Mr. LeBlanc reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence, and it was admitted. On motions made, seconded and unanimously passed, the board found KAJUN ESTABLISHMENT LLC, to be in violation and assessed an administrative penalty of the maximum fine plus \$1,000 in administrative costs and issued a cease and desist order.

On motions made, seconded and unanimously passed, the board found SOUTHEAST HOME MODIFICATIONS LLC, to be in violation and assessed an administrative penalty of the maximum fine plus \$1,000 in administrative costs and issued a cease and desist order.

Mr. Harbour requested the fine be reduced to \$2,000 provided the proper license is obtained within 120 days. A motion was made to accept the reduced fine amount of \$2,000 and to allow 180 days to obtain the proper license. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.
