1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 I'd like to call to order the meeting of  
3 the Board of Certification and Training for Solid  
4 Waste Management Operators. The first item of  
5 business will be the roll call.

6 MS. BORDELON:

7 Bo Lagrange.

8 MR. LAGRANGE:

9 Present.

10 MS. BORDELON:

11 James Berthelot.

12 MR. BERTHELOT:

13 Present.

14 MS. BORDELON:

15 Bijan Sharafkhani.

16 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

17 Yes.

18 MS. BORDELON:

19 Terrance Stewart.

20 MR. STEWART:

21 Present.

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 Bill Mollere.

24 MR. MOLLERE:

25 Here.

1 MS. BORDELON:

2 Scott Lyons.

3 MR. LYONS:

4 Here.

5 MS. BORDELON:

6 Denny Mize.

7 MR. MIZE:

8 Here.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 Delaney Lewis.

11 MR. LEWIS:

12 Present.

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 David Guillory.

15 (NO RESPONSE)

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 Robert McMullen.

18 (NO RESPONSE)

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Next, review of the October 20th meeting  
21 minutes. Any questions, comments, or changes?

22 MR. MOLLERE:

23 Other than Clarence becoming Terrance.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 So make sure we change the name Clarence

1 to Terrance. Anything else? If not, I'll  
2 entertain a motion to approve and adopt the  
3 minutes.

4 MR. MOLLERE:

5 So moved.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Moved by Mr. Mollere.

8 MR. LYONS:

9 Second.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Seconded by Mr. Lyons. Any other  
12 discussion? All in favor, signify by saying  
13 "aye".

14 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 Any opposed? Motion carried.

17 Next on the agenda is a presentation  
18 from the Louisiana Solid Waste Association  
19 represented by Ms. Yolunda Righteous to discuss  
20 the annual Waste Conference to be held in March  
21 2011 and ask us for our consideration to approve  
22 the conference for ten hours of continuing  
23 education.

24 MS. RIGHTEOUS:

25 Connie passed out the agenda for the

1 conference. I guess one change from last year to  
2 this year would be the addition of an extra  
3 tract, the oil and gas tract. And we're asking  
4 for ten hours for the conference. I'll give you  
5 guys a chance to review it, and if you have any  
6 questions --

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Yolanda, did you kind of map out the  
9 hours? I mean, did y'all add them up?

10 MS. YOLUNDA RIGHTEOUS:

11 Bill, you want to help me out?

12 MR. MOLLERE:

13 Yes. We have actually ten hours, and  
14 that includes parts of the plenary section. If  
15 you count the break periods -- we, of course, took  
16 those out. We did not include the hospitality  
17 period when most of the networking actually takes  
18 place. But it works out that we have ten hours.  
19 I would move that we accept.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 We have a motion to accept.

22 MR. MIZE:

23 Second:

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Seconded by Mr. Mize. Any other

1 discussion? Hearing none, all in favor signify by  
2 saying "aye".

3 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Any opposed? Motion carried.

6 Next, consideration of operator  
7 certifications. First is review of applications  
8 for certification. We have three applications for  
9 certification. The first one is Errin D. Carr for  
10 a landfill, Level B, at IESI, LaSalle/Grant  
11 Landfill. Any comments on Errin D. Carr?

12 Next would be Rene Paul Duhon, C & D,  
13 Level A, Stallion Oilfield.

14 MR. MIZE:

15 Mr. President, on the application it's  
16 got the number, for formal education, it's got  
17 nine years. I think an A is supposed to have a  
18 high school diploma or equivalent. This is only  
19 showing nine.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 This is on Rene Duhon's application?

22 MR. MIZE:

23 Yes, sir.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 All right.

1 MR. MIZE:

2 Have they taken a test?

3 MS. BORDELON:

4 They did come and take the test the day  
5 before yesterday in the office and they both  
6 passed.

7 MR. STEWART:

8 Doesn't have a GED, right?

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 No. And I apologize; I completely  
11 overlooked that. But if I can make one comment,  
12 if this is even possible, the other applicant from  
13 Stallion has applied for a Level B.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 That's Damian Wiltz?

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 Right. He does have a high school  
18 diploma. He just doesn't have the years.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Who's familiar with this facility? Is  
21 anybody familiar with it? They just received the  
22 C & D permit?

23 MS. BORDELON:

24 Yes, they just received their permit.  
25 And actually their only hold-up is their operator



1 certifications.

2 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

3 It's actually a pit burner.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Yes. When I read their scope of work,  
6 description of work, it looked like they were  
7 doing more air curtain --

8 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

9 Air curtain destructor. Yes, that's  
10 what it is.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 But if it is required to have a high  
13 school diploma -- Mr. Wiltz took the B test. He  
14 didn't take the A test, right?

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 Right.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 The other alternative would be to  
19 consider a conditional for Rene Duhon. And if Mr.  
20 Wiltz's application is up to par we can approve  
21 him for a regular certificate, Level B. What  
22 we'll do is I'll entertain a motion on Errin Carr  
23 first to approve for application.

24 MR. BERTHELOT:

25 Just looking at Errin Carr, formal

1 education is also nine years.

2 MR. MIZE:

3 He's on a Level B.

4 MR. BERTHELOT:

5 My mistake. You need a motion to  
6 approve the conditional?

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 No. This is to approve the application  
9 for a regular landfill Level B for Errin Carr.

10 MR. BERTHELOT:

11 So moved.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 Moved by Mr. Berthelot.

14 MR. LEWIS:

15 Second.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Seconded by Mr. Delaney Lewis. Any  
18 other discussion? All signify by saying "aye".

19 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

22 Let's take up Rene Duhon's application.  
23 It's been determined that based on the information  
24 presented in the application that he does not meet  
25 all of the qualification requirements, although

1 the facility is waiting for the certifications to  
2 open. I would entertain a motion to approve Mr.  
3 Duhon for a conditional C & D, Level A.

4 MR. BERTHELOT:

5 So moved.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Moved by Mr. Berthelot.

8 MR. MOLLERE:

9 Second.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Seconded by Mr. Mollere. Any other  
12 discussions? All signify by saying "aye".

13 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

16 Damian Wiltz, C & D, Level B. This  
17 would be for a regular certification.

18 MR. MOLLERE:

19 Question. Where is stallion again?

20 MR. MIZE:

21 Around Abbeville.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Abbeville, yes. Do I have a motion to  
24 approve Mr. Wiltz's application.

25 MR. LYONS:

1 the facility is waiting for the certifications to  
2 open. I would entertain a motion to approve Mr.  
3 Duhon for a conditional C & D, Level A.

4 MR. BERTHELOT:

5 So moved.

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Moved by Mr. Berthelot.

8 MR. MOLLERE:

9 Second.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Seconded by Mr. Mollere. Any other  
12 discussions? All signify by saying "aye".

13 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

16 Damian Wiltz, C & D, Level B. This  
17 would be for a regular certification.

18 MR. MOLLERE:

19 Question. Where is Stallion again?

20 MR. MIZE:

21 Around Abbeville.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Abbeville, yes. Do I have a motion to  
24 approve Mr. Wiltz's application.

25 MR. LYONS:

1 I'll make the motion.

2 MR. MIZE:

3 Second.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Motion by Mr. Lyons. Seconded by Mr.  
6 Mize. Any other discussion? All in favor signify  
7 by saying "aye".

8 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

11 Next we'll move to review of

12 applications for recertification. We have Mr.

13 Gary Bonvillain, Landfill, Level A; Surface

14 Impoundment, Level A; Landfarm, Level A;

15 Incinerator, Level A; Refuse-Derived Fuel, Level

16 A; Transfer Station, Level A; C & D, Level A;

17 Composting; Level A; and Separation, Level A.

18 Jeff Gilliland, Landfill, Level B,

19 Tangipahoa Parish Government.

20 John E. Lawrence, Transfer Station,

21 Level A, Whited's Wash Pit.

22 Clinton Paul McCullough, Transfer

23 Station, Level A, Whited's Wash Pit.

24 Thomas Paul McCullough, Transfer

25 Station, Level A, Whited's Wash Pit.

1 James A. Veuleman, Landfill, Level A;  
2 Surface Impoundment, Level A; Landfarm, Level A;  
3 Incinerator, Level A; Refuse-Derived Fuel, Level  
4 A; Transfer Station, Level A; C & D, Level A;  
5 Composting, Level A; and Separation, Level A.

6 Fred Williams, Landfill, Level A;  
7 Surface Impoundment, Level A; Landfarm, Level A;  
8 Incinerator, Level A; Refuse-Derived Fuel, Level  
9 A; Transfer Station, Level A; C & D, Level A;  
10 Composting, Level A; Separation, Level A, City of  
11 Shreveport, Woolworth Road Landfill.

12 John D. Wynn, Landfill, Level A; Surface  
13 Impoundment, Level A; Landfarm, Level A;  
14 Incinerator, Level A; Refuse-Derived Fuel, Level  
15 A; Transfer Station, Level A; C & D, Level A;  
16 Composting, Level A; Separation, Level A, Wynco  
17 Environmental Group, LLC.

18 We'll entertain a motion to approve  
19 recertification for these applicants.

20 MR. MOLLERE:

21 So moved.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 Moved by Mr. Mollere.

24 MR. STEWART:

25 Second.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Seconded by Mr. Stewart. Any other  
3 discussions? All in favor signify by saying  
4 "aye".

5 (MOTION CARRIES UNANIMOUSLY)

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Any opposed, nay? Motion carried.

8 We also have another application for  
9 recertification of Mr. David W. O'Mary for  
10 Landfill, Level A, IESI, LaSalle/Grant Landfill,  
11 pending approval of the CEUs requested. Is that  
12 on the agenda?

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 Yes.

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 If no one has any objection, let's take  
17 that up at this time. And this is CEUs from the  
18 SWANA conference.

19 MR. MOLLERE:

20 He did get that certification, didn't  
21 he?

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 Yes.

24 MR. MIZE:

25 Yes, but these hours at this conference

1 in Biloxi were not approved by the Board.

2 MR. MOLLERE:

3 I would move that he be recertified.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Well, let's approve the CEUs first.

6 MR. MOLLERE:

7 So moved.

8 MR. LAGRANGE:

9 Moved to approve the SWANA conference  
10 for ten hours for Mr. David O'Mary.

11 MR. LEWIS:

12 Second.

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Seconded by Mr. Lewis. Discussion?

15 MR. MIZE:

16 If we're going to approve these hours  
17 for Mr. O'Mary shouldn't we approve the hours for  
18 the whole conference?

19 MR. MOLLERE:

20 And that was one of the questions, I  
21 think, that we had, that they were supposed to  
22 come back and actually show us that agenda.

23 Because at the last meeting, as I recall, we could  
24 only come up with eight hours.

25 MS. BORDELON:



1 That was a different conference.

2 MR. MOLLERE:

3 That was a difference conference?

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Right. This one was in May, and the one  
6 we looked at at the last meeting was October.

7 MR. MIZE:

8 The agenda is in here.

9 MR. MOLLERE:

10 The one that we looked at the last time  
11 was the one in Natchitoches?

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 Right.

14 MR. MOLLERE:

15 And this one is the one in Biloxi?

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 Biloxi.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Any other discussion? We have a motion  
20 and a second to approve ten continuing education  
21 hours for Mr. David O'Mary.

22 MS. BORDELON:

23 He's asking for thirty.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Oh, thirty for this one. I'm sorry.

1 The motion was for thirty, Mr. Mollere?

2 MR. MOLLERE:

3 I guess I will amend it to make it  
4 thirty.

5 MR. LEWIS:

6 Second.

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Any other discussion?

9 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

10 Can we verify that there's actually  
11 thirty hours?

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 Well, the last sheet was signed by --

14 MR. LEWIS:

15 Dan Ball, with Waste Management.

16 MR. MOLLERE:

17 That's what I was wondering, if it has  
18 been certified by signature.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 What are you looking at?

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 The certificate report form, the CEU  
23 report form. It was signed that they approved him  
24 for thirty hours.

25 MR. MIZE:

1           It's a MOLO thing. It's not a regular  
2 certification.

3                           MR. LEWIS:

4           It was a three day course with a test at  
5 the end of it for manager of landfill.

6                           MR. SHARAFKHANI:

7           But are the CEUs equivalent to thirty  
8 hours, contact hours?

9                           MR. LAGRANGE:

10          Yes. I think a unit is an hour, isn't  
11 it?

12                           MR. MIZE:

13          That's a tough course, I know that.

14                           MR. SHARAFKHANI:

15          Well, I mean, three days, if you start  
16 at 8:30 and ending at 5:00, you know, that's not  
17 ten hours. And an hour and a half for lunch.

18                           MR. MIZE:

19          Can I ask Mr. Breaux a question?

20                           MR. LAGRANGE:

21          Sure...

22                           MR. MIZE:

23          Do y'all get thirty hours when y'all go  
24 to the MOLO training?

25                           MR. DON BREAU:

1           It's that time in three days. MOLO  
2 courses are eight hours for three days and a four  
3 hour test on your fourth day.

4           MR. SHARAFKHANI:

5           Oh, okay.

6           MR. DON BREAUX:

7           It's even more comprehensive than  
8 anything that we do in Louisiana.

9           MR. LAGRANGE:

10          Thank you. Mr. Bonvillain?

11          MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

12          I'd just like to make a comment. In the  
13 past, when I was at St. Landry, I had an  
14 individual that would go to the MOLO courses, and  
15 he was granted thirty hours for the MOLO courses  
16 in the past.

17          MR. SHARAFKHANI:

18          That makes sense with a four hour test.

19          MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

20          And one other comment is that if you're  
21 going to approve the CEU hours, if you approve the  
22 hours for Mr. O'Mary, whoever that is, then you  
23 approve the hours in general. Since he's got  
24 credit for it, then you approve those hours.

25          MR. DON BREAUX:

1 I'd like to make a comment. The MOLO  
2 class is given by SWANA. I'm on that faculty.  
3 And it's designed primarily for A type operators.  
4 It's a highly sophisticated course. It's strictly  
5 eight solid hours, and it's a closed book four  
6 hour test that if you don't make an 80 or above  
7 you've wasted your three days there. It's very --  
8 there are some states, Mississippi included, that  
9 requires their A operators to attend the MOLO  
10 course every three years. It's a very, very good  
11 course.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 Any other discussion? All in favor,  
14 signify by saying "aye".

15 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

18 Now we're going to entertain a motion to  
19 approve the recertification of David O'Mary.

20 MR. LEWIS:

21 I'll make the motion.

22 MR. MIZE:

23 Second.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Moved by Mr. Lewis. Seconded by Mr.

1 Mize. Any other discussion? All in favor,  
2 signify by saying "aye".

3 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

6 Next we'll have the issuance of operator  
7 certificates. Ms. Bordelon, would you --

8 MS. BORDELON:

9 Yes. We have Louis Bonton, III,  
10 Landfill, Level B. His application was approved  
11 at the last meeting. He didn't have a passing  
12 grade for the test. He did come back into the  
13 office and retest and he passed it.

14 Errin D. Carr, Landfill, Level B. Same  
15 goes for Darlene Perry. Her application was  
16 approved and she passed the test after the last  
17 meeting. Landfill, Level A. And Damian Wiltz,  
18 C. & D, Level B.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 I'll entertain a motion to issue those  
21 certificates.

22 MR. MIZE:

23 So moved.

24 MR. LYONS:

25 Second.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Moved by Mr. Mize. Seconded by Mr.  
3 Lyons. Any other discussion? All in favor  
4 signify by saying "aye".

5 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

6 MR. LAGRANGE:

7 Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

8 Next we have review request for  
9 conditional certification from Daria Ransom Jones.  
10 She's at Gator Environmental Waste Solutions in  
11 Sorento. This is a C & D, Level B.

12 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

13 Mr. Chairman, is this a conditional or a  
14 regular certification?

15 MS. BORDELON:

16 She's asking for a conditional.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Is it conditional out of need for the  
19 facility or --

20 MS. BORDELON:

21 Right. Right now they have two  
22 conditional Level B's and one regular Level A.

23 MR. LAGRANGE:

24 She gave a detailed description of her  
25 work.

1 MS. BORDELON:

2 And she has come in and passed the test  
3 as well. She also attended the training in  
4 Shreveport.

5 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

6 Mr. Chairman, my question is she just  
7 started working for the company, and she could  
8 qualify for Level C --

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 We don't offer Level C's to --

11 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

12 B. I'm sorry. -- B two years down the  
13 road. So the minimum, we have to issue  
14 conditional to her for two years, right?

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 Yes, until she obtains her experience.

17 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

18 Her experience.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Her years of experience. She would have  
21 to apply every six months.

22 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

23 Every six months.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 And she's passed the test, so that



1 requirement is met. Again, you know, we've got to  
2 discuss this usually when these conditionals come  
3 up. But based on her application we have to  
4 determine if she's qualified, and based on what  
5 she's showing us to have a Level B at that  
6 specific facility, and that's basically what we  
7 need to do. I don't recall that we have any  
8 maximum or minimum numbers of conditionals that we  
9 can or cannot issue for a facility as well. I  
10 think we have someone who has taken the  
11 initiative, even though she just came to work for  
12 that facility, to pass the exam and attend the  
13 training session already as well. Any other  
14 discussions?

15 MR. LEWIS:

16 I guess on a conditional, just like this  
17 one, she needs two years of experience to be  
18 qualified for a regular, and you give a  
19 conditional and you just keep recertifying that  
20 until she meets that time. I guess my question is  
21 is there any -- you know, is that ten hours a year  
22 going to one course? Or could you say if you have  
23 a conditional and you're that far away maybe you  
24 go to four trainings a year or something to speed  
25 that process up when they're in conditional.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Well, you can't speed up the two years.  
3 You've got to be in it for two years. Anyone  
4 else? Mr. Mollere, you have any thoughts on this?

5 MR. MOLLERE:

6 I'm just thinking about her having to  
7 come back to this Board on those conditionals that  
8 many times. I think it's going to be her --

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 Right, it'll be an obligation for her,  
11 and that'll ensure that she does attend her  
12 training hours as well.

13 MR. MOLLERE:

14 I don't think the conditional originally  
15 was intended to be quite like that, but that's  
16 what we have to deal with.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Do I have a motion?

19 MR. BERTHELOT:

20 So moved.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Moved by Mr. Berthelot. Do I have a  
23 second?

24 MR. LEWIS:

25 Second.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Seconded by Mr. Lewis. Any other  
3 discussion?

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Just as a side note, she did come into  
6 the office and test and had a perfect score on her  
7 test.

8 MR. LAGRANGE:

9 All in favor signify by saying "aye".  
10 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

13 Next we have a review request from Mr.  
14 Clay Naquin to extend his conditional  
15 certification. Suzanne, has he met the  
16 requirements he needs to meet to extend it?

17 MS. BORDELON:

18 He has.

19 MR. LAGRANGE:

20 Do I have a motion?

21 MR. MIZE:

22 So moved.

23 MR. LYONS:

24 Second.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1                   Moved by Mr. Mize. Seconded by Mr.  
2 Lyons. Any other discussion?

3                   MR. SHARAFKHANI:

4                   Mr. Chairman, does he have the  
5 experience to be certified as a regular Level A?  
6 I don't see anything under experience.

7                   MS. BORDELON:

8                   He's only been employed there since  
9 February of this year.

10                  MR. SHARAFKHANI:

11                  So he doesn't have previous experience?

12                  MS. BORDELON:

13                  He does not.

14                  MR. LAGRANGE:

15                  Any other discussions? All in favor  
16 signify by saying "aye".

17 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

18                  MR. LAGRANGE:

19                  Opposed, nay? Motion carried.

20                  We have a review for request for  
21 reciprocity from Thomas Trowell. I think this was  
22 with the -- he's certified in the State of  
23 Georgia. He shows a certificate from the  
24 University of Georgia, landfill operator  
25 certification training course conducted by the

1 Center of Continuing Education in association with  
2 SWANA and the state Environmental Protection  
3 Agency. He's certified under the Comprehensive  
4 Solid Waste Management Act to operate a municipal  
5 solid waste disposal facility in the State of  
6 Georgia issued in 2006 for five years. Have we  
7 issued certificates with Georgia before? Do y'all  
8 recall?

9 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

10 And that's the question, do we have  
11 comity with the State of Georgia? In other words,  
12 would they accept our certified operators?

13 MS. BORDELON:

14 I'm not sure.

15 MR. MOLLERE:

16 I don't recall us -- I know we've had  
17 Florida and Arkansas and Texas and Mississippi,  
18 but I don't recall us having any with Georgia to  
19 find out what their certifications -- there's no  
20 national certification standard.

21 MR. LEWIS:

22 On his certificate it's a landfill  
23 operator certification training course. But do  
24 they have different levels? Could that be a Level  
25 B compared to what we have or a Level C? He

1 didn't put down on his application what he was  
2 requesting, an A, B, or C, or C & D or whatever.

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 It just says to operate a municipal  
5 solid waste disposal facility in the State of  
6 Georgia. That seems pretty broad.

7 MS. BORDELON:

8 Did you discuss this with him? You  
9 didn't talk to him?

10 MR. MOLLERE:

11 No.

12 MR. LAGRANGE:

13 Looking at his application he's  
14 currently employed with Allied Republic Services,  
15 Allied waste services in Sulphur. But it seems  
16 like his activities right now are managing the  
17 hauling portion of the operation over there.

18 MR. MIZE:

19 He didn't call me. I didn't even know  
20 he sent this in, so y'all do whatever y'all want.  
21 I'm going to go off to the side on this one.

22 MR. LAGRANGE:

23 well, let's do a little research. Mr.  
24 Mize, could you maybe get some information from  
25 him and/or Georgia's Environmental Protection

1 division.

2 MR. MIZE:

3 Yeah.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:

5 well, you get some information on him.

6 And Suzanne, could you contact the division and

7 maybe --

8 MS. BORDELON:

9 Yes. And actually what I should have  
10 done -- I should have done that, too, before. But  
11 it's up to him to submit the documentation from  
12 the State of Georgia showing that his  
13 certification is comparable to Louisiana.

14 MR. MIZE:

15 And he didn't tell me, and I don't know.  
16 I know, according to what he's got here, when I  
17 read it, you know, it looks like he had a C & D  
18 site for a little while or whatever. But I know  
19 he's not -- I don't know. He may just want to try  
20 to retain it because I know he doesn't have  
21 anything to do with landfills at the moment. He  
22 probably just wants to keep it retained, keep it  
23 going.

24 MS. BORDELON:

25 The only thing this shows is that his

1 certificate is a five year certificate.

2 MR. STEWART:

3 You need a motion to put it on hold  
4 until the next meeting?

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 I don't think we need a motion. Let's  
7 just get some information and put it back on the  
8 agenda for the next meeting.

9 Next we'll move on to committee reports.  
10 First is the awards committee, Mr. Mize.

11 MR. MIZE:

12 We send out awards at the end of this  
13 month, in December.

14 MR. LAGRANGE:

15 We'll be sending out --

16 MS. BORDELON:

17 Nominations. I'll be sending nomination  
18 forms out hopefully by the end of this month for  
19 the Bentley Mackay and for the landfill Level A  
20 and Level B Operator of the Year.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Testing, Mr. Mollere.

23 MR. MOLLERE:

24 Mr. Chairman, to my knowledge we're in  
25 good shape right now. We may want to look maybe



1 next year at reviewing one or two of the district  
2 levels, but I think other than that we're in good  
3 shape.

4 MR. LAGRANGE:  
5 Continuing education, Mr. Berthelot.

6 MR. BERTHELOT:  
7 Ms. Righteous informed us this morning  
8 of our conference due in March at the Cajundome.

9 MR. LAGRANGE:  
10 Nominating committee, Mr. Lewis.

11 MR. LEWIS:  
12 We'll just have to do a review and see  
13 who all is coming off this year and start putting  
14 together some names and getting some people lined  
15 up and ready.

16 MS. BORDELON:  
17 We shouldn't have anybody going off  
18 until at least October of next year.

19 MR. LEWIS:  
20 So we're in good shape, Mr. Chairman.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:  
22 Thank you for that report. Other  
23 business, we took care of those two items.

24 MS. BORDELON:  
25 No. The second one.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 I'm sorry. The second one, the review  
3 of the conference agenda for the Mississippi  
4 Chapter of SWANA. That was carried over from the  
5 last meeting.

6 MR. BERTHELOT:

7 The October conference.

8 MR. MOLLERE:

9 The Natchez meeting.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 Right, located in Natchez.

12 MS. BORDELON:

13 I did go back and print out the email  
14 that I had received from Mr. Billy Warden. He  
15 says that the national SWANA has approved this  
16 conference for ten CEUs, and that is what they're  
17 requesting from this Board.

18 MR. LAGRANGE:

19 Well, I'm looking on here, after Mr.  
20 Breaux made a comment about the MOLO test, it was  
21 from 8:00 to 12:00, the first day, it says MOLO  
22 certification retest. So everyone that attended  
23 this -- or this is just for whoever needed to  
24 retest every three years? Is that what you think  
25 that was?

1 MR. DON BREAUX:

2 Yes.

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 So he may or may have not taken that  
5 test. Does anyone know?

6 MR. MIZE:

7 I'm sure everybody didn't take that  
8 test, I'm sure. I'm sure everybody at the  
9 conference didn't take the test. I don't know.  
10 They didn't say, but I wouldn't think they would  
11 have.

12 MR. DON BREAUX:

13 The MOLO retest is probably for the  
14 people that didn't pass the test. Because once  
15 you get your MOLO certification you don't have to  
16 retake the test. You just keep your hours up.

17 MR. MIZE:

18 But they did tell me, whenever they send  
19 the agreements and stuff, they do go to SWANA and  
20 SWANA sends it back, like she's got on the email,  
21 and SWANA approves how many hours they get for  
22 that credit. The state don't issue it. SWANA  
23 actually issues the hours for the --

24 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

25 Ms. Bordelon, do we have a letter from

1 SWANA saying that they are approving it for ten  
2 hours?

3 MS. BORDELON:

4 No, I do not have anything from SWANA.

5 MR. LAGRANGE:

6 You had spoken to someone about that,  
7 Mr. Mize?

8 MR. MIZE:

9 Yes.

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 So we have an agenda, and we know that  
12 SWANA has approved it for ten hours of continuing  
13 education. So what's your pleasure?

14 MR. MIZE:

15 So moved.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Moved to approve for ten hours by Mr.  
18 Mize. Do I have a second?

19 MR. BERTHELOT:

20 I'll second it.

21 MR. LAGRANGE:

22 Seconded by Mr. Berthelot. Any other  
23 discussion? Hearing none, all in favor signify by  
24 saying "aye".

25 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

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MR. LAGRANGE:

Any opposed, nay? Motion carried.

Next we'll move to public comments. Ms. Suzanne received a letter from Ms. Ann Wilson thanking the Board for approving the ten hours for the 2011 Environmental Regulatory Conference. And she was requesting that the Board appoint a representative to serve on the planning committee for the 2012 conference. They will begin meeting in February, and she anticipates there will be three to four meetings between February and May of 2011. The meetings are held in Baton Rouge. They usually start at 1:30 and last about two hours.

I don't think it's our duty or that we should appoint someone to serve on the committee, but it's open for discussion. I would throw this out there and let you know that, and if any of you want to volunteer to work with that group on their conference I would suggest maybe you contact Ms. Wilson and be lined up to do that. Do y'all have any other discussion on that?

MR. SHARAFKHANI:

I concur with what you're saying. It's not our job to participate in the meeting and tell them what courses they have to provide in order to

1 qualify for a continuing education course. But I  
2 agree with you.

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 So if anyone's interested, I'll give you  
5 a copy of the letter and you can contact Ms.  
6 Wilson about serving on that committee.

7 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

8 But do we really want to do that, Mr.  
9 Chairman? I mean, if --

10 MR. LAGRANGE:

11 No. If someone wants to volunteer. Not  
12 as a member of the Board of Certification, but  
13 volunteer to serve on the committee.

14 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

15 Okay.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 I'm just making you aware of it.

18 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

19 Okay.

20 MR. LAGRANGE:

21 Any other public comments?

22 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

23 Yes.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Mr. Sharafkhani.

1 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

2 Can we go back to the item with Thomas  
3 Trowell? Can we also give him an option? You  
4 know, instead of providing documentation from the  
5 State of Georgia we could give an option. It  
6 appears that he does have the experience. Give  
7 him an option to take the test, the Louisiana  
8 test. Is that something doable?

9 MR. LAGRANGE:

10 In lieu of reciprocity?

11 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

12 Yes.

13 MR. LAGRANGE:

14 Well, we would need to review his  
15 application and approve it.

16 Mr. Mize, do you think that would be an  
17 option that he would be willing to do? Or would  
18 he rather pursue reciprocity first and see --

19 MR. MIZE:

20 Well, he's going to do whatever we ask  
21 him to do. I mean --

22 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

23 All I'm saying is give him an option.  
24 I'm giving you options.

25 MR. LAGRANGE:

1           I know, but he applied for reciprocity,  
2 and we're saying we need more information. So he  
3 may get approved for reciprocity. But as an  
4 alternative we could review his application and  
5 approve it, if he meets the qualifications. And  
6 then he would have that option to schedule to take  
7 the exam and just get his regular certificate.

8                   MR. MIZE:

9           And really, like I said, I haven't  
10 talked to him. And I know he's got -- they issued  
11 that thing for five years. But I also don't think  
12 he's been going back over there going to training  
13 again neither, though.

14                   MR. SHARAFKHANI:

15           And maybe he has to attend the next  
16 training in Lafayette. Attend the training, take  
17 the exam, and --

18                   MR. LAGRANGE:

19           Well, no. If we approve his application  
20 as meeting the qualifications, then the next step  
21 to get a regular certificate would be to take the  
22 exam and pass it. And then we would issue a  
23 regular certificate to him. So it would be a  
24 certificate by reciprocity.

25                   MR. SHARAFKHANI:



1                   So we could do that in the next session,  
2 right?

3                   MR. LAGRANGE:

4                   Yes, if he takes the exam between now  
5 and the next meeting.

6                   MR. SHARAFKHANI:

7                   Or he could take it the --

8                   MS. BORDELON:

9                   Yes, he could take it in Lafayette. But  
10 I would suggest looking at his application now and  
11 either approving or not approving his application  
12 now. That way he knows the application has  
13 already been approved, and either he can just come  
14 and test, or supply us with all the information  
15 from Georgia.

16                   MR. MOLLERE:

17                   Mr. Chairman, I'm just thinking outside  
18 the box on this, but would it be to our benefit to  
19 correspond with all of our immediate neighboring  
20 states, send them a copy of our standards, and  
21 request that they recognize our certification, and  
22 request that they send us their standards? And  
23 that way we can actually have a formal letter on  
24 file of reciprocity.

25                   MR. LAGRANGE:

1           That's a very good suggestion. Ms.  
2 Bordelon and I will get together and maybe do  
3 that, submit something.

4                           MR. MOLLERE:

5           One other thing. I just want to thank  
6 you for hosting us, for the meal that we're about  
7 to receive, and for allowing us to come to this  
8 part of the world and see what it's all about.

9                           MR. LAGRANGE:

10           It's my pleasure to have you all down  
11 here, and I appreciate y'all coming, and hope you  
12 come back again and visit with us.

13           Mr. Williams?

14                           MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

15           Mr. Chairman, I submitted an application  
16 for a lifetime certification. I don't know if  
17 it's on the agenda or not.

18                           MS. BORDELON:

19           It's there. We've done that.

20                           MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

21           Oh, okay. I didn't hear that.

22                           MR. LAGRANGE:

23           Congratulations, Mr. Williams.

24                           MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

25           Thank you.

1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 You and Gary. Gary, too. But when I  
3 read them it didn't say -- it said  
4 recertification.

5 MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

6 That was recertification.

7 MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

8 I'm talking about lifetime.

9 MS. BORDELON:

10 Well, it's the same. I mean, you still  
11 have to come back every four years and recertify.

12 MR. MOLLERE:

13 It's right here, Mr. Bonvillain, Mr.  
14 Veuleman, Mr. Williams, and Wynn.

15 MR. LAGRANGE:

16 Getting back to Mr. Sharafkhani's  
17 comments on Mr. Trowell, did we want to review  
18 this application and take any actions relative to  
19 considering his qualifications for a regular  
20 certificate?

21 MR. SHARAFKHANI:

22 We might want to wait until after the  
23 discussion we're going to have with him.

24 MR. LAGRANGE:

25 Okay.

1 MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

2 Mr. Chairman, let me get something clear  
3 in my mind, please. I heard the recertification,  
4 but as I appreciate it the lifetime certification  
5 exempts me from having to pay the fees.

6 MS. BORDELON:

7 Correct.

8 MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

9 Do I have that? Have I obtained that  
10 status, the lifetime certification?

11 MS. BORDELON:

12 Well, it was -- let me go back and read  
13 what the motion was. It was for --

14 MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

15 I thought that was for recertification.  
16 That's why I'm asking.

17 MR. MOLLERE:

18 It exempts the fee, the motion does. I  
19 think the only thing that we had in there was that  
20 it had to be requested in writing for a lifetime  
21 certification, and that they had to maintain the  
22 hours. I think that's what the minutes stated.

23 MS. BORDELON:

24 It's that any board member who has  
25 served two terms --

1 MR. MOLLERE:

2 A minimum of two terms.

3 MR. LAGRANGE:

4 At least two terms. It says, "at least  
5 two terms may request in writing a life  
6 certification in all categories and classes, and  
7 that an exemption from all fees, provided that the  
8 individual maintain the minimum required hours of  
9 certification, training, and an association with  
10 and in the solid waste management profession".  
11 That was the motion that was approved. So based  
12 on your application for recertification today,  
13 that granted your lifetime certification, provided  
14 you follow these requirements.

15 MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

16 Point of clarification, I don't think  
17 your motion did that. Your motion granted him the  
18 recertification, but it didn't grant him the  
19 lifetime waiver. I think you have to actually  
20 accept a motion on that part of it.

21 MS. BORDELON:

22 Well, at the last meeting the motion  
23 was --

24 MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

25 No. The last meeting was when y'all

1 came up with this. He had submitted his written  
2 request for the lifetime certification, lifetime  
3 exemption.

4 MS. BORDELON:

5 Right.

6 MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

7 I don't think y'all had actually acted  
8 on the lifetime exemption. All you acted on today  
9 was the recertification.

10 MR. MOLLERE:

11 I think that's technically correct.

12 MR. GARY BONVILLAIN:

13 So just for his protection I think you  
14 actually need a motion --

15 MR. MOLLERE:

16 Mr. Chairman, if I might go off the  
17 agenda and come back to that, I would move, since  
18 Mr. Bonvillain has already been granted lifetime  
19 certification, that Mr. Veuleman, Mr. Williams,  
20 and Mr. Wynn join that exclusive club that Mr.  
21 Bonvillain and I belong to, and that they be  
22 granted lifetime certification according to the  
23 minutes as they were reflected in the last  
24 meeting, with the stipulation and understanding  
25 that they come back every four years and certify

1 that they do have the hours.

2 MR. LAGRANGE:

3 All right. I have a motion. Do I have  
4 a second?

5 MR. LYONS:

6 Second.

7 MR. LAGRANGE:

8 Seconded by Mr. Lyons. Any other  
9 discussion? All in favor signify by saying "aye".  
10 (MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY)

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 Any opposed, nay? Motion carried.

13 MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

14 I'd like to get a copy of those minutes,  
15 please.

16 MR. LAGRANGE:

17 Anything else? Mr. Breaux?

18 MR. DON BREAU:

19 This year I attended the National Board  
20 with SWANA. This gave me an opportunity to be  
21 involved with a representative from about every  
22 state in the country with SWANA. And I guess I'm  
23 putting a plug for this reciprocity thing. They  
24 come to me and they tell me that Louisiana  
25 employees go to them and they're requesting that

1 they contact Louisiana and -- I guess what I'm  
2 trying to say is the reciprocity thing is going to  
3 be an issue continuously. And if you're prepared  
4 for it, fine. But you'll be getting a lot more  
5 people calling and asking. Not every state  
6 requires certification. But those that do will be  
7 contacting you. I personally was contacted by  
8 someone from Florida, from Georgia, and  
9 Mississippi saying, "what are your rules? what  
10 are your regulations? what do I have to do?" I  
11 tell them, "well, I'm not on that committee". But  
12 I wanted to pass on to you that people thought I  
13 was, and the idea of this certification is going  
14 to be an issue that this Board will have to deal  
15 with a lot, because people are on the move. And  
16 so will you have people coming in from Mississippi  
17 or Georgia asking you to honor their  
18 certifications. So just be aware that reciprocity  
19 is going to be an issue with this committee quite  
20 a bit now, because it was talked about a lot. And  
21 I personally was cornered and asked, "what do I  
22 have to do", or "I've got people that want it".  
23 So I thought I'd pass it on, my experience that I  
24 had over there, that this whole issue is going to  
25 be coming up a lot.



1 MR. LAGRANGE:

2 Thank you, Mr. Breaux, for those  
3 comments. And hopefully we'll be able to be  
4 proactive and be able to deal with them as they  
5 come up and have some policies in place that will  
6 make it a smooth transition.

7 Any other public comments? Mr.  
8 Williams, anything else?

9 MR. FRED WILLIAMS:

10 I'd like to get a copy of the minutes.

11 MR. LAGRANGE:

12 Mr. Berthelot?

13 MR. BERTHELOT:

14 Move to adjourn.

15 MR. MOLLERE:

16 Second.

17 MR. LAGRANGE:

18 Moved by Mr. Berthelot, and seconded by  
19 Mr. Mollere. This meeting is adjourned.

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
