#### Office of the Governor Crime Victims Reparations Board

Compensation to Victims (LAC 22:XIII. 301)

In accordance with the provisions of R.S. 49:950 et seq., which is the Administrative Procedure Act, and R.S. 46:1801 et seq., which is the Crime Victims Reparations Act, the Crime Victims Reparations Board hereby gives notice of its intent to promulgate rules and regulations regarding the awarding of compensation to applicants. There will be no impact on family earnings or the family budget as set forth in R.S. 49:972.

# Title 22 CORRECTIONS, CRIMINAL JUSTICE AND LAW ENFORCEMENT Part XIII. Crime Victims Reparations Board

#### Chapter 1. Authority and Definitions

#### § 103. Definitions

<u>Heathcare facility</u> --means a facility or institution providing healthcare services, including but not limited to a hospital or other licensed inpatient center; ambulatory surgical or treatment center; skilled nursing facility; inpatient hospice facility; residential treatment center; diagnostic, laboratory, or imaging center; or rehabilitation or other therapeutic health setting.

Healthcare provider -- means a physician or other healthcare practitioner licensed, certified, registered, or otherwise authorized to perform specified healthcare services consistent with state law.

#### Chapter 3 Eligibility and Application Process

#### § 301. Eligibility

#### A. - 2.b. Insurance

i. The victim/claimant must process any potential insurance before applying for reimbursement of mental health claims, except for victims of sexually oriented oriminal offenses.

ii. For claims that pertain to victims of sexually oriented criminal offenses, the victim has the discretion to choose whether or not to file for private insurance or Medicaid coverage.

#### A. Claimant Responsibility

A.b. (Repealed) b. Victims of sexual assault may assign their right to collect medical expenses associated with the sexual assault to a hospital/health care facility. The hospital/health care facility may then apply for reparations.

5. All invoices, bills, etc. must indicate the victim/claimant as the guarantor <u>and indicate</u> balances owed. Except for victims of a sexually-oriented criminal offense. Victims of a sexually-oriented criminal offense cannot be billed for costs associated with a forensic medical exam. For claims that pertain to victims of sexually oriented criminal offenses, the victim has the discretion to choose whether or not to file for private insurance or Medicaid coverage.

The session notes submitted to the board for review must be signed by the supervising mental health provider.

- Q. Relocation. <u>Payment for relocation expenses</u> is for <u>those</u> claimants who <u>must have to</u> relocate <u>from their residence</u> as a result of the crime <u>committed at that location or immediate vicinity</u> for reasons of <u>imminent danger</u>, personal safety, <u>or threat of injury</u>.
  - 1. "Threat of injury" is:
  - a. Where a victim/claimant is directly threatened and there is a reasonable probability that physical and/or emotional injury would result if the threat were carried out, and/or
  - b. A victim was within sight and range of proximity of a person brandishing a weapon or other dangerous instrument and who felt reasonably threatened for their own safety.
  - 2. <u>Reimbursement for relocation expenses is limited up to \$3,000</u> per household of the claimant.
  - 3. A police/incident report must be submitted with the application to verify the basis for relocation.
  - 4. The application for relocation must occur within 90 days of incident, violation of a protective order or the offender's release from confinement.

#### **Family Impact Statement**

In compliance with Act 1183 of the 1999 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature, the impact of this proposed rule has been considered. This proposed rule will have no impact on family functioning, stability, or autonomy as described in R.S. 49:972 since it only clarifies the procedures for applying for reparations.
