4	are executives or owners of guard companies. Check with
5	any of your guards. I try to treat people with respect
6	and dignity, and I have put out a tremendous effort to
7	bring about some type of professionalism within the job I
8	am doing. And I have busted my butt trying to institute
9	a good effort in doing this job. And it's very
10	disheartening to have to go through something like this
11	when all we're trying to do is do an effective job and do
12	it efficiently.
13	I appreciate your attention, and I thank you.
14	MR. GURVICH: Anyone else? We are in the
15	debate-discussion phase of the motion. I have one thing
16	that I'd like to say briefly.
17	The motion, of course, says within the Point One,
18	that the allegations in the letter were not sustained.
19	But there was a factfinding report done by board counsel,
20	and it did disclose some issues. We have some things
21	that need to be tightened down, frankly.
22	I think it was the second point of Mr. Kennedy's
23	motion that we need to meet with HR, we need to hash
24	things out with Property Assistance folks on comp time,
25	overtime, flex time, scheduling issues that the board

1 staff wasn't aware about. I don't know, investigator 2 trip sheets if there are any. We do need to tighten 3 things down. There are certain things that need to be 4 tightened down.

5 I don't accuse anybody in particular of this room of 6 doing anything. Call it a general problem that we all 7 share. Okay? I'm not casting aspersions on any 8 individual.

9 The meeting, the Point Two, meeting with HR, state 10 HR folks and to meet with Property Assistance, we have to 11 hash these things out. We can't proceed going forward in 12 a vacuum. We are going to have to accept what is the 13 required sorts of the ways of doing things for the state. We have to do it as well. And I think it's implicit --14 explicit in Mr. Kennedy's motion, but it's implicit in 15 16 the spirit of the way we do things around here.

We're going to have to close this gap, tighten things down, that we may be doing things more casually than we should have been. But there's work to be done. And having said that, I will say no more.

Any further comments? All right. The notion on the floor of four points, I will call for a vote. All in favor say aye.

ALL BOARD MEMBERS: Aye.

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MR. GURVICH: Any opposed? The motion passes

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unanimously. Welcome back to work, Mr. Cain and
Mr. Rogillio.

3 One final cautionary note, not being directly 4 involved in the whys or wherefores of the allegations, I 5 can speak for the board in the sense that it must have 6 been some degree of concern, suspicion, and even 7 animosity among the board staff. When one has an 8 internal investigation like this and anonymous complaints 9 or otherwise, there have to be some personal issues 10 resulting from this.

And my cautionary note is, we are a team. We have a very, very important job description, which is essentially to keep Louisiana safe or safer through the use of about 10,000 security officers. And if we can't do that, we endanger 4 point something million people.

Going forward, whatever animosity, whatever personal grudges, that's all got to go. It's got to disappear. We have a job. We have to be an efficient regular regulatory agency for 10,000 people, many of them carrying guns, and all of them being responsible for the safety and welfare of the people of Louisiana.

And this isn't something that one necessarily needs a motion. It's the spirit of who we are as an agency going forward, that all this needs to be put behind us. And then we go forward with renewed commitment to what we

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1	have to do. And that's all I've got to say about it.
2	Any final comments? All right. Then I will call
3	for a motion to adjourn. Any questions? Nothing else?
4	MS. VINSON: Motion to adjourn.
5	MR. ROJAS: Second.
6	MR. GURVICH: Motion to adjourn by Ms. Vinson.
7	All in favor of the motion? This meeting is adjourned.
